



PREFACE

This is one in a group of statistical studies on world agricultural trade, prepared as a part of the research project, "Analysis of Demand Prospects for Agricultural Products of the Less Developed Countries," being conducted by the Economic Research Service under a participating agency service agreement for the Agency for International Development.

These volumes present 1951-65 data on trade flows of selected agricultural commodities for 19 importing or exporting regions, showing regions of origin of imports and destination of exports. These data, not available in this form from other sources, are presented in tabular matrix form so that the volume of trade--exports and imports--among the 19 regions can readily be discerned. These statistical series include commodities which account for 80 percent of the agricultural exports and 33 percent of all exports of less developed countries and are believed to be the most comprehensive series available. These series should fill a part of the information gap in international trade and make possible a more comprehensive analysis of changes in the patterns of trade in agricultural products. Although there is some repetition of world trade information in these studies, it is necessary because not all readers will want the entire group or series.

This volume on textile fibers--cotton, jute, and other fibers--is based on data from many different sources. It has been necessary to make estimates of trade flows based upon value data for some countries because of incomplete reporting. World exports of each commodity in any one year equal world imports.

This volume also includes tables for 1964 showing total world trade and total agricultural trade for 19 importing regions and regions of origin of imports. Conversely, they show trade flows for 19 exporting regions and destination of their exports. These data on agricultural trade are in a form not available from other sources. They provide a basis for observing the importance of textile fiber crops in total trade and in agricultural trade by countries and regions.

The research project on the demand prospects for agricultural exports of less developed countries is being conducted by ERS in three phases: (1) historical analysis of trade flows, (2) analysis of demand prospects, and (3) analysis of policy implications of estimated world demand prospects, under the joint supervision of an ERS Technical Advisory Committee by Arthur B. Mackie and Anthony S. Rojko. Special acknowledgments are given to Jay Kaplan, Richard Gilmore and Fred Alkire for their work in compiling the trade data on cotton and other fibers, respectively. Martin E. Abel, Deputy Assistant Secretary, International Affairs, was Chairman of this committee at the start of the project.

SUMMARY

World trade in textile fibers--cotton, jute, and other vegetable fibers--was valued at almost \$2.87 billion, or about 7 percent of world agricultural trade in 1964. The largest of these export crops was cotton, representing about \$2.4 billion, or 6 percent of world agricultural trade in 1964. The value of the "other fiber" group--flax, hemp, ramie, sisal, and manila fibers--the second largest group, was \$320 million; that of jute exports was valued at \$147 million.

The volume of world trade in textile fibers increased during 1951-65 at an average annual rate of 2.6 percent. Exports of other vegetable fibers led--growing at 3.9 percent, while cotton increased 3.1 percent per year. World trade in jute actually declined 0.2 percent per year during the period.

Many less developed countries depend heavily upon agricultural exports for exchange earnings to finance imports of capital goods needed for economic development. In 1965, there were 16 countries that depended upon exports of fiber crops for more than 20 percent of their export earnings. Three countries depended upon fibers for more than 50 percent of their export earnings. There were 11 countries that relied upon coffee, cocoa, or tea, eight countries upon sugar, seven countries upon oilseeds and vegetable oils, two countries upon cereals, and two countries upon fruits and vegetables for more than 50 percent of their export earnings in 1965.

The United States, EEC, Latin America, North Africa, East Africa, South Asia, and West Asia accounted for 83 percent of world exports of textile fibers. The United States alone accounted for 20 percent of world fiber exports; Latin America and South Asia each accounted for 18 percent; European Economic Community (EEC), North Africa, East Africa each accounted for 7 percent; while West Asia accounted for 6 percent of world fiber exports in 1964.

The major importers of textile fibers are Japan, European Economic Community (EEC), European Free Trade Association (EFTA), and Eastern Europe. These four major importers accounted for 72 percent of world fiber imports in 1964. Western Europe (EEC and EFTA) is by far the most important import market for textile fibers--accounting for 46 percent of world imports of textile fibers in 1964. Japan, the second largest import market, accounted for 14 percent; while Eastern Europe accounted for 12 percent of world imports of textile fibers. Western Europe (EEC and EFTA) alone accounted for 37 percent of world cotton imports, 48 percent of jute imports, and 71 percent of imports of other vegetable fibers. Japan accounted for 18 percent of world cotton imports, 8 percent of world jute imports, and 5 percent of world imports of all other vegetable fibers in 1964.

INTRODUCTION

Many less developed countries depend heavily upon agricultural exports for exchange earnings to finance imports of capital goods. For example, according to the 1966 FAO Trade Yearbook (3) 1/ there were 66 less developed countries and territories in 1965 with agricultural exports accounting for more than 50 percent of total export earnings. Because of this heavy dependence upon agricultural exports, fluctuations of export prices for agricultural commodities cause large variations in export earnings and on total economic growth. These variations are especially large in the case of countries depending upon export earnings from only one or two commodities.

In 1965, 16 countries depended upon fiber exports for more than 20 percent of their export earnings (table 1). Three countries depended upon fibers for more than 50 percent of total export earnings. There were 11 countries in which coffee, cocoa, or tea accounted for more than 50 percent of export earnings. Eight countries depended upon sugar, seven countries upon oilseeds and vegetable oils, two countries upon cereals, and two countries upon fruits and vegetables for more than 50 percent of their export earnings.

The less developed countries need better information on demand prospects for agricultural exports as a basis for planning and carrying out economic development programs. Future growth in the export demand for agricultural commodities of the less developed countries will influence the amount of land and other resources that can economically be used for expanding the production of export commodities.

This report presents detailed trade data that can be used for evaluating trade prospects for fiber crops. It contains historical data on the volume of exports and imports of these commodities for 19 regions for 1951-65. Trends in the growth of trade in these commodities by major countries and regions are compared with trends in population and per capita income growth for 1951-65. Data on value of exports and imports of these commodities by regions are not

now available in matrix form. However, world export unit values for selected fiber crops are shown in table 2 for prewar and 1948-66. Value trade matrices can be obtained by multiplying these unit prices by the quantities in the following tables. However, such values will not necessarily equal the import or export values as reported by the United Nations since the unit prices will differ somewhat by countries.

WORLD PATTERNS OF AGRICULTURAL TRADE

The volume of world agricultural exports increased about 3.5 percent per year from the average of 1948-52 to 1964-65. In real terms, the value of agricultural exports grew at an annual rate of 2 percent during this period (4).

Trade in agricultural products in 1964 was about one-fourth the value of total world trade (tables 3 and 4). In 1964, the value of world agricultural trade amounted to \$38.6 billion. As a group, the less developed countries accounted for 37 percent of world agricultural exports and 16 percent of world agricultural imports (table 5). The value of agricultural exports of the less developed countries in 1964 was \$14,468 million, whereas their agricultural imports were only \$6,186 million. The developed countries were the major markets for the agricultural exports of less developed countries--accounting for 78 percent. The United States alone took 21 percent of the agricultural exports of less developed countries. Agricultural exports of the less developed countries to each other accounted for 14 percent.

As with agricultural exports, the developed countries accounted for the major share (61 percent) of the agricultural imports of the less developed countries. The less developed countries turned to other less developed countries for 32 percent of their agricultural import needs, or slightly less than the 36 percent from the United States (table 5). The remaining 7 percent of agricultural imports of the less developed countries come from the Communist Bloc.

IMPORTANCE OF FIBER CROPS IN WORLD TRADE

The total value of world fiber exports, as reported by the 1966 FAO Trade Yearbook, was \$2.87 billion, or about 7 percent of the value of world agricultural trade in 1964. Cotton was by far the largest of the fiber export crops--representing about \$2.4 billion or about 6 percent of world agricultural trade in 1964. The value of other vegetable fibers (flax, hemp, ramie, sisal, and manila fibers)--the second largest group of fiber export crops--was \$320 million. The value of jute--the third largest fiber export crop--was \$147 million. ^{2/}

Regionally, fiber exports are of major importance to the United States, the EEC, Latin America, North Africa, East Africa, South Asia and West Asia. These seven regions accounted for 83 percent of world exports of textile fibers. The United States alone accounted for 20 percent of world fiber exports. Latin America accounted for 18 percent, South Asia for 18 percent, the EEC, North Africa, and East Africa each for 7 percent, and West Asia for 6 percent of world exports of textile fibers.

In terms of the three major fiber crops--cotton, jute, and other vegetable fibers (flax, hemp, ramie, sisal, and manila fibers) the United States in 1964 accounted for 31 percent of world cotton exports and less than 1 percent of the world exports of jute and other vegetable fibers. These exports were only about

3 percent of total export earnings of the United States in 1964. EEC exports of textile fibers were of even less importance than in the United States--representing less than 0.5 percent of total export earnings in 1964.

In the major exporting but less developed regions--Latin America, North Africa, East Africa, South Asia, and West Asia--textile fiber exports represented a larger share of total export earnings than in the developed exporting countries. They represented 4 percent of total export earnings in Latin America, 12 percent in North Africa, 9 percent in South Asia, 4 percent in West Asia, and 10 percent in East Africa.

The major importing regions of textile fibers are Japan, the EEC, EFTA, and Eastern Europe. These four major importing regions accounted for 72 percent of world textile fiber imports in 1964. Western Europe (EEC and EFTA) is by far the most important import market for textile fibers--accounting for 46 percent of world imports of textile fibers in 1964. Japan, the second largest import market, accounted for 14 percent; while the third largest market, Eastern Europe, accounted for 12 percent of the world imports of textile fibers in 1964. Western Europe (EEC and EFTA) alone accounted for 37 percent of world cotton, 49 percent of world jute imports, and 71 percent of world imports of other vegetable fibers. Japan accounted for 18 percent of world cotton imports, 8 percent of world jute imports, and 5 percent of world imports of all other vegetable fibers in 1964. Eastern Europe accounted for 17 percent of world cotton imports, 7 percent of world jute imports, but only 3 percent of world imports of all other textile fibers.

HISTORICAL TRENDS OF WORLD TRADE IN TEXTILE FIBERS

The volume of world trade in textile fibers increased rather slowly during 1951-65 from 4.5 million metric tons in 1951 to 6.1 million tons in 1965 (table 6 and fig. 1). ^{3/} However, there were mixed tendencies in the rate of increase in volume of exports among the various fiber crops since 1960. For example, jute and other fiber exports increased 21 and 15 percent above 1959-61; while cotton exports increased rather unevenly--increasing 6 percent above the 1959-61 level in 1964 but falling to only 3 percent of this level in 1965.



There were marked differences also in the growth rates in the volume of trade for these textile fibers during 1951-65. The most rapid rate of growth in the volume of trade was in other fibers, which include flax, hemp, ramie, sisal, and manila fibers. These fibers, as a group, increased 3.9 percent per year; while the volume of trade in cotton increased 3.1 percent per year. The volume of jute actually declined 0.2 percent per year during 1951-65. These historical trends in the volume of trade in textile fibers are shown in table 6 and figure 1, while the growth rates for these fiber crops are shown in table 7 along with the growth rates in population and per capita GNP for the major fiber exporters and importers.

The United States, EEC, Latin America, North Africa, East Africa, South Asia, and West Asia were the largest exporters of textile fibers in 1964--accounting for 83 percent of world exports of textile fibers. West Asia and Latin America had the highest growth rate in textile fiber exports--increasing at an annual rate of 8.5 and 6.1 percent, respectively. Growth in textile fiber exports in West Asia was primarily in cotton, while Latin America had about equal rates of growth in cotton and other fiber exports. The other major exporting regions had more modest rates of growth in volume of exports with South Asia's exports actually declining by 1.9 percent per year during 1951-65. South Asia had an annual rate of decline of 3.7 percent in cotton exports, 2.1 percent in jute exports, but an 8.0 percent annual rate of increase in other fiber exports. The major exporter of cotton--the United States--recorded an annual rate of increase in cotton exports of 1.3 percent, but a 3.6 percent annual rate of decline in other fibers. The volume of exports of other fibers, however, has been relatively small--ranging from a high of 18,000 tons in 1959 to a low of only 2,000 tons in 1962.

The major importers of textile fibers have been Japan, EEC, EFTA, and Eastern Europe. These four major importing regions accounted for 72 percent of world fiber imports in 1964. Of these four major import markets for textile fibers, Eastern Europe was the fastest growing market--increasing at an annual rate of 6.2 percent, compared with 5.6 and 1.7 percent for Japan and the EEC,

respectively. The United States, while representing a fairly sizable market for textile fibers in the early 1950's, has been a declining import market--decreasing at an annual rate of 2.4 percent during 1951-65.

A more detailed analysis of the changes in the patterns of exports and imports of fiber crops is outside the scope of this statistical volume. However, the foregoing observations should be helpful to those using the statistical summaries at the end of this report.

EXPLANATION OF STATISTICAL TABLES

A portion of the Standard International Trade Classification scheme for agricultural products included in this study is given in table 8. Trade data in tables 9-68 were compiled on the basis of this scheme. Those wishing a more detailed definition of this classification should refer to the United Nations manual (5).

The world is subdivided into 19 major trading regions in the tables on trade in fiber crops. They are:

Developed Regions and Countries

1. United States.
2. Canada.
3. Japan.
4. EEC--European Economic Community--includes Belgium, Luxembourg, France, Fed. Rep. Germany, Italy, and Netherlands.
5. EFTA--European Free Trade Association--includes Austria, Denmark, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland, and United Kingdom.
6. OWE--Other Western Europe--includes Cyprus, Finland, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Malta, and Spain.
7. Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa.

Eastern Trade Regions and Countries

8. Eastern Europe includes Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Hungary, Poland, Romania, and Yugoslavia.
9. U.S.S.R.
10. Communist Asia includes Mainland China, Mongolia, North Korea, and North Vietnam.

The quantity data for trade in fibers were compiled from the commodity trade statistics of the United Nations, and supplemented with data from individual country trade statistics, FAO, OECD, EEC, and international commodity association trade publications. Both exports and imports for all countries were compiled in tabular matrix forms and further aggregated into the more concise tabular matrix of 19 major importing and exporting areas (tables 9-68).

The reader can best understand the use of the following trade matrices if one or two things are kept in mind. First, the column headings are importing regions, while the exporting regions for each column are shown on the rows in the far left-hand stub.

For example, in the tabular matrix for total fibers for 1951 (table 9), the origin of imports for the EEC can be found by reading down the column labeled EEC. The first figure (411) represents imports of fibers of 411,000 metric tons from the United States. The second figure (223) represents fiber imports of 223,000 metric tons from countries within the EEC. As one proceeds down the column to the figure 164, it can be seen that the EEC imported 164,000 metric tons of fibers from Latin America. The last figure (1,425 metric tons) represents the total fiber imports of the EEC in 1951.

The exports of any region can be found by reading across the column on a particular row, say Latin America. Latin America exported 89,000 to the United States, 31,000 to Canada, 66,000 to Japan, 164,000 to the EEC and so forth across the table until we arrive at the total fiber exports from Latin America of 527,000 metric tons.

The absence of data for any one importing region from a particular exporting region, say Japan from Other East Asia, may not mean that Japan did not have any fiber imports from this region. Rather, it means that if Japan had any fiber imports, they were less than 500 metric tons. Similar interpretations can be made for other cells in the following tables where there is no data. For most purposes, the absence of data means trade flows of less than 500 metric tons.

The two trade matrices that summarize world total and agricultural trade for 1964 in tables 4 and 5 are presented as guidelines so that appraisals can be made of the magnitude of export earnings by regions in a recent year and as a basis for comparison for those wishing to evaluate export earnings from fibers. This latter comparison can be made by multiplying selected unit prices (shown in table 2) by the quantity data in each cell of the appropriate quantity trade tables. However, these resulting values can be considered as only estimates of the value of exports or imports. Actual value trade matrices could have been compiled from the United Nations trade data, but time limitations prevented this undertaking.

The trade data tables were compiled primarily on the basis of import statistics, since the developed countries have had the most highly developed set of historical statistics and a longer history of reporting these statistics to the United Nations. When import data were lacking, they were supplemented by export statistics. In all cases where there were conflicting data, efforts were made to reconcile these, subject to the magnitudes of exports and imports of any one region as listed by the trade statistics of individual countries shown in the FAO trade yearbook.
