



In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Calaveras County Report of Agriculture for 1982.

The gross agricultural production for Calaveras County in 1982 was \$15,484,500 as compared to \$16,474,260 in 1981. The reduction was primarily attributed to lower timber and cattle prices. Producers of several other commodities, however, enjoyed an outstanding year with high yields and strong prices.

All figures used in this report represent gross values and do \underline{not} indicate net income, or profit received by growers.

I wish to extend my appreciation to the many individuals and organizations who contributed to the compilation of this report, and to Doug Norfolk of my staff who coordinated and compiled the report.

In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Calaveras County Report of Agriculture for 1983. This report was made possible by the many growers, livestock producers, and organizations who voluntarily supplied the needed statistics. I would like to express my sincere appreciation to those agricultural producers and organizations and to Douglas Norfolk of my staff who compiled the report.

The gross agricultural production of Calaveras County was \$20,198,200 in 1983 as compared to the 1982 value of \$15,484,500. This is the first time the agricultural production has reached the \$20,000,000 mark; this increase is attributed primarily to the increased timber harvest. Fruit and nut producers generally experienced both reduced production and lower prices. The one exception to this trend was winegrape production which continued to increase in 1983. Other production remained relatively constant.

I would like to stress that all figures used in this report represent gross values and do not indicate net income or profit received by growers.



In compliance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, I am pleased to submit the Calaveras County Report of Agriculture for 1984. This report was made possible by the many growers, livestock producers and organizations who voluntarily supplied the needed statistics. I would like to express my sincere appreciation to those agricultural producers and to Douglas Norfolk of my staff who compiled this report.

The gross agricultural production of Calaveras County was \$14,643,100 in 1984 compared to \$20,187,200 in 1983. This drastic reduction is primarily attributed to a reduced timber harvest and reduced timber value. The value of livestock and poultry products also declined by nearly \$700,000 in 1984. Other production remained relatively constant, even though some growers were adversely affected by late spring frost in 1984.

I would like to stress that all figures used in this report represent gross values and do not indicate net income or profit received by the growers.


