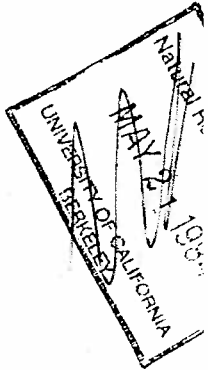

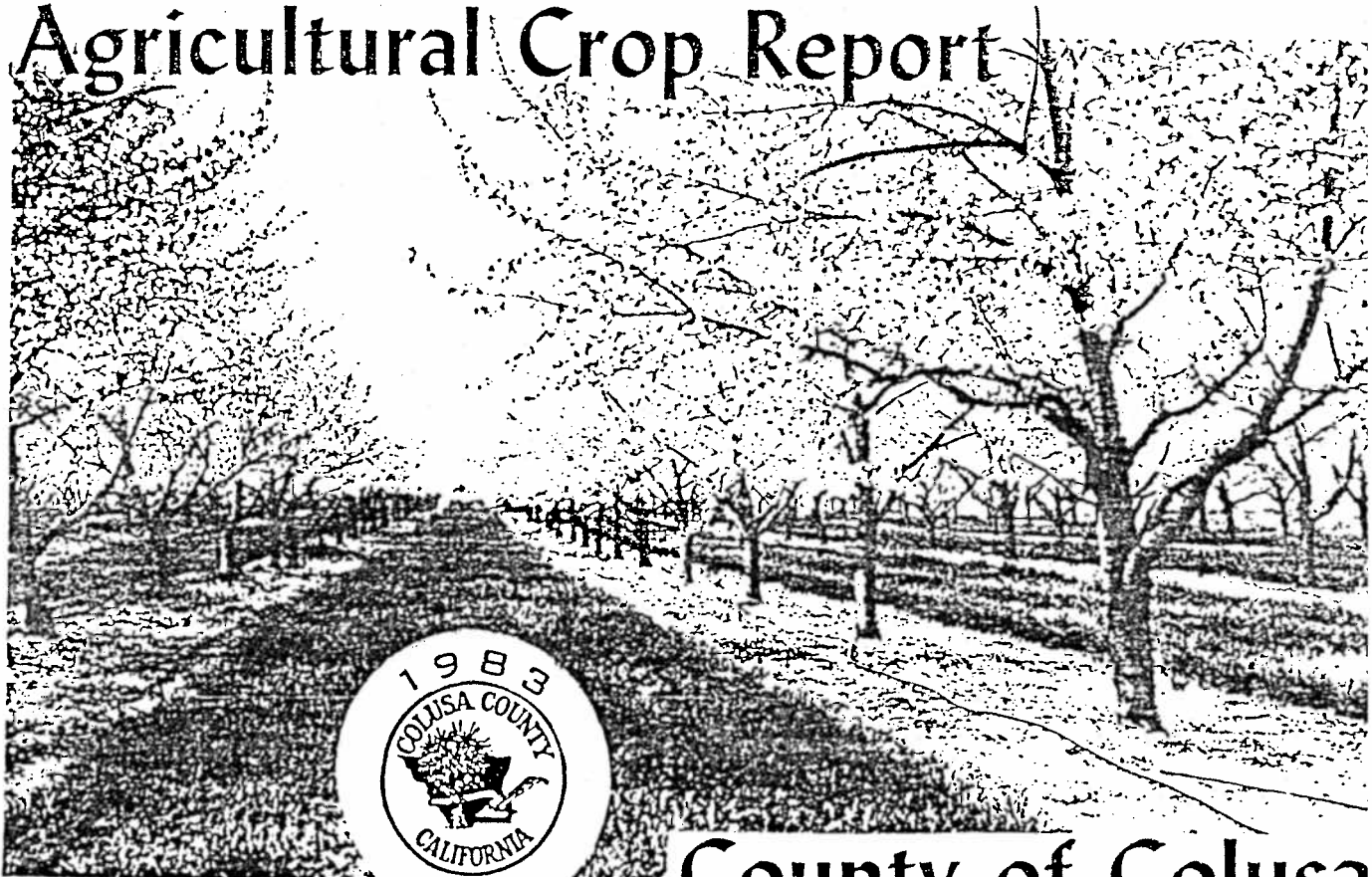


Gentlemen:

The 1987 production value of \$149,049,400 reflects a four year rise from a low of \$111,338,000 in 1983, but is over 25% below the record high of \$200,446,400 in 1980.*

*Prunes led the way by over doubling 1986 figures, in production and value, from 1.1 to 2.5 tons per acre and from \$4,007,000 to \$9,094,000. Rice continued it's decline in overall value from \$46,655,000 in 1986 to \$42,962,000 in 1987, eventhough acreage and production increased.*

*I must stress that the figures show only gross values and do not reflect costs of production nor net income to the grower.*

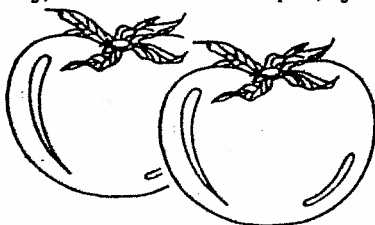

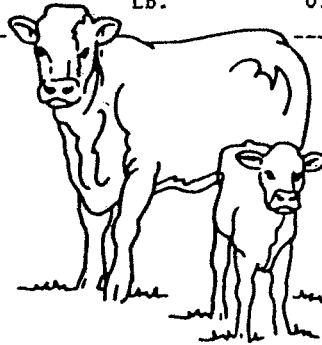


In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279, of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Colusa County Agricultural Crop Report. The 1988 production value of \$162,146,700 continues to show a steady increase in value over the previous five years, but remains well below the record high for 1980 of \$200,446,400.

Rice produced the largest increase in value, from \$42,962,000 in 1987 to \$48,026,000 in 1988, due to more planted acreage and a slight increase in price. Wheat jumped to \$6,468,000 from \$3,910,000 in 1987 based on increases in acres, production and value. Cattle and calves; sugar beets and almonds also had increases in their overall value. Prunes, walnuts and non-certified seed crops showed declines in their overall 1988 figures as compared to 1987.

I must stress that these figures show gross values only and do not reflect a net return to the grower.

I wish to thank everyone who contributed to this report. I also express appreciation to my staff and especially Jon Richter, Agricultural Inspector III, who compiled this report.


In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279, of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Colusa County Agricultural Crop Report. The 1989 production value of \$227,261,000 is a new record high for Colusa County. The previous record of \$200,446,400 was set in 1980. Part of the record value increase was as a result of the inclusion of the government subsidy payment in determining the total value of 1989 rice production.

Tomatoes produced the largest percentage increase in value from \$18,691,000 to \$29,213,000, at 56.3%. This was based on increased acreage, production and price. Rice jumped from \$48,026,000 to \$87,224,000 due to the government subsidy as well as increased production. Wheat also continued its rise in value over previous years with acreage, production and price all higher than in 1988. Only livestock production experienced a slight decline in total value due to a decrease in the number of head of sheep and lambs.

I must stress that these figures show gross values only, and do not reflect a net return to the grower.

I wish to thank everyone who contributed to this report. I also express appreciation to my staff and especially to Jon Richter, Agricultural Biologist and Standards Officer III, who compiled this report.
