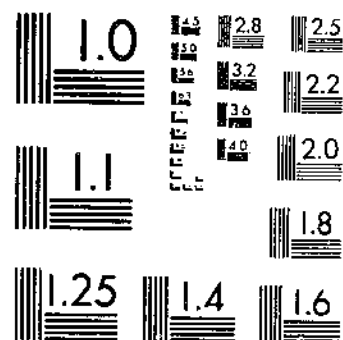
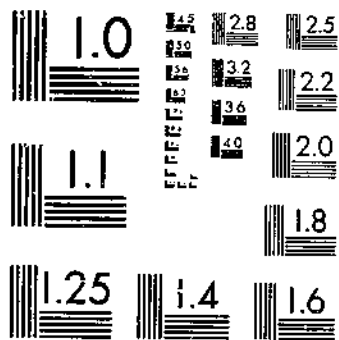

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INTRODUCTION

This, the sixth biennial bulletin on cold-storage warehouse space, and stocks of fruits, dairy products, eggs, dressed poultry, meats, lard, and fish, follows the form of Statistical Bulletin No. 33.

There are few changes in the tables except that they are brought up to date to December 1, 1931, and fish tables to December 15, 1931, and the tables showing refrigerated warehouse capacity are from the survey of October 1, 1931.

One additional table has been inserted which shows the comparison of cold-storage warehouse capacity from 1921 to 1931. The increase in refrigerated space in that period has been 197,270,350 cubic feet, or 36 per cent. The increase since the previous survey of October 1, 1929, has been 12,248,409 cubic feet, or nearly 1¼ per cent. The figures in this table include the plants of all concerns reporting cold-storage holdings to the Bureau of Agricultural Economics: Public commercial warehouses, private warehouses, and meat-packing establishments. Of the 12,248,409 cubic feet increase in space since 1929, 8,892,379 cubic feet, or 72½ per cent, has been in the public warehouse field.

The method of compiling and releasing the monthly cold-storage report remains the same as during the last several years. Two additions have been made to the commodities reported on. Beginning

with June, 1930, figures on stocks of frozen cream held in storage were compiled and in July, 1932, ducks were shown as a separate item in the frozen-poultry classification. These additions have been made at the request of members of the poultry industry and with the cooperation of the cold-storage warehousemen. Tables for these two commodities do not appear in this bulletin.

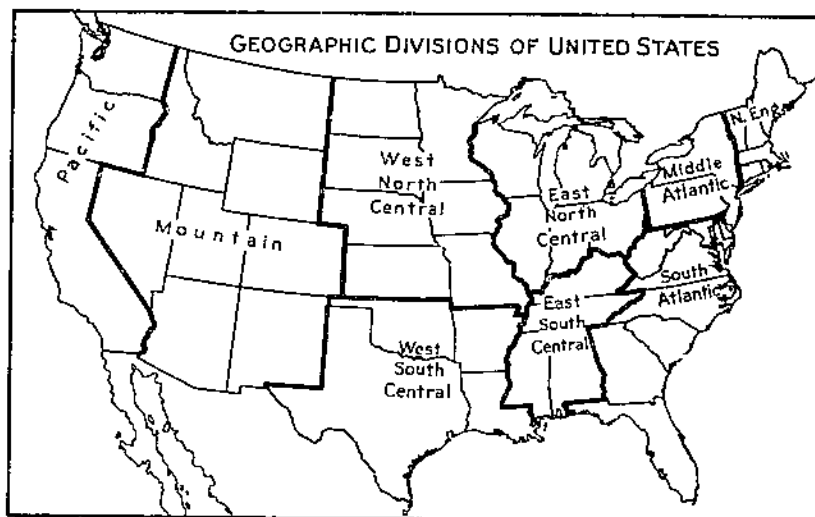


FIGURE 1.—The census geographic divisions as used in Table 1

The map (fig. 1) shows the grouping of States into geographic divisions. Table 1 shows the percentage holdings of the various commodities by geographic divisions, and is based on the year 1931.
