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


MEAT ANIMALS - FARM PRODUCTION, DISPOSITION AND INCOME  
REVISED ESTIMATES 1945-49 \*

Revised estimates by States of farm production and income from meat animals are presented in this report for the years 1945-49. These revisions resulted from a review and analysis of the 1950 Census of Agriculture covering livestock numbers, farm slaughter and of other data relating to the production and disposition of meat animals.

This report is one of a series on agricultural products presenting revised estimates of farm production, disposition, cash receipts and gross income for the years 1945 through 1949. Estimates of numbers on farms January 1 are revised every 5 years after taking into consideration the changes indicated by census enumerations and all the other data available. When revisions are made for the inventory numbers or for the livestock crops, corresponding adjustments are usually necessary in other items of a livestock balance sheet. Because production estimates take into account the differences in inventory weight at the beginning and end of the year as well as the pounds sold during the year, a revision of the inventory numbers, the births, or the items of disposition generally requires adjustment in production and income estimates.

An explanation of the various items included in this report, together with a description of the source of the information and the methods employed in determining the estimates, is set forth below.

ON HAND JANUARY 1: Inventory numbers at the beginning and end of the year are the official estimates of the Crop Reporting Board as published in February each year. The level of these estimates is based on census enumerations (or the January 1 equivalent of those enumerations) every 5 years. In the intervening years, estimates are based on voluntary returns from livestock producers, obtained largely in cooperation with the Post Office Department through the rural carriers. State records of livestock assessed each year and annual farm census enumerations in some States are also used as indications of the yearly change in livestock numbers.

BIRTHS: Calves Born: The number of calves born is computed by multiplying the number of all cows 2 years old and over on farms at the beginning of the year by an estimated percentage calf crop for the year. These estimated calf crop percentages represent the number of calves born per 100 cows and heifers 2 years old and over on farms and ranches at the beginning of the year. They are based on sample data obtained by mailed inquiry from approximately 60,000 producers at the end of the year.

Pigs Saved: The number of sows farrowing in the spring (Dec. 1-June 1) and fall (June 1-Dec. 1) shown in the report is estimated by the Crop Reporting Board and published in the Pig Crop Reports of June and December. The level of these estimates is based primarily upon census enumerations in census years. The year-to-year changes are estimated currently from indications of changes in numbers obtained from the Rural Carrier Livestock Surveys with approximately 130,000 farms reporting. The year-to-year changes are revised on the basis of annual State census enumerations in some States and on the basis of records of hogs marketed and slaughtered. "Pigs saved" is computed by multiplying the estimated number of sows by the average number of pigs saved per litter reported on the June and December Livestock Surveys. "Pigs saved" is interpreted to mean the number of spring or fall pigs on hand June 1 or December 1 or sold before those dates.

Lambs Saved: This term is defined as the number of lambs living on June 1 or sold before that date for the Native States and as lambs docked or branded in the 13 Western Sheep States. The estimated lamb crop percentages are the number of lambs saved per 100 ewes 1 year old and over on farms and ranches at the beginning of the year. They are based upon indications from the June 1 Rural Carrier Livestock Survey for the Native States and a special July 1 sheep survey in the 13 Western Sheep States. The estimated percentage lamb crop is applied to the number of ewes 1 year old and over on farms and ranches January 1 to obtain the number of lambs saved.

INSHIPMENTS: The estimates of inshipments for feeding and breeding purposes are based primarily on records showing shipments into the States, such as the Bureau of Animal Industry records of inspections at public stockyards of dairy cattle and of feeding and breeding cattle, hogs, and sheep; railroad records of receipts of livestock; and State health or brand inspections. Records are also obtained on the direct movement of livestock into a number of States. Livestock shipped into a State for immediate slaughter are not included in this item.

MARKETINGS: This item represents shipments to markets and packers within a State and shipments out of the State. It includes retail slaughter of animals originating in the State, but does not include interfarm sales within the State or farm slaughter. The estimated marketings are based on reports from stockyard companies, packers, State Sanitary Boards, and railroads. In States where such records are incomplete, marketings are estimated from the available sample of market records and from other data on disposition. The average weight per head is estimated on the basis of average weights at the principal markets and of averages for livestock slaughtered in commercial plants. Slaughter in commercial plants includes slaughter in Federally inspected plants and in other wholesale and retail plants but excludes farm slaughter.

FARM SLAUGHTER: The estimate of farm slaughter represents slaughter by or for farmers for home use or for sale as meat. These estimates are based upon periodic data from the Bureau of the Census and on annual sample data obtained by mailed inquiry from livestock producers. Average weights of farm slaughter are based on periodic sample data from several of the mailed inquiries on the number of head and total live weight of the animals slaughtered.

DEATHS: The estimated deaths from all causes for each species are based on sample data from several of the mailed inquiries on livestock and from the Rural Carrier Livestock Surveys in 14 Western States.

Cattle and Calves: Losses of cattle represent the deaths during the year of the cattle (including calves) on hand at the beginning of the year. Death losses of calves represent the number of calves which died during the year of birth.

Hogs: This item represents deaths of hogs which were on hand at the beginning of the year, as well as deaths of pigs from the pig crops (pigs saved) for that year.

Sheep and Lambs: Losses of sheep represent deaths of stock sheep (including lambs) on hand at the beginning of the year. Losses of lambs represent the number of deaths of lambs which were saved or docked during the year, and deaths of lambs which were on feed at the beginning of the year.

LIVESTOCK PRODUCTION: Livestock production for each State is the live weight produced on farms and ranches in that State during the calendar year. It is obtained for each State by deducting the weight of livestock shipped into the State from the total pounds of marketings and farm slaughter and adding or subtracting, as the case might be, the difference in the inventory poundage between the beginning and end of the year. The sum of production for the States gives the total production for the United States.

PRICES: The State prices shown are annual averages of the monthly estimates of prices received by farmers, weighted by monthly marketings. The U.S. prices are derived by dividing the sum of the State values (prices times marketings) by the sum of the State marketings. This gives a U. S. price weighted by State marketings or sales.

CASH RECEIPTS: The estimates of cash receipts represent the receipts from sales of live animals by farmers and ranchers and from sales of meat from animals slaughtered on farms and ranches. It does not include receipts from direct sales of livestock among farmers in the same State. No allowances are made for the cost of animals shipped into the State or for changes in inventories.

VALUE OF HOME CONSUMPTION: The proportion of the live weight of farm slaughter for home use is valued by States at the same price as marketings.

GROSS INCOME: The estimated gross income is the sum of cash receipts and the value of home consumption.

COST OF INSHIPMENTS: To obtain the cost of inshipments of livestock by States the live weight of inshipments is valued at an estimated price per pound based largely upon reported market prices of stocker and feeder animals. The cost of purchases by farmers from other farmers within the State is not included.
