1 Introduction

This IATRC Working Paper provides a list of the publications of the late Timothy E. Josling to serve as a source of reference for the work of this eminent agricultural economist. It also provides an analysis of Josling's publications in terms of subject matter area, outlets and other characteristics. It is a supplement to the book on "Current Issues in Global Agricultural and Trade Policy" comprising essays written in honour of Josling by a number of his long-time friends and colleagues. We are grateful to the IATRC, an institution which played an important role in Tim's professional life and in which he also played an important role, for providing a platform for making this analysis of Tim's writings publicly available.

After we had decided to edit a book as a tribute to Josling we naturally needed access to a complete list of his publications. It turned out that this was unavailable. Consequently, we began to work on the creation of such a list. How we did that is outlined in section 2 of this paper. Once we had compiled the list, our first aim was to allocate the publications to individual thematic areas (section 3). Given the fact that Tim worked closely for and with a number of institutions that are active in advising on and shaping agricultural and trade policies, it is of interest to identify those publications associated with these institutions (Section 4). We summarize the types of outlets for the publications (books, journal articles etc.) in section 5. Finally, to determine which of Tim's publications have attracted most attention in the academic literature we examine some citation statistics (section 6).

2 Sources

To obtain a comprehensive list of Tim's publications we approached his widow, Anthea Josling. Anthea was kind enough to conduct a search, with the assistance of her two children John Mark and Catherine, on the computer Tim had used for his work. It turned out that the only traceable list, dated September 2015, covered only Tim's publications from 1966 to 2015 and was incomplete. We thus consulted additional sources, including our own private libraries and lists of literature, WorldCat, AgEconSearch, catalogues of major libraries, Google Scholar and the like. While working on the book we were also made aware of a few additional publications by colleagues. In compiling the list we chose not to include some unpublished papers on the grounds that many of these are not generally accessible. In addition, in many cases, such papers were precursors to subsequently published work.

The resulting list is presented in section 7 of this paper. It contains an impressive number of 321 publications. Although we sought to be comprehensive, it is possible that some of Tim's accessible writings have escaped our attention.




Figure 1: Josling's publications by year

The list presents the publications by year in chronological order, though in the absence of information on the exact date of individual publications within a given year the within-year order is alphabetical by author. The annual distribution of Tim's 321 publications is shown in figure 1.

We would like to acknowledge the valuable assistance provided by Katharine Hassapoyannes in the extended search for missing publications.

The list shown in section 7 also has columns with the results of categorization, as described in the subsequent sections of this paper.

3 Thematic Areas

Based on our impression of which thematic areas were particularly important in Tim's research, we defined fifteen subject matter areas, shown in table 1, and allocated the 321 publications to these. The list of publications in section 7 contains the codes of the subject matter areas (see table 1) used in our allocation. The definition of relevant thematic areas and our allocation of publications to those areas is subjective, but we feel that they provide a useful way to categorize the focus of his research.

In allocating Tim's writings to the thematic areas we found that some individual publications spanned more than one subject matter area. In such cases we allocated the respective publications to two areas, the first one being the subject we considered most relevant. In table 1 the number of publications listed under 'single criterion' is based on only the first (i.e. most relevant) subject matter area, while the column 'dual criteria' presents the sum of of publications allocated to both a first order and second order area (and therefore contains a total larger than the overall 321 publications we identified). Figure 2 is a graphical representation of the distribution of Tim's publications over the individual thematic areas, based on the first order single criterion.



The results of this analysis demonstrate the large amount of analysis that Josling conducted on a range of agricultural and trade policy issues and is reflective of the major contributions that he made in many key areas.

4 Institutional Relations

We identified ten institutions with which Tim cooperated and which are involved in the analysis of and the provision of advice on policies in the area of agriculture and trade. Where a publication appeared to be associated with one or two of these policy organizations we marked this in the respective columns of the list of publications presented in section 7 of this

paper. Table 3 shows the codes used and the numerical result of that categorization, based on dual criteria in which individual publications were related to two organizations.

6 Citations

From the various sources of citation statistics available online we chose to use GoogleScholar. As Tim's name appears in different formats in references to his publications we searched GoogleScholar for all of these (i.e. Timothy E. Josling, T.E. Josling, Tim E. Josling, Tim Josling, T. Josling) and combined the results into one list. We listed all of Tim's publications for which GoogleScholar showed 20 or more citations on 25 August 2020.

The publications with 101 or more citations are shown in table 5 with full references, while table 6 lists the publications with 20 to 100 citations with publication numbers as provided in the table in section 7.
