




## INTRODUCTION

This 22nd edition of Livestock Market News Statistics and Related Data brings livestock, meat, and wool statistics up-to-date through the calendar year 1954. This statistical bulletin has been prepared by the Livestock Division of the Agricultural Marketing Service, United States Department of Agriculture, for the convenience of those interested in such information.

Most of the data in the bulletin have been collected by field offices of the Livestock Division in the course of their market reporting activities. The estimates of numbers of livestock on farms, cattle and lambs on feed, livestock produced, prices received by farmers, and income data have been provided by the Agricultural Estimates Division of AMS. Data on the number of animals slaughtered and meats processed under Federal inspection are from the records of the Agricultural Research Service. Foreign trade and national income data are from the official records of the Department of Commerce. Retail meat prices for the United States are from the official publications of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Certain of the data for early years are from the Statistical Yearbook of the Chicago Drovers Journal. Any variations from data previously published are due to later revisions.

Weekly and monthly data for keeping most of the information in the bulletin current may be obtained from "Livestock Division Market News," a weekly mimeographed publication. Space is available on some tables for that purpose.

The previous series were based on the numbers of livestock and chickens on farms January 1, and did not include the many hogs and poultry fed during the year which are not on hand on January 1. The above series are intended to include all livestock fed during a year rather than only those on hand January 1. Another difference is that these series are based on computations for each State separately. The units for each State are computed by multiplying the number of livestock in the State by a constant factor of feed consumption for that State for each kind and class of stock. The factors vary as between States in accordance with differences in feeding practices commonly used. The feeding year, commencing October 1, is the year to which the animal units relate. The "average" milk cow in the United States is used as the base determinant of 1 unit for both grain consuming and roughage consuming livestock. The factors used for grain consuming livestock represent the per-head consumption of grain and byproducts feeds by each class and kind of livestock in relation to that consumed by the average milk cow. Similarly the factors used for roughage consuming livestock represent the per-head consumption of total hay, silage, pasture, and other roughage by each kind and class compared with that of the average milk cow.
