

Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1982 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross dollar value of all agri-crops for 1982 was \$43,291,000, up 10 million dollars over 1981.

Field crop production, including the perennial leader alfalfa, was up 5 million dollars over 1981, with nursery crops up again almost 2 million dollars over last year as harvested acreage of strawberry plants increased 25% to 400 acres.

Livestock and poultry production remained approximately the same at 10 million dollars, but as expected, timber and timber products increased almost 3 million dollars.

I wish to thank Robert Somerville who compiled this report and all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible.

As in the past, this report indicates gross value only and does not represent net income to the growers.



Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1983 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross dollar value for all agricultural crops for 1983 was \$50,056,000, up 7 million dollars over 1982 and 17 million dollars over 1981.

Field crops, including alfalfa, were down from the previous year and total sales of all livestock was down over 1 million dollars from 1982. However, nursery production continues to expand as new acres of strawberries become an economic factor in the Honey Lake Valley with 435 acres harvested for a gross value of over \$6,400,000.

Timber and timber products surged ahead with almost 16 million dollars in reported sales, up almost 8 million dollars over 1982.

This report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to growers.

I wish to thank all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible with a special thanks to the members of this office who diligently compiled, documented and typed this 1983 Crop Report.



Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1984 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross dollar value for all agricultural crops, including timber, was \$52,462,000 for 1984, up slightly over 2 million dollars from 1983.

Field crops, including the perennial leader alfalfa, were down from 1983 due primarily to lower unit values for hay. Strawberry acreage increased again this year to 625 harvested acres with production values of \$9.8 million, surpassing 1983 by almost \$3.5 million.

This report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to growers.
