

In accordance with Section 2279 and 2272 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to present the 2000 Crop and Livestock Report of Agricultural Production and Report of Sustainable Agriculture in Amador County.

The total gross valuation for all agricultural commodities produced in 2000 was \$32,673,726. This represents an increase of 14.03 percent from the 1999 gross production values.

Significant commodity group changes when compared to 1999 values were: Fruit and Nut Crops increased by 10.28 percent, Livestock increased by 24.90 percent, Timber increased by 15.37 percent.

The value of the 2000 Wine Grape Production increased by 11.14 percent and is Amador County's leading commodity.

These production values only partially reflect the overall measure of the economic impact agriculture has on the local economy. Processing, transporting, marketing and other farm-related services significantly multiply the value agriculture has to Amador County.

It must be emphasized that this report deals with gross value of production only and does not attempt to reflect net farm income.

I would like to thank all the individuals, producers, processors, government agencies and others whose cooperation and assistance contributed in preparing this report. My sincerest thanks and appreciation must also be extended to Carolyn Scalabrino and Barry Clark as well as all department staff for their efforts in compiling and finalizing this report.






Ten Year Comparison

In accordance with Section 2279 and 2272 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to present the 2004 Crop and Livestock Report of Agricultural Production and Report of Sustainable Agriculture in Amador County.

The total gross valuation for all agricultural commodities produced in 2004 was \$32,840,674. This represents an increase of 13.66% from the 2003 gross production values. The increase was due to higher prices for grapes and cattle. It should also be pointed out that there was a 68% drop in timber production in Amador County in 2004.

These production values only partially reflect the overall measure of the economic impact agriculture has on the local economy. Processing, transporting, marketing and other farm-related services significantly multiply the value agriculture has to Amador County.

It must be emphasized that this report deals with gross value of production only and does not attempt to reflect net farm income.

I would like to thank all the individuals, producers, processors, government agencies and others whose cooperation and assistance contributed in preparing this report. My sincerest thanks and appreciation must also be extended to Barry Clark, as well as all the department staff for their efforts in compiling and finalizing this report.




