In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit a report of the agricultural production for Alameda County for calendar year 1982. This report deals with the gross value of production and does not attempt to reflect net farm income nor costs of production and marketing.

The gross value of all commodities produced was the highest on record, \$63,843,300. This represents an increase of \$1,695,400 above the 1981 production. This increase can be attributed primarily to greater levels of production and higher prices being paid for certain commodities.

Data for the preparation of this report has been obtained from producers, processors, representatives of agribusiness and individuals with special knowledge in the field. Their assistance and cooperation is sincerely appreciated. I would also like to express my appreciation to the members of my staff for their effort in the preparation of this report.

In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit a report of the agricultural production for Alameda County for calendar year 1983. This report deals with the gross value of production and does not attempt to reflect net farm income nor costs of production and marketing.

The gross value of all commodities produced in Alameda County decreased for the first time in over 10 years. The 1983 production level was \$7,575,500 below that of 1982. This decrease can be attributed to declining prices paid for certain commodities, poor weather (growing) conditions resulting in lowered production levels, and a perceptible reduction in agriculture operations.

Data for the preparation of this report has been obtained from producers, processors, representatives of agribusiness and individuals with special knowledge in the field. Their assistance and cooperation is sincerely appreciated. I would also like to express my appreciation to the members of my staff for their effort in the preparation of this report.

In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, I am pleased to submit a report of the agricultural production of Alameda County for the calendar year 1989. This report deals with the gross value of production and does not attempt to reflect net farm income or costs of production and marketing.

The value of Alameda County's agricultural production in 1989 rose to \$59,392,700. This represents an increase of over three million dollars above that of 1988. While vegetable production continues to decline, the nursery, cut flower, livestock, and field crop industries have been able to hold their own. The dramatic upsurge in the value of fruit and nut production can be attributed to Alameda County's winegrape growers. Nearly 600 new bearing acres came into production last year. Despite seemingly endless drought and other hardships, our County's agricultural industries remain competitive.
