Readings in Futures Markets Volume I: Selected Writings of Holbrook Working Volume II: Selected Readings in Futures Markets Anne E. Peck. Editor

The readings collected in these two volumes bring together past research of several scholars on the economic functions of futures markets for primary agricultural commodities.

The first volume is composed of a selection of Holbrook Working's writings on futures markets. Included are his contributions to an understanding of intertemporal price relationships on these markets, the behavior of the various market participants, and the characteristics of futures price movements. The second volume surveys the contributions of a number of authors in this field. Included here are extensions of the intertemporal price theory, investigations of the stochastic nature of future prices, measurements of returns to the market participants, and evidence on the long-run effects of futures trading on price stability.

Together, the readings in these two volumes provide scholars with the results of previous research in this field, research which forms the basis of our understanding of futures markets and their role in commodity marketing and pricing.
