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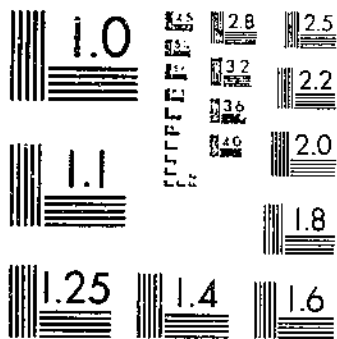
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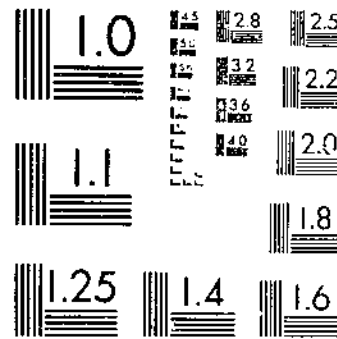

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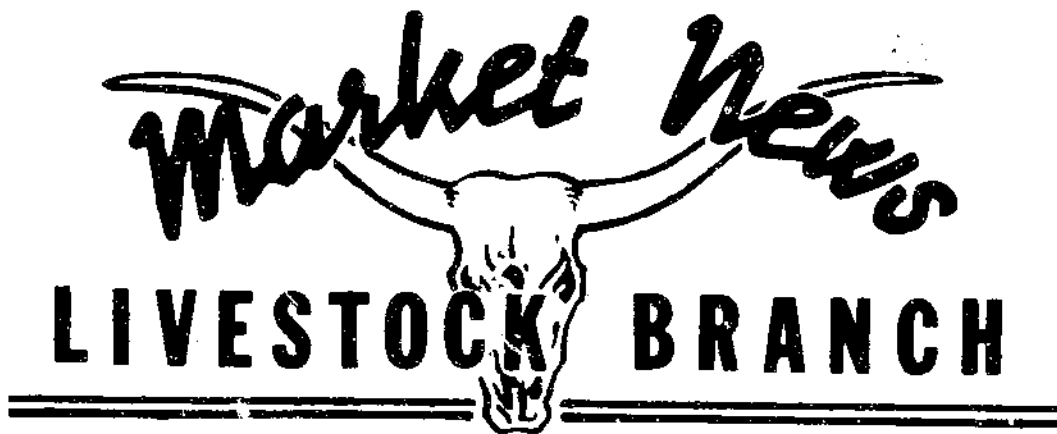

INTRODUCTION

This edition of Livestock Market News Statistics and Related Data is the nineteenth of a series of statistical handbooks pertaining to the livestock, meat, and wool industries. The Livestock Branch of the Production and Marketing Administration, United States Department of Agriculture, has compiled this publication for the use of producers, distributors, and others who are interested in statistics relating to these industries.

Most of these statistics have been collected by field offices of the Market News Division, Livestock Branch, in market reporting. The estimates of numbers of livestock on farms, cattle and lambs on feed, calves, lambs, and pigs produced, prices received by farmers, and income data, originated in the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. Data showing the number of animals slaughtered and meats processed under Federal inspection are from the records of the Bureau of Animal Industry. Foreign trade, and basic income data are from the official records of the Department of Commerce; retail meat prices for the United States are from the official publications of the Bureau of Labor Statistics; and market-price data on livestock for years prior to 1918 were obtained from the Statistical Yearbook of the Chicago Daily Drovers Journal.

Data for earlier years have been dropped from many of the historical tables in order to improve readability. Any variations from data previously published are due to later revisions. The statistics in this edition include the 1951 calendar year. Current data on many of the series included are carried in the weekly Market News, a mimeographed publication of the Livestock Branch.

^{1/} These two series of animal units on farms replace those compiled and published by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics prior to October 1949. The previous series were based on the numbers of livestock and chickens on farms January 1, and did not include the many hogs and poultry fed during the year which are not on hand on January 1. The new series are intended to include all livestock fed during a year rather than only those on hand January 1. Another difference is that the new series are based on computations for each State separately. The units for each State are computed by multiplying the number of livestock in the State by a constant factor of feed consumption for that State for each kind and class of stock. The factors vary as between States in accordance with differences in feeding practices commonly used. The feeding year commencing October 1, is the year to which the animal units relate. The "average" milk cow in the United States is used as the base determinant of 1 unit for both grain consuming and roughage consuming livestock. The factors used for grain consuming livestock represent the per-head consumption of grain and by-products feeds by each class and kind of livestock in relation to that consumed by the average milk cow. Similarly the factors used for roughage consuming livestock represent the per-head consumption of total hay, silage, pasture and other roughage by each kind and class compared with that of the average milk cow.
