

I herewith submit the Annual Crop Report as required by Section 2279 of the Food and Agricultural Code.

I would like to report that the total County Agricultural production values have surpassed the one billion dollar mark for the first time. Gross annual agricultural income in 1990 was \$1,016,811,000 dollars, a 4 percent increase over the 1989 annual income. This increase was posted primarily in the field crops sector (27%) and in the livestock revenue (10%). A decline in revenue was experienced in the remainder of our agricultural economy.

I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit. However, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$200 dollars of personal income is generated to agricultural related jobs. This accounts for 14.8% of the total personal income generated in public and private sector jobs in the county.

I wish to thank all the individuals, growers and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required to compile this report and express special thanks to my staff for their dedicated work.







(Value = Millions of Dollars)



In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1991. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. It does not reflect net farm income or costs of production. This report is based on average production and average value of the gross receipts.

The 1991 total agricultural production value was \$952,729,000. This is a six percent decrease from the 1990 value. The reduction in values were posted principally in the field crop and livestock sectors. The vegetable and melon crop values, however, marked an increase of 15%.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1992. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The 1992 total agricultural production value was \$855,070,000. This is a 10.25 percent decrease from the 1991 value. The reduction in values were posted principally in the field crop and vegetable crop sectors. The current whitefly infestation is a significant factor in the diminishing values. Livestock showed a strong increase in value of 19.1%. As a measure of how agriculture production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$200 dollars of personal income is generated to agricultural related jobs.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1993. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1993 was \$1,020,513,000. This is a 19.35 percent increase from the 1992 value. The increases in values were posted in the vegetable crop(41%), field crop (18%) and livestock (1%) sectors. This increase was a direct result of higher pricing coupled with increased yields. The whitefly infestation is a significant factor in the reduction of acreage in the vegetable (13%) and field (2%) crops. The fall melon crop has nearly been eliminated. As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, 212 dollars of personal income is generated to agriculturally related jobs.

I wish to thank all the individuals and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required for the compilation of this report. I wish to especially thank the staff that produced this report for their dedicated work.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1994. This report is a summary of acreage, yields and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1994 was \$954,534,000. This is a 6.47% decrease from the 1993 value. The reduction in values were posted in vegetable and melon (18.29%), apiary (13.5%), livestock (7.33%) and seed and nursery (6.96%) sectors. Lower prices coupled with lower yields are the principal causes for the decrease in gross values. Increased values posted in field (12.29%) and fruit and nut (3.8%) sectors were a direct result of increased acreage, yields and prices. The whitefly infestation continues to be a significant factor impacting the agricultural practices in our County and contributes to the general decline in gross value. As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, 206 dollars of personal income is generated by agriculturally related jobs.

I wish to thank all the individuals and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required for the compilation of this report. I wish to especially thank the staff that produced this report for their dedicated work.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1995. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1995 was \$1,008,653,000. This is a 5.6% percent increase from the 1994 value. The increase in values were posted in the fruit and nut crops (8%), vegetable crops (36%), and apiary (51%) sectors. This increase was a direct result of higher pricing coupled with increased yields. Decreases in value occured in field crops (11%), livestock (16%) and seed and nursery (12%). Lower prices were the principal cause of the decreases in gross value. As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$220 dollars of personal income is generated to agriculturally related jobs. Even though this is a modest increase over last year the whitefly continues to cause significant crop loss and economic damage





I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1996 was \$956,521,000. This is a 5.1% percent decrease from the 1995 value. The decreases in values were posted in the vegetable and melon crops (19.2%), livestock (3.4%), fruit and nut crops (9.9%) sectors. The decreases were a result of lower pricing coupled with decreased acreage. Increases in value occurred in field crops (15.9%), seed and nursery (26.5%), and apiary products (60.8%). Higher prices and increased acreage were the principle cause of the increases in value. As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$211 dollars of personal income is generated to agriculturally related jobs. The whitefly continues to cause significant crop loss and economic damage. The wheat crop experienced record highs in terms of acreage, yields and prices. Those highs were greatly overshadowed by the added costs and inconveniences in harvesting and handling that were imposed by the Karnal Bunt infestation.





(VALUE = MILLIONS OF DOLLARS)





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1997. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1997 was \$1,039,928,000. This is a 10.0 percent increase from the 1996 value. The increases in values were posted in the vegetable and melon crops (11.7%), livestock (6.8%), field crops (7.3%) and, seed and nursery (55.3%). The increases were a result of higher pricing mostly in hay, seed and vegetable crops, coupled with some increased acreage. Decreases in value occurred in citrus crops (3.2%), and apiary products (26%). The decreases were due to lower prices. As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$209 dollars of personal income is generated to agriculturally related jobs. The cotton and wheat crops posted record high yields in 1997. Whitefly continues to cause significant crop loss and economic damage.

I wish to thank all the individuals and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required for the compilation of this report. I wish to especially thank the staff that produced this report for their dedicated work.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1998. This report is a summary of acreage, yields, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1998 was \$1,083,232,000. This is a 4.1 percent increase from the 1997 value. The increase in values were posted in the vegetable and melon crops (16.6%), and seed and nursery (51.3%). The increases were a result of higher prices and yields in vegetable and melon crops. The increases in seed and nursery crops were due to increases in acreage of alfalfa, bermudagrass and certified seed crops.

Decreases in value occurred in field crops (14%), livestock (2.3%) and apiary (7.5%). The decreases were due to lower prices.

As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$214 dollars of personal income is generated to agricultural related jobs. The Whitefly continues to cause significant crop loss and economic damage.

I wish to thank all the individuals and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required for the compilation of this report. I especially wish to thank the staff that produced this report for their dedicated work.





In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the Annual Crop Report for 1999. This report is a summary of acreage, yield, and gross value of agricultural production in Imperial County. I wish to emphasize that this report represents gross returns to the producer and does not indicate actual net profit.

The total agricultural production value in 1999 was \$1,045,092,000. This is a 3.5 percent decrease from the 1998 value. Increases in values were in livestock (6.9%) and fruit and nut crops (20.95%). The increases were a result of higher prices for livestock, and higher yields and prices for citrus. There was an increase in apiary products (3.04%), due an increase in prices for pollination. Decreases in value occurred in field crops (9.61%), vegetable and melon crops (5.72%), and seed and nursery crops (4.02%). The decreases were due to lower prices and yields. Whitefly continues to cause significant crop loss and economic damage.

As a measure of how agricultural production impacts the County, for every thousand dollars of total gross value produced, \$349 dollars of personal income are generated to agriculturally related jobs.

I wish to thank all the individuals and organizations for their cooperation in providing the information required for the compilation of this report. I wish to especially thank the staff that produced this report for their dedicated work.




