I am pleased to submit the 1982 Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural products in 1982 was a record \$65,294,760 -- up \$4,654,710 from 1981. An unusually wet winter and a poor economy were primarily responsible for declines of \$1.0 million in Field Crops and \$2.2 in Nursery Crops respectively. Processing tomato value increased \$3.4 million while sales of cattle contributed to an increase of \$3.0 million in the Livestock category. Leading categories in 1982 were Nursery Crops (\$13.5 million); Vegetable and Seed Crops (\$12.9 million); and Field Crops (\$12.7 million).

It must be emphasized that the values shown in this report are  $\underline{gross}$  receipts and do not indicate net profits received by producers.

This report would not be possible without the cooperation of countless individuals and organizations. To them my sincere thanks. I also want to extend my appreciation to my staff who compiled the data, and special thanks once again to Bob Cruickshank, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, for a superb job in the compilation of this document.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1983 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

It should be emphasized that the values represented in this report are gross receipts and do not indicate net profits to the producer.

The 1983 gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$60,630,810 -- a reduction of \$3,754,950 from the 1982 value.

Two major categories (Nursery Crops and Livestock, Apiary and Pouttry Products) registered increases in 1943. The Field Crops and Fruit and Nut Crops categories dropped \$5.3 million -- primarily due to extended spring rains affecting planting schedules and pollination. Some growers of grain crops also decided to leave land fallowed under the Payment In Kind (PIK) Program.

I would like to express my appreciation to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling this data.

I am pleased to submit the 1984 Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

The total gross value of agricultural products in 1984 was a record \$66,816,092 -- a \$5,691,272 increase over 1983.

The 9.3% advance in total gross value over the previous year was primarily due to a \$4.8 million jump in asparagus, bedding plants and melons.

Major categories registering gains in gross value in 1984 included Vegetable and Seed Crops, Nursery Products and Livestock, Apiary and Poultry Products, while declines occurred in Field Crops, Fruit and Nut Crops and Livestock. Increased production and higher prices were the largest contributors to major gains in value for 1984.

It should be emphasized that the values represented in this report are  $\underline{gross}$  receipts and do not reflect net profits to the producer.

I am grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members for compiling the data.

It should be emphasized that the values represented in this report are gross receipts and do not indicate net profits to the producer.

The 1985 gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$63,172,090 -- a drop of \$2,904,802 from the 1984 record year.

All major categories showed declines in gross value in 1985. Decline in value was caused by several factors including reduction of acreage, yield and price.

Crops exceeding \$1 million in gross value in descending order were tomatoes, bedding plants, milk, cut roses, cattle and calves, asparagus, rangeland, cows and bulls, field corn, indoor decoratives, walnuts, sugarbeets, miscellaneous nursery and cut flowers, wheat and sweet corn.

I would like to express my appreciation to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling this data.



I am pleased to submit the 1986 Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products in 1986 was \$61,791,050 - up \$2,137,970 from the previous year. The 3.5% increase in gross receipts primarily reflects a rise in all categories except field crops and livestock, apiary and poultry products.

Extensive construction throughout the county, but predominantly in the southern and eastern areas, continues to deplete our agricultural land base. Lower prices caused farmers to switch from sugar beets to tomatoes and other field and vegetable crops.

It must be emphasized that the values represented in this report are gross receipts received by the producer. They do not take into account the costs of production, transportation or marketing.

I want to thank the many individuals and organizations who provided information for this report and the staff members who compiled the data.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1987 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

It must be emphasized that the values shown in this report are gross receipts of the producer. They do not reflect the costs of production, transportation, or marketing.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products in 1987 was \$60,856,100 -- a decrease of \$935,750. Although this was only a 1.5% decrease in total gross agricultural receipts, several categories showed significant changes. The Vegetable/Seed Crops category and the Livestock, Apiary and Poultry Products category decreased \$1.7 million and \$1.1 million respectively. A decline in milk production coupled with a drop in tomato production and price caused most of the reduction in these categories. The Livestock and Poultry category increased \$2.4 million, largely due to increases in price and number of cattle sold.

I wish to thank all the individuals who contributed information for this report and especially to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling the data.

I am pleased to submit the 1988 Contra Costa County Crop and Livestock Report as required by the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The 1988 gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$61,392,102--a gain of \$1,088,140 over 1987. This 1.8% rise is attributed to a \$2.2 million increase in value of fruit and nut crops, field crops, nursery crops and livestock products. Offsetting this gain was a \$1.1 million decrease in vegetable and seed crops and livestock and poultry products.

Crops exceeding \$1 million in value include bedding plants, tomatoes, cut roses, cattle and calves, rangeland pasture, asparagus, alfalfa hay, indoor decorative plants, herbaceous perennials, miscellaneous nursery and cut flowers, apricots, miscellaneous fruit and nut crops, grapes, walnuts, sweet corn and field corn.

It should be emphasized the values stated in this report are  $\underline{\text{gross}}$  receipts and do not include the costs of production, transportation, or marketing.

I would like to express my appreciation to all the individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to my diligent staff members who assisted in obtaining and compiling this data. Special recognition goes to staff members Pat Alavi and Bob Cruickshank for their extra efforts.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products in 1989 was \$65,153,220 -- a gain of \$3,661,118 over 1988. This 6 percent rise is attributed to a \$5.6 million increase in the value of fruit and nut crops, nursery crops, field crops and livestock, apiary and poultry products. Offsetting this gain was a \$1.9 million decrease in livestock and poultry

Several crop categories exceeded \$1 million in value. They included in descending value bedding plants, tomatoes, milk, roses, asparagus, rangeland pasture, cattle and calves, apples, apricots, alfalfa hay, sweet corn, indoor decoratives, herbaceous perennials, walnuts, miscellaneous nursery and cut flowers, and cows and bulls.

It must be emphasized the values stated in this report are gross receipts and do not include the costs of production, transportation, or marketing.

I would like to express my appreciation to all those who contributed information for this report, including my staff who obtained and compiled this data. Special thanks to Cathy Roybal, Pat Alavi and Bob Cruickshank for their efforts in preparing this report.
