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
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Who Owns the Land?

WHO OWNS THE LAND?

About 40 percent of the U.S. land area of 2.3 billion acres is owned by government -- Federal, State, and local, leaving 60 percent in private hands. Half of that privately owned land is owned by only 1 percent of the landowners. Over 80 percent is held by individuals or families. Ownership of farm and ranch land is less concentrated with 1 percent of owners holding about 30 percent of the land. Most owners are white, between the ages of 50 to 64, and are males. About 30 percent of the privately held land has been acquired since 1970. Few owners are foreigners.

PRELIMINARY SURVEY FINDINGS

These are among the preliminary results of a recent USDA survey of the ownership of privately held land. More than 37,000 individuals, partnerships, and corporations were surveyed in 1978 by the Economics, Statistics, and Cooperatives Service in an effort to find out more about 28.8 million owners of 1.25 billion acres of privately held U.S. land. The survey covered private farm and ranch land, other rural land, and urban land. As part of the survey, information was obtained about an estimated 6.2 million owners of 871 million acres of land in farms and ranches. In addition to privately held land, the Federal Government holds 762 million acres, State and local governments own another 136 million acres, and 51 million acres are held by, or are in trust for, American Indians.

WHY THE SURVEY?

The land and how its various owners use or abuse it is vitally important to the American public and decisionmakers in government. ESCS will closely analyze the

data from the new survey to help the public better understand how decisions made by landowners affect the environment, food and fiber supplies, employment, distribution of wealth and income, resource development, and the competition for land and water resources. One important use of the coming analysis will be to help design government programs which affect land use, such as conservation, farm production, supply management, credit, and technical assistance programs. The ownership data can be correlated with soils and land use data, thereby providing information about ownership patterns on prime agricultural lands.

SEE TABLES AND CHARTS

Tables and charts accompanying this report give more detail and highlight data relationships on occupation of owners, type of owners, their race, age, sex, education, and residence, and how and when they acquired the land.

OCCUPATION

Farmers and farm managers are the largest single group of owners. They own almost half of all private noncorporate holdings and over half of land in farms and ranches (tables 1 and 3 and fig. 1). Retired people hold about 17 percent of all land and the same proportion of farm and ranch land. White collar occupations hold 14-15 percent and blue collar occupations 8-9 percent of all land as well as farm and ranch land. Farmers showed their highest proportion of ownership of both all land and land in farms in the Mountain States and Northern Plains. (See page 21 for list of States in each region.) However, they were the dominant landowning group in all regions (tables 2 and 4). White collar occupations hold about 20 percent of farmland in the Northeast, Appalachian, Southeast, and Southern Plains and less than 10 percent in the Lake, Northern Plains, and Mountain Regions.

TYPE OF OWNER

Sole proprietors and husbands and wives hold two-thirds of all privately held land (table 5 and fig. 2) and almost three-fourths of land in farms and ranches (table 7). Non-family corporations hold about 9.5 percent of all private land but only 2.4 percent of farm and ranch land. In the Pacific Region, nonfamily corporations own 23 percent of all land and 5 percent of farm and ranch land and in the Southeast 20 percent of all land and 4 percent of farm and ranch land, reflecting large timber holdings as well as larger scale farms and ranches in those regions (tables 6 and 8).

SIZE OF HOLDINGS

One percent of the ownership units (a unit could be an individual, a partnership, or a corporation) own about half of all the privately held land. Looking from the opposite direction, about 75 percent of the owners hold only about 3 percent of the land (table 9). However, many of these are owners of residential and commercial properties on small lots. Among owners of farm and ranch land, holdings are more evenly distributed. The percentage of acreage held

by the 1 percent largest owners of farm and ranch land is 29 percent nationwide and varies regionally from 8 percent in the Lake States to 41 percent in the Pacific Region (tables 11 and 12). Concentration is less pronounced in regions where crop farming predominates than where ranching or forestry is prevalent.

RACE

Over 90 percent of the private landowners are white and non-Hispanic; they own 97 percent of the land (table 13). Blacks, representing 4 percent of the owners, own just 1 percent of the private land. Percentage of acreage owned by non-Hispanic whites dips to about 95 percent in the Southeast and Delta where blacks hold 4-5 percent of the land and to 96 percent in the Southern Plains, Mountain, and Pacific Regions where Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians have somewhat larger holdings than in other parts of the country (table 14).

AGE

Almost 70 percent of the land is held by people over 50 years of age. Those under 35 own only about 6 percent (table 15 and fig. 3). In the Southeast, 41 percent of land is owned by the 50-65 age group and 33 percent by those over 65. The Lake States show the youngest pattern of ownership with about 40 percent of the land held by those under 50 (table 16).

SEX

Over 80 percent of the survey respondents were identified as males; however, this statistic does not fully recognize female ownership participation through husband-wife holdings and family partnerships (table 17). About a third of the private land is held by husbands and wives jointly (see table 5). The female share ranges from less than 10 percent in the Mountain and Lake regions to 20 percent in the Delta (table 18).

HOW ACQUIRED

Only about 18 percent of the private land was inherited, while 60 percent was purchased from nonrelatives; 16 percent was purchased from relatives (table 19 and fig. 4). Acquisition from relatives is most prevalent in the Northern Plains where over 40 percent of the land was either inherited or purchased from a relative. That proportion in the Pacific Region is only 23 percent. Conversely, purchase from nonrelatives ranges from 51 percent in the Northern Plains to 69 percent in the Pacific Region (table 20).

WHEN ACQUIRED

Almost 30 percent of the private land has been acquired since 1970 while about 15 percent has been in the same hands since the 1930's or before (table 21 and fig. 5). Although there are slight differences among regions, these proportions are similar over the Nation (table 22).


RESIDENCE

Over 90 percent of the owners (who hold 80 percent of the land) reside in the same county with their reported holdings. Only about one-tenth of 1 percent of the owners have residence or corporate headquarters in a foreign country (table 23 and fig. 6). The Southern Plains has the smallest proportion of land held by those residing in the same county while the Lake States have the largest proportion. Owners of 25 percent of the Southern Plains land reside in another county of the same State and owners of 10 percent of Mountain States land reside in another State (table 24).

EDUCATION

Level of formal education does not appear to be a major factor in landownership. The proportion of acres held by owners with 8 or fewer years of schooling is almost identical to that held by college graduates (table 25 and fig. 7). The proportion held by owners with 8 or fewer years of schooling ranges from 10 percent in the Pacific Region to 30 percent in Appalachia (table 26). The proportion owned by college graduates ranges from 11 percent in the Lake States to 28 percent in the Pacific Region.

Type of Owner













Method of Acquisition of Land

Residence of Landowner




