

Dear Director and Board Members:

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1982 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1982 is 23,723,300, a decrease of \$10,708,200 from the gross income reported in 1981. The primary reason for this decrease is that the timber industry, due to a lagging economy, is suffering a severe depression.

The County's grape and fruit industries are expanding with the exception of pears. The County's grape industry at present has over 600 acres planted to grapes with eight wineries now functioning within the County. Some of the wineries have wine tasting facilities, with more wineries anticipating the operation of these facilities for fiscal year 1983-84. The wineries with the tasting rooms are complementary to the County's booming ranch marketing program and are blending extremely well with the recreational and agricultural industries in the County. Ranch marketing activities within the County are expanding beyond the traditional Apple Hill marketing area. Enough agricultural activity is now occuring on the western slope of El Dorado County to cause the Agricultural Council of the County Chamber of Commerce to consider a ranch marketing and recreational promotional program for this growing industry.



Dear Director and Board Members:

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1983 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1983 is \$27,765,800. An increase of \$4,038,000 can be primarily attributed to timber and timber by-products, Christmas trees, and miscellaneous agricultural products. The County pear industry's gross income was severely reduced by a poor crop and poor prices.

The County's grape and fruit industries are continuing to expand; however. at a slower pace than in 1982. There are nine wineries now functioning within El Dorado County, most of which have wine tasting facilities at their winery sites. El Dorado County wines are gaining worldwide recognition due to their exceptionally fine varietal wine qualities. Ranch marketing activities within the County are expanding beyond the traditional Apple Hill marketing area with particular emphasis in the Somerset area. The Agricultural Council of the Chamber of Commerce is developing a ranch marketing and recreational promotional program for these growing industries.



Dear Director and Board Members:

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1984 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1984 is \$28,121,500 -- an increase of \$225,000. The increase is primarily attributed to the livestock and poultry industries. The County's apple industry was severely affected by weather and reflected a million dollar plus reduction in gross income. Growers are continuing to remove pear orchards and replacing them with other agricultural crops.

The County's wine, grape and fruit industries continue to expand. The countywide ranch marketing program achieved moderate success during 1984. Interest for this program is increasing throughout the western slope of the County. The Somerset and Georgetown areas are becoming more aggressive in developing ranch marketing programs similar to that in Apple Hill. The Agricultural Council of the El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce is continuing to serve as the focal point for a countywide marketing program. It is anticipated that by the end of 1985 this program will have developed sufficient strength to proceed with its own Board of Directors.



In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1985 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1985 is \$33,774,300 -- an increase of over\$5,500,000. The increase is primarily attributed to the fruit and nut crop industries. The County's apple industry produced a record crop of over 16,000 tons. The pear industry income was also boosted with a price of \$216.00 per ton for cannery fruit. The County's fruit and nut crops are continuing to change with reductions in pear acreage and an increase in other fruit acreage.

The County's roadside marketing program is continuing to expand throughout the County. The ranch marketing program sponsored by the Agricultural Council, El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce continued to be successful during the 1985 season. Interest in this program is increasing throughout the western slope of the County -- groups have developed in the Georgetown and Gold Hill areas.

The monetary values recorded in this report are F.O.B. the plant and do not reflect net returns or profits realized by the grower.

Dear Director and Board Members:

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1987 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1987 is \$35,318,300 -- a decrease of approximately \$1,000,000. The decrease is a result of lower gross income for cattlemen and a reduced timber harvest on both private and government timberlands. The fruit industry reflected a \$1,000,000 increase primarily because of a large apple crop and expanding dry varietal wine grapes and cherry industries. The pear industry continues to decrease in acreage and production. 1987 was the first year that some plum and pear growers experienced RED INK. 'Red ink' is a term used when a grower's crop is packed and shipped and returns less money than the costs incurred in the packing and shipping of that product. In other words, the grower receives a bill for his crop instead of a check.

The County's roadside marketing program continues to expand throughout the County. A few roadside marketing operations are now opening in June with cherries and closing in March with stored apples. The wine industry in El Dorado County now boasts of 14 wineries, most of which are open weekends throughout the year. El Dorado County's ranch marketing program, coupled with the recreational industry, is continuing to expand its contribution to the County's economic base. Interest in the ranch marketing program continues to increase throughout the western slope of the County.

The monetary values recorded in this report are F.O.B. the plant and do not reflect net returns or profits realized by the grower.

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the 1989 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The gross agricultural value for 1989 is \$44,764,100, an increase of approximately \$7,500,000. The increase is credited to the fruit and nut industry and timber sales. The fruit and nut industry increase is attributed to a large 1989 crop and new agricultural crops.

The County's roadside marketing program is continuing to expand. Of particular interest, is that a county-wide marketing organization is being formed patterned after Apple Hill. It is the goal of this organization to promote ranch marketing county-wide with distinctive routes to better identify this growing industry.

The County's wine industry continues to grow in production and the wines producted from this industry are being recognized as premium dry wines by the wine trade.

The monetary values records in this report are F.O.B. the plant and do not reflect net returns or profits realized by the grower.
