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I. Introduction.

In August 1989, 5023 questionnaires were mailed to all persons who graduated from the College of Agriculture at Kansas State University between 1978 and 1988. Questionnaires were returned by 1537 alumni, yielding a response rate of just over 30%.

The questionnaire inquired about both college and career experiences, including starting and current salaries and the level of job satisfaction. This Staff Paper presents the overall results of the survey; other research has been conducted that analyzes (1) the determinants of both starting and current (August 1989) salaries, (2) the determinants of the number of positions held and number of promotions earned by College of Agriculture alumni, (3) the career skills that are found to be important to alumni after graduation, and (4) the overall results of the survey broken down by major field of study.

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II. Summary of Part A: General Information.

Sixty-seven percent of all respondents majored in five fields: Animal Sciences and Industry (Question A1, 23%), Agricultural Economics (19%), Agronomy (10%), Horticulture (8%), and Agricultural Education (7%). The remaining respondents were distributed among the other majors within the College of Agriculture, and 97 respondents (6%) were double majors (Ala).

Twenty percent of the Ag Alumni earned an Associate's Degree before attainment of the Bachelor's Degree (A2). Thirty-one percent of the respondents earned an advanced degree; 15% earned Master's Degrees, and 9% achieved the D.V.M. degree (A2).

At the time of the survey, 93% of the respondents were between 21 and 35 years of age (A3); three-quarters were male (A4), and two-thirds were married (A5).

Fifty percent of the respondents were from a Farm/Ranch (A6). The size of the respondents' high school graduating class was distributed evenly as reported in question (A7).

Involvement in activities while attending K.S.U. are reported in Table A8, page 9. Intramural sports were the most frequently reported activity, with a 37% participation rate while at K.S.U. Other frequently cited activities include: Block and Bridle (15%), Alpha Zeta (12%), Ag Econ Club (11%), Pre-Vet Club (11%), Ag Ambassadors (10%), and Greek Fraternity/Sorority (8%).

Fifty-four percent of the graduates surveyed entered K.S.U. with Freshman status, whereas 44% entered as transfer students (A9). Cumulative G.P.A. in college was centered around 3.0, and 17% of the sample earned a G.P.A. higher than 3.5 (A10).

Seventy-four percent of the survey respondents were employed for an average of at least one hour per week during their college years (All). Thirty-one percent averaged between 10 and 19 hours of employment per week. Forty-four percent of the responding Alumni did not acquire debt in the form of student loans while at K.S.U. (Al2), whereas only 5% became indebted at a level greater than \$10,000 (Al2).

III. Summary of Part B: Current Employment.

Eighty-nine percent of Agricultural College Alumni were employed full time, with the remaining graduates distributed among part-time employment, student status, and retirement at the time of the survey (B1). One respondent indicated his or her occupation as Retired.

The most frequently identified response to "Type of Employment" among K.S.U. Ag graduates was Management (B2, 13%). Other frequent employment categories include Self-Employed-Farm (11%), Veterinarian (8%), Government (8%), Finance/Credit (7%), and Education (6%). The Other response was the most frequent (14%).

Two questions deal with the type of employer (B4) and the type of employment (B5). Note that survey respondents answered both questions seperately, and that responses to question B4 are not mutually exclusive of the responses to question B5. In response to the question on Employer Type, the respondents reported employment in Private Industry (B4, 54%), Government (22%), and Self-Employed (20%). Question B5 pursued employment type, indicating that 17% of the respondents had careers in farming/ranching, whereas 47% reported careers in Agribusiness. Thirty-one percent reported careers not related to the agricultural sector (B5).

A large majority of respondents' experience at their current position at the time of the survey was distributed between 1 and 10 years (B6). This result reflects the year of graduation of the alumni, which for this survey encompasses 1978 to 1988.

Salaries varied widely, but were centered around \$25,000 per year (B7). Care must be taken in the interpretation of these results for several reasons. First, these figures include all respondents, some of whom are recent graduates, and some of whom are experienced. Also, some of the self-employed respondents appear to have reported their gross annual sales; thus, there are some high salaries that are questionable.

Frequently reported fringe benefits included Health Insurance (B8, 70%) and Paid Vacations (70%). Over 49% of responding Alumni received Sick Pay, Retirement, or Medical benefits. Over 20% of the reporting alumni received at least one of the following: an Automobile, a Training Program, Profit-Sharing, or Dental Benefits.

Thirty-eight percent of all respondents reported an urban job location, with only 19% working in a rural location (B9).

IV. Summary of Part C: First Position.

Thirty percent of all respondents reported starting salaries (adjusted for inflation) between \$15,000 and \$19,999 (C1), and 25% of the reporting alumni had starting salaries of between \$20,000 and \$24,999. A small number of respondents reported very large starting salaries, as evidenced by table C1.

The respondents were distributed evenly across the years in which the first job was taken (C2).

Individual Effort was the most frequently reported placement service utilized (C3), with over 56% of the respondents reporting personal exertion. Over one-third employed the Career Planning and Placement Center, and over one-quarter used a Personal Contact. Other popular placement services include Departmental Faculty (20%), Work Experience (19%), and Direct Application (19%). The Most Important Placement Service Utilized was Individual Effort (C3A, 18%). Note that there was limited response to this question; 42% responded No Answer.

Eighty-nine percent of all respondents worked full time in their first position (C4). Similar to current employment type, the most frequent type of first position taken was Management (C5, 10%). Other frequently reported first jobs include Self-Employed-Farm (9%), Veterinarian (8%), Education (7%), and Government (7%). Analogous to the current employment questions, the questionnaire provided questions on both employer type (C7) and employment type (C8). Over 60% of the reported first jobs were in private industry (C7), and about 18% were in Farming/Ranching (C8). Note that the responses to employer type are not mutually exclusive of responses to employment type.

Over one-half of the respondents landed their first position prior to leaving college (C9, 54%), with all but 7% of the respondents finding work within six months after graduation.

Over one quarter of these jobs were located in rural areas (C10).

V. Summary of Part D: Attitudes/Job Experience.

Over 70% of the respondents Agreed or Strongly Agreed that "My career is closely related to my K.S.U. degree." (D1, 77%), that "My college education prepared me for my current career." (D2, 84%), and that "My college major prepared me for my current career." (D3, 72%).

Thirty-six percent of the respondents believed their degrees to be more valuable than those received by colleagues at other institutions, whereas 19 percent disagreed (D4). Forty-nine percent were in agreement with the statement that their advisor was a key factor in their college experience (D5). A majority of graduates would "be involved in more extracurricular activities" if they were able to "do it [college] over" (D6).

Over two-thirds of the respondents expected to stay with their current employer for more than five years (D7), and 58% have declined other employment offers since taking their current job (D8). One-quarter of the respondents felt that they "should have pursued a different major" (D9).

Respondents Agreed or Strongly Agreed that all of the listed skills were important in their current position, recorded in order of strength of response: (1) Oral Communication (D10B, 96%), (2) People Skills (D10G, 94%), (3) Problem Solving (D10E, 94%), (4) Management Skills (D10I, 90%), (5) Written Communication (D10A, 89%), (6) Technical Knowledge (D10F, 84%), (7) Mathematics (D10C, 79%), (8) Computer Skills (D10D, 69%), and (9) Economics Skills (D10H, 67%).

Respondents Agreed or Strongly Agreed that the following skills learned in extracurricular activities are an asset in their current position: (1) Self Confidence (D11G, 79%), (2) Group Interaction (D11F, 75%), (3) Oral Communication (D11A, 75%), (4) Leadership (D11E, 74%), (5) Organization (D11D, 73%), (6) Public Relations (D11C, 69%), and (7) Parliamentary Procedure (D11B, 32%).

Respondents were Satisfied or Very Satisfied with the following aspects of their present job: (1) Responsibility (D12F, 85%), (2) Opportunity to Learn and Improve (D12I, 77%), (3) Location (D12B, 74%), (4) Working Conditions (D12E, 71%), (5) Salary/Benefits (D12A, 69%), (6) Prestige/Recognition (D12D, 57%), (7) Opportunity to Advance (D12C, 55%), (8) Free Time (D12G, 54%), (9) Travel (D12H, 51%).

Overall, 79% of all survey respondents were Satisfied or Very Satisfied with their current job (D12J). Almost 90 percent of all respondents were Satisfied or Very Satisfied with their investment in education at K.S.U., whereas only 4% were Dissatisfied or Very Dissatisfied (D13).

A majority (66%) of graduates had held only one or two jobs at the time of the survey, but many graduates had held three (18%), four (7%), or five or more jobs (5%). The number of jobs held (D14) reflects the number of years since graduation, with the number of positions increasing with the passage of time.

Thirty percent of all alumni have not received a promotion since graduation (D15). However, 19% have been promoted once, and 15% have received either two or three promotions.

The number of employees supervised by recent agricultural graduates varies widely (D16). Thirty-four percent of all survey respondents were not in a supervisory position. Twenty percent of all respondents supervised one or two employees; 13 respondents supervised over 100 persons.
