

I am pleased to submit the 1982 Crop Report for Inyo and Mono Counties in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

The gross returns for 1982 totaled \$18,986,843, which is an increase of one percent from last year. The values shown within are gross figures only and do not reflect net income or loss.

Although excellent alfalfa was produced this year, a few growers suffered severe damage and loss from flooding.

The wet year had a positive effect on honey production which was essentially tripled over last year.

Land in active production is gradually increasing as Inyo/Mono growers continue to advance in the search for alternative crops and improved growing techniques.

This report would not be possible without the willing help of Inyo/Mono farmers and the University of California Cooperative Extension Farm Advisor's Office for Inyo and Mono Counties.

A special word of thanks to George Milovich and Pam Heslington for their cheerful efforts.

I am pleased to submit the 1983 Crop Report for Inyo and Mono Counties in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

The gross returns for 1983 were a combined total for the two counties of \$19,127,908, which is an increase of 0.7 percent from last year. The values shown within are gross figures only and do not reflect net income or loss.

The five year comparison summary shows agricultural production values for the two counties to be a stable economic factor.

Two new crops to the area, potatoes and virus free seed garlic, are becoming established and will substantially increase production values.





The 1988 agricultural product values for the Inyo and Mono Counties combined totaled \$23.3 million. This represents a substantial and healthy facet of our high country economy.

Alfalfa showed the largest increase this year with slightly higher yields and increased prices received.

Beef, for the second year in a row, has shown higher values than previous years.

Apiary production was down this year, primarily because of the dry summer.

Timber sales were down because of the cessation of Louisiana-Pacific Lumber Company in our area.

This report would not be possible without the willing help of Inyo/Mono farmers and the University of California Cooperative Extension Farm Advisor's office.

Special thanks are in order to Deputy Director George Milovich and secretary Robin Conklin for a job well done.

I am pleased to submit the 1989 Crop Report for Inyo and Mono Counties in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

Beef production was reduced in the Counties during 1989 due to a 4th year of lessening forage due to low precipitation. Despite higher prices, this wasn't enough to compensate for lower herd numbers. Many federal grazing allotments went unused for lack of forage.

Alfalfa also showed an increase in price, but again lower water availability reduced the yield while Mono County was also negatively affected by a flood in Hammil Valley.

Honey production was affected by the drought also, due to lower valley moisture with its loss of wild flower production in the southern desert parts of Inyo County.

Nursery production is a new category included within the report.

Other crops were stable and over all prices for agriculture commodities were up.

The 1989 agricultural product values for the Inyo and Mono Counties combined totaled \$24,283,262.

This report is a cooperative effort of Inyo/Mono ranchers and farmers and this office. Many thanks to Deputy Director George Milovich and Office Manager Robin Conklin for a job well done.
