

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
... About the authors



Vernon W. Ruttan is a Regents Professor at the University of Minnesota. He is known world wide for his research in the fields of agricultural development, resource economics and research policy. Ruttan is a member of the National Academy of Sciences. His many award include the Alexander von Humboldt Award for his outstanding contribution to American agriculture. His most recent book, Aid and Development with Anne O. Krueger and Constantine Michalopoulos) is being published by the Johns Hopkins University Press.



Ron Sandrey recently joined the New Zealand Ministry of External Relations and Trade as a senior economist. Previously he worked with the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries. While with that Ministry Dr. Sandrey was responsible for writing parts of and coordinating the preparation of the book Farming Without Subsidies. Dr. Sandrey, a graduate of Oregon State University, has been employed by both Lincoln University as a lecturer and the New Zealand Treasury as a senior analyst. These experiences, as well as his earlier career as a sheep farmer, gives him a very broad perspective about the impact of agricultural policies in New Zealand.



Anya M. McGuirk is an Assistant Professor of Agricultural Economics and Statistics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University where her specialties are applied econometrics and microeconomics. She received her M.Sc. in Agricultural Economics from the University of Reading (England) where she studied as a Marshall Scholar. In 1988 she obtained her Ph.D.from Cornell university, and subsequently received the AAEA Outstanding Ph.D. Dissertation Award. Dr. McGuirk grew up on a 500 acre livestock and crop farm in Bel Air, Maryland with her 14 siblings.



Barry Krissoff is a Section Leader of the Macropolicy Section, Developing Economics Branch at the Economic Research Service. At ERS his research has focused on the effects of international trade and trade policy on developing market economies, particularly Latin American countries. Currently, Krissoff is investigating potential effects of a free trade area between the United States and Mexico. Prior to coming to ERS in 1985, he was as assistant professor at Western Michigan University and an economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York. Krissoff's Ph.D. is from the University of Virginia in economics.



Harry M. Kaiser is an Assistant Professor of Agricultural Economics at Cornell University. He received a PhD. from he University of Minnesota in 1985 and since then has worked extensively in analyzing federal dairy policies. Kaiser also teaches a course in linear programming and works with dairy industry leaders in dairy policy matters. In 1986, he was a recipient of the American Agricultural Economics Association Group Extension Award. More recently, Kaiser has become involved on global climate change and its implications for agriculture.



Daniel Pick is an Agricultural Economist in the Macropolicy Section, Developing Economies Branch at the Economic Research Service. He completed his undergraduate work at the University of Arizona and received his Ph.D. from the University of California, Davis. There he majored in agricultural economics and completed a thesis focused on the relationships between macroeconomic variables and the international sovbean markets. Pick's research interests include international trade and related policy implications. He is presently examining the effects of misalignments of exchange rates on agricultural exports of developing countries.
