





We believe that our composite figures are thus reasonably accurate, although some may be slightly below the total f.o.b. sums, due to our inability to find all sources.

The total income of this report is generally based on the average price received by the farmer. This represents a gross income and should not be confused with net income. The high cost of production, marketing and a carry-over of various commodities from the previous season's crop have caused a lower net income received by the farmer. A slight drop in the price received may mean an actual loss to the producer.

These figures do not include value for native grasses or stubble. Such values, in a measure, are reported in our animal production.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to my staff and the people of Solano County who have cooperated so splendidly with me in my fourth year as Agricultural Commissioner of Solano County.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am submitting herewith the 1959 Annual Crop Report for Solano County.

This is the eleventh Annual Crop Report to be compiled by this office. Since we are dependent upon the cooperation of growers, packers, livestock producers, and many others to reveal the correct figures to our representatives, individual items are held in strictest confidence. We believe that our composite figures are thus reasonably accurate, although some may be slightly below the total f.o.b. sums, due to our inability to find all sources.

The total farm income for 1959 as shown on the last page is generally based on the average price received by the farmer. This represents gross income and should not be confused with net income.

Several changes have been made in the method of reporting this year. This was done at the request of the State Department of Agriculture who is attempting to have all County crop reports in the same form.

Production was up enough on most items this year to more than offset the lower prices that many products brought. In fact it brought the gross farm income to the highest ever recorded for Solano County.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to my staff and the people of Solano County who have cooperated so splendidly with me in my eleventh year as Agricultural Commissioner of Solano County.







Gentlemen:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am submitting herewith the 1961 Annual Crop Report for Solano County.

This is the Thirteenth Annual Crop Report to be compiled by this office. Since we are dependent upon the cooperation of growers, packers, livestock producers, and many others to reveal the correct figures to our representatives, individual items are held in strictest confidence. We believe that our composite figures are thus reasonably accurate, although some may be slightly below the total f.o.b. sums due to our inability to find all sources.

The total farm income for 1961 as shown on the last page is generally based on the average price received by the farmer. This represents gross income and should not be confused with net income.

Gross farm income this year was lower than last, due mainly to extreme hot weather at a critical point in the growth of many crops, thus reducing yields. It must be emphasized, however, that these figures include all the costs of production. These costs have continued to rise making it more difficult than ever for the farmer to realize a profit.

I wish to express may sincere appreciation to my staff and the people of Solano County who have cooperated so splendidly with me in my Thirteenth year as Agriecultural Commissionar of Solano County.
