




## INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report on Tobacco Statistics is a compilation of the most frequently used statistics relating to tobacco. Most of the data in this issue cover only the last 5 years; averages are included for earlier periods in some instances. Data covering longer periods may be found in the Annual Report on Tobacco Statistics for 1947.

Tobacco is an important commodity from the standpoint of agriculture, business, and as a source of revenue for Federal, State, and local governments. Growers received \$913 million for the 1949 crop and, from the standpoint of value, tobacco production ranked fourth among the field crops. Total revenue derived from direct Federal and State tobacco taxes during the 1949-50 fiscal year exceeded \$1,730 million.

In 1949 leaf tobacco exports were valued at \$252 million and ranked fourth in value among agricultural export classifications. Domestic consumption of tobacco has increased sharply since the prewar period as a result of the tremendous gain in the number of cigarettes smoked. The cigarette consumption, as indicated by tax-paid withdrawals, has more than doubled since the prewar period, totaling 352 billion cigarettes in 1949.

Type 13: South Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of South Carolina and the southeastern counties of North Carolina, south of the South River.

Type 14: Georgia and Florida flue-cured; produced in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

Groups applicable to Types 11, 12, 13, and 14:

A, wrappers. B, leaf and smoking leaf. C, cutters, X, lugs and primings. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

### CLASS 2, FIRE-CURED TYPES

Type 21: Virginia fire-cured; produced in the Piedmont and mountain sections of Virginia.

Type 22: Tennessee-Kentucky fire-cured, eastern district, Clarksville, Springfield, and Hopkinsville; produced in a section east of the Tennessee River, in southern Kentucky and northern Tennessee.

Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, Murray, and Paducah; produced in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi Rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

Type 24: Henderson Stemming or Northern fire-cured; produced in Webster, Hopkins, McLean, Union, and Henderson Counties of Kentucky.

Groups applicable to Types 21, 22, 23, and 24:

A, wrappers, B, heavy leaf. C, thin leaf. X, lugs. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

### CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

Type 31: Burley; produced in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.

Groups applicable to Type 31:

A, wrappers. B, bright leaf, red leaf, and tips. C, lugs and cutters. X, trash and flyings. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 31-V: low nicotine Burley; produced in same areas as Type 31.

Groups applicable to Type 31-V:  
None.

Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced in five counties of southern Maryland--Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

Groups applicable to Type 32:

B, heavy leaf or dull crop. C, thin leaf or bright crop. X, seconds and ground leaves. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.

Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.

Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced in central Virginia, north of the James River.

Groups applicable to Types 35, 36, 37:

A, wrappers. B, heavy leaf. C, thin leaf. X, lugs. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

### CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.

Groups applicable to Type 41:

B, binders or tops. C, fillers (farm wrappers). X, crop-run and stemming grades. Y, farm fillers or ground leaves. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 42-44: Ohio filler:

Type 42: Gebhardt; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.

Type 43: Zimmer; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.

Type 44: Dutch; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio.

Groups applicable to Types 42-44:

C, fillers (farm wrappers). X, crop-run and stemming grades. Y, farm fillers or ground leaves. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Meta); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico.

Groups applicable to Type 46:

C, superior (tripas, medios, coronas, etc.). X, inferior (pie inferior, tripas inferior, pajizas, rezagos, etc.). Y, defectuoso (boliche, sentido, cache duro, amarillo, salcochado, etc.). S, scrap (pedazos and picadura). N, nondescript (averiado and mohoso).

## CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.

Type 52: Connecticut Havana Seed; produced in the Connecticut and Housatonic Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.

Groups applicable to Types 51 and 52:

A, wrappers. B, binders, seconds, and brokes.  
C, fillers and short darks. X, stemming grades.  
S, scrap.  
N, nondescript.

Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.

Groups applicable to Type 53:

B, binders, seconds, and brokes.  
X, crop-run and stemming grades.  
S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.

Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

Groups applicable to Types 54 and 55:

B, binders. C, fillers. X, crop-run and stemming grades.  
S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 56: Georgia and Florida sun-grown; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

Groups applicable to Type 56:

B, binders. S, scrap. N, nondescript.

## CLASS 6, CIGAR WRAPPER TYPES

Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.

Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

Groups applicable to Types 61 and 62:

A, wrappers. B, stout wrappers and binders.  
C, fillers or tips.  
S, scrap. N, nondescript.

Type 72: Louisiana Perique.

Type 73: All domestic types of tobacco not otherwise classified.



## CIGAR-LEAF PRODUCING AREAS AND PRINCIPAL MARKETING POINTS


