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Eiler C. Ravnholt is currently Chairman of the American Alliance, an organization representing America's sugar and corn growers, the processors

of sugarcane and sugarbeets and most of the corn sweetener processors, their workers and suppliers. He is also Vice President of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Association. Educated at the University of Minnesota and the University of Southampton, England, Mr. Ravnholt formerly served as Assistant to Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey and as Administrative Assistant to Senator Daniel K. Inouye of Hawaii prior to joining the Hawaiian sugar industry in 1980 as its Washington spokesman.
