How it began

Built in 1995 as a cooperative project of the University of Minnesota Department of Applied Economics and University of Minnesota Libraries, AgEcon Search serves as the permanent archive of the digital scholarly works of agricultural and applied economics researchers worldwide, providing stewardship, reliable long-term access, and broad dissemination. Today, over 180,000 research papers in AgEcon Search are freely accessible and easy to find in Google.

How does it work?

AgEcon Search collects, indexes, and electronically distributes full-text copies of scholarly research in the broadly defined field of agricultural and applied economics.

This includes:

- · agribusiness
- food security and supply
- · energy and natural resource economics
- · environmental economics

- policy issues
- · international trade
- · economic development







Graduate students in our program who shared their theses in AgEcon Search have been able to get jobs in international research organizations, and most are now progressing with Ph.D. degrees in Europe or the United States. Over 164 graduate students over the next two to three years are gearing to submit their theses in AgEcon Search when they complete their studies.
