TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE:

I hereby submit the annual crop report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

This is the first crop report compiled by this office. Since we must depend upon the co-operation of growers, processors, and many others to reveal correct figures to our representatives, individual items are held in the strictest confidence.

We feel that all figures here compiled are reasonably accurate and conservative. The income is based on the average prices received by growers. Production in many cases is also calculated on an average basis.

These figures indicate the gross value of farm products and shall not be construed as net returns to farmers. Growing and harvesting costs are included but no packing, processing, or retail costs are included.

Much of the field crop returns are used in the production of livestock, and no allowance has been made for this fact. These figures do not include native grasses or irrigated pastures; such values also become a part of our livestock production.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the Agricultural Extension Service, the many individuals, organizations, and people of Tehama County and my staff, for their splendid assistance and co-operation in compiling this report.

1951 AGRICULTURAL CROP REPORT

TO: Honorable A. A. Brock, Director of Agriculture, and The Honorable Board of Supervisors, Tehama County

I hereby submit the annual crop report as required by

Section 6515 of the Agricultural Code.

This year's report shows an increase in excess of Four Million Dollars over the 1950 agricultural report for this county. The increase is the result of better crop production in many cases and increased prices received by growers for many commodities. The figures indicate the gross farm values of the products which include planting, growing and harvesting costs and shall not be construed as net returns to farmers. F.O.B. farm prices are used and not prices of products after they are packed or graded for the ultimate consumer.

A considerable amount of the field crop returns are used in the production of livestock, and no allowance has been made for this fact. These figures do not include native grasses or irrigated pastures; such values also become a part of our

livestock production.

With the exception of almonds, which produced only about onethird of the normal crop this season, most all crops were normal or above normal in production.

Cattle and poultry sales do not include the sale or production

of replacement stock for keeping up herd or flock inventories.

Commercial hatcheries produced 776,000 baby chicks, of which

only hatching egg value was considered.

No oil olive values were considered, since this year it appears that very few will be sold due to an unfavorable market situation.

The season's strawberry plant crop is not yet completely

sold as harvesting is still in process.

Forestry products are figured on the in-the-log stumpage

value and do not include any milling or processing.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation of growers and processors and many other individuals for information

used in this report.

I wish to further thank the individuals of the Agricultural Extension Service, the United States and State Forest Service, the PMA officials and my staff for their splendid assistance and cooperation in compiling this report.

I hereby submit the annual crop report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

1952 gross farm income showed a \$672,358 decrease compared with the 1951 report. With increased operation and feed costs, the decrease may be considered even greater. Field crop values show a considerable increase this year, while orchard, seed and livestock values have declined.

The figures used in this report are gross F.O.B. farm prices and shall not be construed as a net return to farmers.

The estimated 1954 farm gross income showed a little over 10% increase in value over 1953. This increase in most cases is due to a larger production. The dollar value received per unit produced was lower in many cases and resulted in less net income dollars to many of our grower groups.

The figures used in this report are gross F.O.B. farm prices and shall not be construed as a net return to farmers.

A considerable amount of the field crop returns are used in the production of livestock, and no allowance has been made for this fact. These figures do not include native grasses or irrigated pastures; such values become a part of our livestock production. They do not include packing costs on such things as fruit and nursery stock.

Cattle and poultry sales do not include the sale or value of replacement stock for keeping up herd or flock inventories.



TO: Director, State Department of Agriculture, and The Honorable Board of Supervisors, Tehama County

Gentlemen:

I hereby submit the annual crop report as required by Section 65.6 of the Agricultural Code.

The estimated 1955 farm gross income balances out about the same in value as 1954. The gross values of fruit and nuts, truck crops, nursery stock, apiary and poultry were higher than in 1954; whereas field crops and livestock figures were lower.

While spring frost effected production of peaches, almonds, and prunes, higher prices still reflected an increase in value of all fruits and nuts.

On truck crops a favorable market and price on watermelons was responsible for the increase.

In nursery stock an increase in strawberry plant nursery stock was the main factor for the increase in value.

A better market and sale of queen and package bees increased the apiary value.

Production was down somewhat on most poultry, however better prices reflected in a higher gross value.

Field crops were off in value, largely because of reduced acreage in alfalfa and a poor yield on barley, during this season.

While we had an increase in the number of livestock sold, reduced prices in general were responsible for a considerable decrease in value compared to 1954 values.

The figures used in this report are gross F.O.B. farm prices, and shall not be construed as a net return to farmers.

A considerable amount of the field crop returns are used in the production of livestock, and no allowance has been made for this fact. These figures do not include native grasses or irrigated pastures; such values become a part of our livestock production. They do not include packing costs on such things as fruit and nursery stock.



I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

The estimated 1956 farm gross income of \$17,036,360.00 shows an increase of about three quarters of a million dollars over last years figures. While some crops show a decrease in production and value, others show a substantial increase.

Fruit and nut crops in the county have shown a gradual increase over the past five years. New orchard plantings are on the increase in the county, with the largest plantings being in prunes and walnuts, which would indicate that fruit production will continue to grow in Tehama County.

Field crops are slightly higher than the previous year - this value being held up by our increasing field corn production.

Seed and nursery stock is off considerably, this being largely due to the reduction in demand for strawberry plants.

Livestock figures show a very small minus in comparison with the 1955 figures. It is about holding its own.







TO:

Director, State Department of Agriculture and The Honorable Board of Supervisors, Tehama County

Gentlemen:

I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

A gross of \$15,289,936.00 has been established as the farm value for Tehama County agriculture and livestock production in 1958. This shows an increase of about half a million dollars over the 1957 Report. The increase is directly related to the increased value and activity of the livestock operation, which more than tends to offset the declines experienced by orchard and field crop operations resulting from lowered yields and prices this season.

The unusually long wet spring had a serious effect on the production of many of Tehama County field and orchard crops, affecting both quality and volume of production. This resulted in a very poor return from our grain. Fruit and nut crops were off for the second year in a row. Fruit and nut acreage is on the increase in Tehama County, and with favorable production and prices a large increase can be expected in the next few years.

I refer you to the "Five Year Summary Record" on the last page of this Report which gives a pretty fair picture of the trend in this County. The figures used in this Report are gross F.O.B. farm prices, and shall not be construed as a net return to farmer.

A considerable amount of the field crop returns are used in the production of livestock, and no allowance has been made for this fact. These figures do not include native grasses or irrigated pastures; such values become a part of our livestock production.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the Tehama County Agricultural Extension Service, members of the ASC office and many individuals, organizations and industry plants for their cooperation and assistance. Information from these sources has been invaluable in compiling this Report.



I herewith submit the 1963 Annual Crop Report on agriculture and livestock production for Tehama County, as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code.

The total gross value is just slightly below last year's figure. To assist in evaluating this report I have attached an analysis sheet pointing up some of the reasons for production variances within the different crop groups.

All figures used represent GROSS FARM VALUE. A considerable amount of field crop and pasture production is used as feed for livestock and no allowance has been made for this fact.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to individuals, industry and other agencies for their cooperation and information given to this office for use in compiling this report.

REPORT ANALYSIS

The preliminary gross farm value for 1963 has been established at \$21,654,693.00. This is up a little over \$400,000.00 when compared to the revised final 1962 report. When originally compiling this report, it appeared that the value for 1963 was going to be below that of 1962, however an increase is reflected when revisions were made in the final figures for 1962.

The report includes the production and value of all orchard and agricultural crops and pastures as well as livestock and livestock products. Government payments received by growers are also included in the grand total.

FRUIT & NUT production and value should be increasing each year for some time. There are 6,251 acres of nonbearing trees and orchardists continue to plant prunes and walnuts rather heavily each year. Prune and peach production for this year was far below normal due largely to some unseasonable frost and hail storms.

VEGETABLE CROPS are a minor item and show little change.

FIELD CROPS are down somewhat. Some of this is due to land that has been taken out of production for federal incentive programs as well as orchard acreage replacing land that was originally used for field crops. For the most part, production was down on field crops this year with little change in value.

PASTURE & RANGE includes irrigated and other types of range pasture. The irrigated pasture is up a couple of thousand acres and the range area remains about the same, however the commercial value of range pasture has increased.

SEED CROP values are down which is due largely to price. Seed acreage is down but actually in this county indications are that seed growing will increase during the next few years.

NURSERY PRODUCTS are down slightly, but there is very little change in this group. The production of deciduous fruit trees in the area will probably drop off.

APIARY PRODUCTS are up. This is not a large item in our crop report but the apiary industry is essential to our orchard and seed production.

PRODUCTS FROM LIVESTOCK & POULTRY, which includes milk, wool and eggs, are about the same as last year.

LIVESTOCK & POULTRY SALES total about the same as last year. Production was up in a number of cases but prices paid for beef, dairy animals and hogs were below the year previous.
