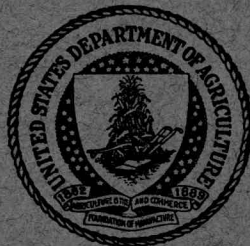

ORLIN J. SCOVILLE has served agriculture in both operating and research agencies in many parts of the country, publishing from time to time. He was one of the authors of *Managing a Farm*, prepared for the U. S. Armed Forces Institute and later revised and published as a farm-management text for general distribution.

W. L. GIBSON, JR., Professor of Land Economics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute, in Blacksburg, also conducts a graduate seminar in research methods and heads the land economics research at the Virginia Agricultural Experiment Station. FRANK D. HANSING, in the Navy for 3 years, returned to the University of Illinois for graduate study, and is now an agricultural economist with the Virginia experiment station and BAE.

ROBERT S. OVERTON has had a major part in the livestock statistical work in the Iowa field office of Agricultural Estimates since the late 1930's.
