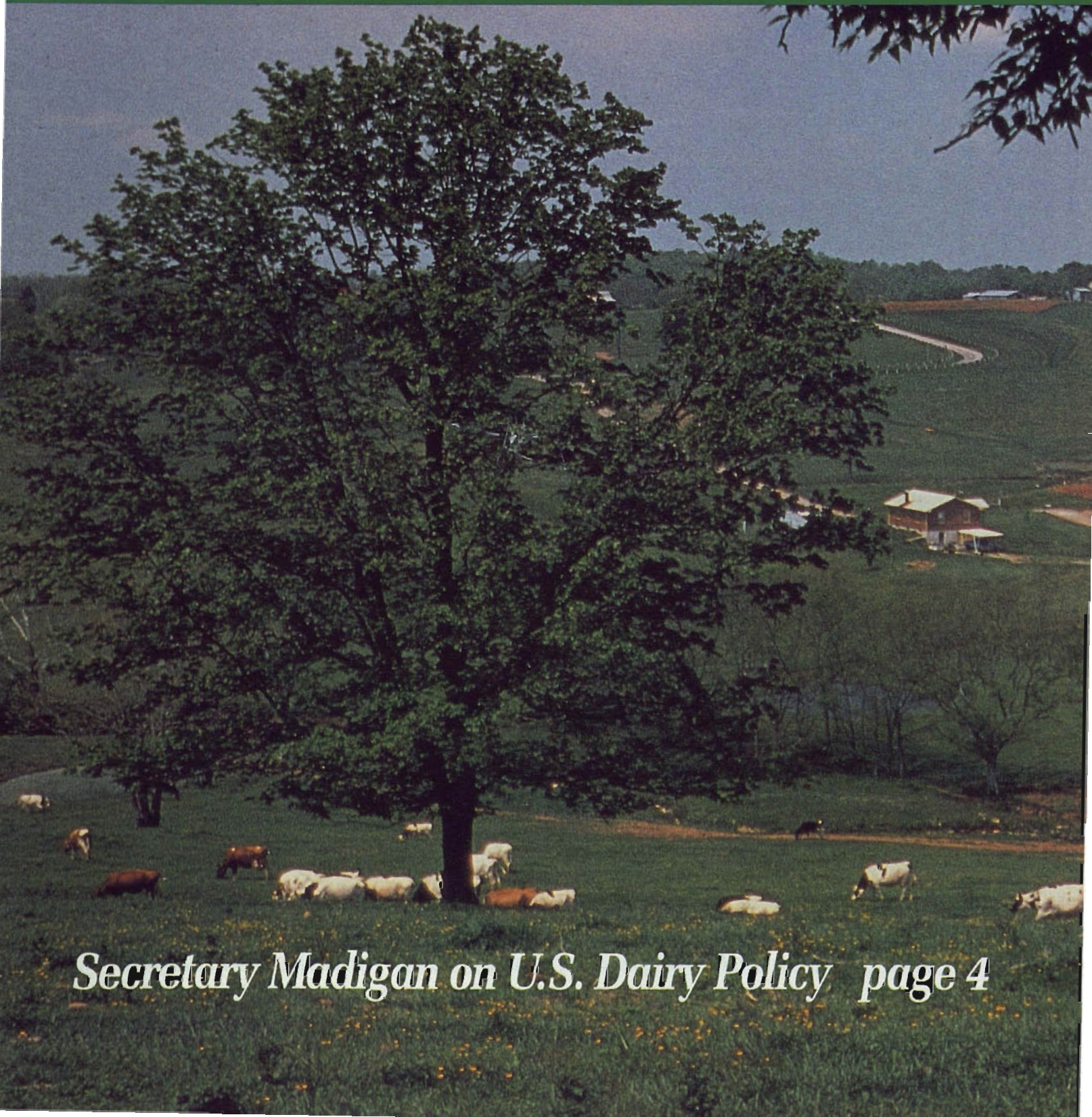

...About the authors



**George R. McDowell** is Professor of Agricultural Economics and Extension Economist at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. His major areas of scholarship are in institutional economics applied to rural development both in the United States and abroad. McDowell is also

known as a thoughtful critic of dysfunction within the Land-Grant university (*CHOICES* 1988, Second Quarter). After a first career in international development including service as a Peace Corps administrator, McDowell completed his PhD at Michigan State in 1975. He spent most of his academic career at the University of Massachusetts and moved to Virginia Tech in 1987, spending his first couple of years with VPI on an assignment in Zambia.



**Dezso Kovacs** is a researcher with the Hungarian Academy of Science, Center for Regional Studies in Pecs, Hungary. A 1975 graduate of Godollo University Faculty of Agriculture, he completed his PhD in the Faculty of Economics of Janus Pannonius University, Pecs, in March 1991. Dr. Kovacs major

interests are agricultural policy, the role of leadership in agricultural organizations, and agricultural and rural development. In 1978-79, as manager of the Russian section of the foreign trade office of Babolna State farm, he exported day-old chicks to the Soviet Union. From 1986 to 1989, as Deputy Secretary of the Baranya County Association of Agricultural Cooperatives, he represented the legal, political and social interests of some 85 cooperative farms in that county. Dr. Kovacs is a visiting scholar at West Virginia University during the 1991-92 academic year.



**Roger A. Morse** is Professor of Apiculture in the Department of Entomology at Cornell University. He is known throughout the world for his knowledge about bees and bee-keeping. His many trips abroad have taken him to 50 countries. Professor Morse has authored hundreds of research

and extension papers and books. Since 1959, he has been Research Editor of *Gleanings in Bee Culture*, the world's most widely distributed trade journal, and, over the past 25 years he has prepared a monthly column for it. In 1989 he was President of the Eastern Branch of the Entomological Society of America. Professor Morse's research has emphasized reproduction and social order in honey bees. He has written and edited many books including *ABC and XYZ of Bee Culture*.



**Arloc Sherman** is Program Associate in the Family Supports Division of the Children's Defense Fund in Washington, DC. He is a co-author of the recent CDF report, *Child Poverty in America*, and has written extensively on poverty, education, welfare reform, and employment. Sherman is presently

at work on a book about child poverty in rural America. Prior to being associated with the Children's Defense Fund, he worked at the Center for Law and Social Policy, where he specialized in providing guidance to states on implementing the education provisions of the Family Support Act of 1988, and at the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, both in Washington, DC. Sherman graduated with honors from Yale College in 1987.



**M. Ann Tutwiler** is Associate Director and Co-Founder of the International Policy Council on Agriculture and Trade, comprised of thirty eminent policy-makers, business and farm leaders, and academics from around the world whose mission is to promote freer trade and agricultural policy reform.

Last year, she directed the first conference to bring agricultural ministers, business and farm leaders from Eastern and Central Europe and the USSR together with their counterparts from the West to discuss options for agricultural policy reform. Prior to joining the Council, she was a Policy Associate at the National Center for Food and Agricultural Policy and a Policy Analyst with the Economic Research Service at USDA. Ms. Tutwiler holds a Masters in Public Policy from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.



**Chung L. Huang** is a Professor in the Department of Agricultural Economics at the Georgia Experiment Station, University of Georgia. He was born in Taiwan and earned his BA degree in economics from Tunghai University. He received his PhD degree in agricultural economics from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University in 1976.

Much of his research is focused on the economics of food demand and consumption behavior. Huang co-edited the book *Food Demand Analysis: Problems, Issues and Empirical Evidence* (Iowa State University Press) with colleagues of a southern regional research committee S-119. He has established a statewide consumer panel in Georgia and is currently conducting research on topics related to consumer perceptions and attitudes toward food quality and safety.
