It is my pleasure to present the 2000 Agriculture Crop and Livestock Report. This report compiles crop production and estimated values of agricultural commodities grown in Inyo and Mono Counties.

The combined counties' total of agriculture production for 2000 totaled \$35,635,020, which represents an 8% increase from 1999.

Beef production was good with values continuing to maintain a strong market.

Both field and row crops had good seasons with production above average.

This report is submitted in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, which emphasizes that the figures represented are gross agricultural values only.

It is my pleasure to present the 2001 Agricultural Crop and Livestock Report. This report is a compilation of crop production and estimated values of agricultural commodities grown in Inyo and Mono Counties.

The combined Counties' agricultural production for 2001 totaled \$38,743,688 which represents 8% increase from 2000.

This has been an interesting year for agriculture in California. In many parts of the state severe challenges occurred. However, we, in the Eastern Sierra, were able not only to maintain, but actually increase our values.

Alfalfa went up both in production and value this year, primarily due to good weather, lower acreages being planted with other crops, and the demand for our high elevation/high protein hay.

Beef production was again good and the market value was maintained with beef demand going up in all sectors.

Our row crops kept their share of production in both Counties, with modest decreases in value.

Agriculture continues to be a very vibrant industry that is an integral part of the overall health of Inyo and Mono Counties' economy. Values displayed are only part of the true contribution agriculture has on our relative economic base and spectacular scenery of the Eastern Sierra.

Values represented here are gross agricultural values only and are submitted in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

My appreciation goes to the growers and agencies that provide data and to Robin Conklin for her vigilance throughout the process.

It is again my pleasure to present the 2002 Agricultural Crop and Livestock Report. This report is a compilation of crop production and estimated values of agricultural commodities grown in Inyo and Mono Counties.

The combined Counties' agricultural production for 2002 totaled \$36,132,972 which represents a 7% decrease from 2001.

The cattle industry was greatly impacted in 2002 due to drought conditions affecting the amount of summer range. Numbers were down as well as having lower prices overall.

Field crops were consistent with previous years. Yields were also effected by drought conditions that prevailed throughout the Eastern Sierra region.

Row crops stayed constant with some decrease in values as well.

Agriculture continues to be a solid industry that is an integral part of Inyo and Mono Counties' economy. Values displayed are only part of the true contribution agriculture has on our relative economic base, our spectacular scenery and the overall quality of life in the Eastern Sierra.

Values represented here are gross agricultural values only and are submitted in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

## COUNTY OF MONO 2004 AGRICULTURAL VALUES






