- ALVIN T. M. LEE, Chief of the Section on Prices and Values, Agriculture Division, Bureau of the Census, is in charge of the work on classification of farms by type and economic class. He was formerly with the Division of Land Economics in BAE.
- KENNETH L. BACHMAN, Head of the Section on Farm Classification and Analysis in the Division of Farm Management and Costs, has represented BAE in cooperative work with the Bureau of the Census relating to the development of economic classification of farms and analysis of the data.
- EARL O. HEADY is professor of agricultural economics at Iowa State College. He is a frequent contributor to the economic journals that are concerned with research methodology in agricultural production economics.
- ROSS V. BAUMANN, agricultural economist in the Division of Farm Management and Costs, is stationed at Iowa State College, where he cooperates with the Station staff in conducting studies of the economics of soil conservation adjustments and the utilization of grass and legume crops in livestock production.
