**EMERSON M. BROOKS** worked in three field offices of Agricultural Estimates before coming to Washington. He has had a part in planning and putting through the enumerative surveys made by BAE since 1942 and he supervised the first interview survey of farmers made by the Military Government in the U. S. Zone of Occupation in Germany.

**DONALD E. CHURCH** is in charge of transportation research in the Marketing and Transportation Research Division. Before joining the Bureau, he was engaged in transportation research for other governmental agencies, business research for private industry, and teaching.

**WALTER A. HENDRICKS**, after 22 years in experimental statistics and sampling and estimating methods, is now research methodologist in Agricultural Estimates. He headed the BAE research office cooperating with the University of North Carolina, taught courses in sampling, least square theory, and biological statistics and, with Paul Koenig, in Germany, helped to organize and analyze crop surveys for estimating 1948 crop production.

**NEIL W. JOHNSON**, while assistant head of the Division of Farm Management and Costs, has been engaged in agricultural production adjustment and related studies. He is now Special Assistant to the Administrator of the Agricultural Research Administration to head up the work in the Department's new Central Project Office.

**CHARLES F. SARLE** spent 3 months in Japan evaluating the accuracy and timeliness of crop estimates and the efficiency of methods used by the new Japanese Crop Reporting Service. He is Head of the Division of Special Farm Statistics in Agricultural Estimates.

**EDMUND DE S. BRUNNER** is Professor of Rural Sociology at Teachers College, Columbia University. He pioneered in rural social research and has made outstanding contributions on the agricultural village and rural social trends. His most widely used book is the text *A Study of Rural Society*.

**DONALD C. HORTON** returned last year to full-time duty as head of mortgage research in the Division of Agricultural Finance after 2 years on a cooperative project with the National Bureau of Economic Research, Inc. From time to time he gives courses at American University in money and banking, international economics, and economic theory.

**M. L. WILSON** is the widely known Director of the Extension Service.

**KENNETH L. BACHMAN** is leader of the farm classification and analysis work in the Division of Farm Management and Costs. Previous to his year of advanced study at Harvard, his research had been mainly on Southern agriculture.
