3. The 2011 JAAE Outstanding Journal Article Award

The 2011 award covers articles in the November 2010, February 2011, and May 2011 issues. The process involved rankings by the Editorial Council. In the first stage, five or six Council members were randomly assigned to each volume with instructions to select the best three articles. These responses were then collated to identify the top four picks. In the second stage, all 17 Council members were asked to rank the top four picks. Based on this process, the winner is:

4. Editorial Team

Editors Marchant and Bosch share responsibility for all submissions for the February, May, and November issues with each handling approximately half of the submissions. Selection of an editor for a particular submission depends upon the subject area and each of the editor's schedules. Associate Editor Michael Wetzstein oversees the August Proceedings issue.

5. Sheridan Press

The Volume 41, April 2009 issue was the first to be published by the Sheridan Press. The

contract with The Sheridan Press has been extended to cover 2012–2014 (issues 44–46). Thanks are extended to Lisa Small, Susan Rudolph, and The Sheridan Press for their excellent services. The team of copyeditors, proofreaders, and production managers are very efficient in dealing with galley proofs and handling of the publication. Thanks to the team for publishing all 2011 issues on time.

The Sheridan Press provides the editors with PDF versions of the articles published in the issues. Editors send a copy of the articles to authors and also place the volume and each issue on the *AgEcon Search* website. Beginning in 2010, the Southern Agricultural Economics Association (SAEA) and Sheridan Press increased the number of issues per year by publishing four issues in each volume: February, May, August (Proceedings Issue), and November.

The February 2012 issue, Vol. 44(1), is in the process of being published and loaded on the *AgEcon Search* website. The May 2012 issue is almost ready to go to The Sheridan Press for copyediting. The August issue is solely devoted to invited papers and other proceedings material from the SAEA annual meetings. This issue will not contain any regular peer reviewed articles, but the manuscripts are reviewed by members of the Editorial Council. It is expected that the August 2012 issue will have fifteen invited papers published as articles.

6. Institute for Scientific Information Application

In November 2010, the previous Journal of Agricultural and Applied Economics (JAAE) editorial team of Ashok Mishra and Jeffrey Gillespie re-applied to Thomson Reuters—the former Institute for Scientific Information (ISI)—to have the JAAE covered by the Web of Science. Coverage would mean articles published in the JAAE would be included in the Social Science Citation Index, an important factor for some authors in deciding where to submit their work. The application process is completed when three on-time current and forthcoming issues have been submitted. The ISI office in Philadelphia will inform us about the success of the application some time after the application is complete. (See the appendix for our letter accompanying the November 2011 issue, highlighting the many accomplishments of the *JAAE* in meeting ISI criteria.)

7. Reviewers

Two-hundred and thirty-seven reviewers provided reviews to the journal in 2011. They were selected on the basis of their expertise in the subject matter, but also their willingness to provide constructive comment in a timely fashion. Their names are listed in the appendix to this report.

Dear Thomson Reuters representative:

This letter and the accompanying November 2011 issue of the *Journal of Agricultural and Applied Economics (JAAE)* provides follow-up to our application for journal selection, initiated one year ago with the November 2010 issue. The *JAAE* is a peer-reviewed journal published four times a year (February, May, August-Proceedings Issue, and November). Please note timeliness of all four issues over this past year, even with changes in editors.

Additionally, I am grateful for the feedback provided by Nancy Thornton last August, verifying receipt of prior *JAAE* issues. Inclusion in the Thomson Reuters system means a great deal to us. To assist you in your evaluation, please let me take this opportunity to point out key attributes of the *JAAE*.

Our journal is associated with the Southern Agricultural Economics Association (SAEA), one of the largest associations of agricultural and applied economists in the world with over 500 individual U.S. members and a total mailout for this November issue totaling nearly 700 copies (see below). Both the SAEA and its journal have been in existence for over 40 years (formerly the *Southern Journal of Agricultural Economics*.) Our journal has evolved over time and improved in quality to advance research in our agricultural and applied economics discipline. We believe these attributes also fit your criteria for evaluation.

Basic Journal Standards and Timeliness—As stated in former co-editor Ashok Mishra's November 22, 2010 letter of application, "Our record on this score has been spotless for nine years running." And this trend continued throughout 2011. Additionally in 2010, the JAAE expanded from three to four issues per year, with our August issue devoted solely to the proceedings of our annual SAEA meeting. Throughout this transition, we maintained timeliness and quality. For other basic journal standards, we follow international editorial conventions, e.g., using informative and descriptive journal titles and abstracts, key words and JEL classification.

Additionally, we were one of the first agricultural economics journals to use an electronic review system, adopting the Editorial Express under former *JAAE* editor Henry Kinnucan in 2006--http://editorialexpress.com/e-editor/ And finally, we provide immediate open access to our journal through AgEcon Search, a leading on-line database within our profession: http://ageconsearch.umn.edu/ For *JAAE* issues spanning our application for journal selection, the November 2010–August 2011 issues received over 4,000 hits on AgEcon Search.

In regards to peer review, please note that all *JAAE* issues are peer reviewed. Although our regular issues follow a more stringent peer review process, our proceeding issues use our editorial council as reviewers for invited papers presented at our annual SAEA meeting.

Content--The JAAE content covers leading national and international issues: food production and security, food safety, biofuels, climate change, international trade, resources and the environment, to name a few upon spanning article titles over this past year. These relevant topics advance research in our profession and meet the needs of a changing world.

Diversity—Our editorial council includes four esteemed international economists, as well as three fellows in our discipline, where less than ½ of one percent of our membership become fellows. And in regards to gender diversity, four members of the editorial council and one editor are female. For international diversity among authors, many of our authors are international and also please see the February 2011 issue, where three of ten articles were written by individuals located at institutions outside of the United States. Other examples of international diversity include 47 international SAEA members and 23 international libraries added to the U.S. membership—524 U.S. individual and 94 U.S. libraries.
