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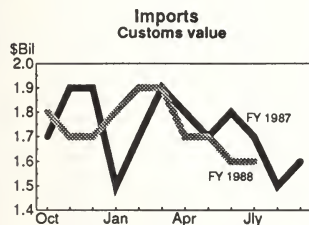
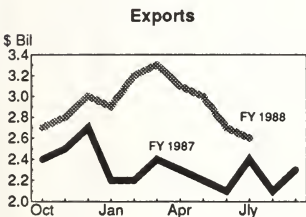
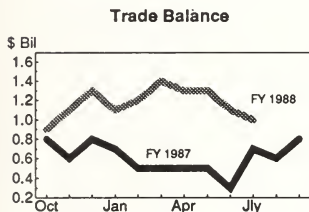

Exports and Imports Both Decline in July



Trade Surplus Steady - The U.S. agricultural trade surplus remained above \$1 billion for the ninth consecutive month in July, virtually unchanged from June. Both exports and imports fell marginally in July, by \$53 million and \$17 million, respectively. According to Census Bureau data released last week, July's surplus exceeded July 1987's \$685 million by about 50 percent. Cumulatively, FY 1988's surplus is nearly twice the value of the same 10 months of FY 1987, \$11.6 billion compared with less than \$5.9 billion (table 5).

Exports - Agricultural exports fell only 2 percent from June, remaining above \$2.6 billion. Summer movement remained seasonally slow as the end of the 1987/88 marketing year drew closer for several major commodities. Cotton and vegetable oil exports fell the most, by \$78 million and \$45 million from month-earlier levels. Fruit, vegetable, hide, and vegetable oil exports fell by smaller amounts, while higher prices boosted export values for soybeans, wheat, and corn.

Corn exports rose \$28 million during July, reaching \$367 million as higher prices offset lower tonnages. Prompt shipment of the USSR's July corn purchases failed to offset smaller shipments to Japan. Shipments to Korea also rose, while those to Mexico and the EC were little changed from June. Export prices jumped 15 percent in lagged response to early-summer drought-induced crop woes.

Soybean exports rose as both tonnage and prices climbed. Shipments to the EC and Japan rose slightly, offsetting declines to smaller customers. Export prices rose 13 percent during July, following June's 19 percent gain.

Wheat export value rose \$15 million to \$380 million in July, despite a 300,000 ton decline in shipments. This was the third consecutive month tonnage declined, and the first time in more than a decade for reduced wheat exports during the first 2 months of the marketing year. Smaller shipments under the EEP accounted for the decline. EEP exports to the USSR fell substantially, but rose to China and Mexico. Non-EEP shipments grew, combining with higher U.S. prices to further boost the average price of U.S. wheat exports.

Cotton exports which normally decline at the end of the marketing year, fell nearly one-third, to \$109 million. Shipments dropped to the USSR, Egypt, and the EC. Sales to most other customers were also lower, but shipments to Japan, the largest U.S. cotton customer, fell only 13 percent from June's 23,000 tons. (Steve MacDonald, 202-786-1822)

Imports - U.S. agricultural imports fell for the fourth consecutive month in July. Imports of most products fell, offsetting rebounding coffee imports. June 1988 coffee imports had been the lowest in a decade following strong shipments during early FY 1988. Meat imports remained at seasonal highs but horticultural imports dropped seasonally. Large Export Gains Forecast - FY 1988 export value is now expected to reach \$34 billion, compared with \$28 billion in FY 1987. Export volume is expected to climb 17 million tons, to 146 million. These gains largely reflect reduced competitor supplies; higher prices for grains, oilseeds, and cotton; and increased U.S. export competitiveness. FY 1989's outlook is for lower volume and higher value due to higher prices. (Steve MacDonald)
