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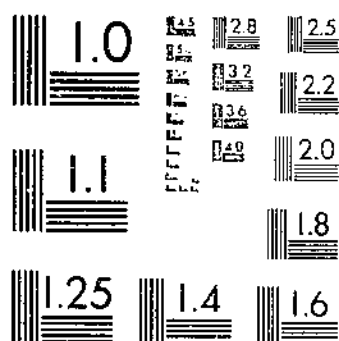

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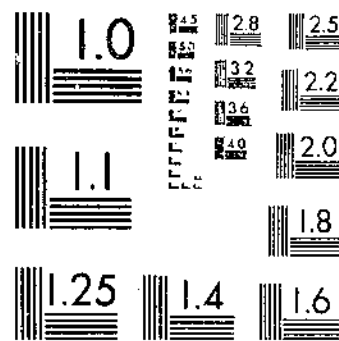

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United States -- yield, production, farm disposition, and price 1919-1948 converted to hundredweight basic -- potatoes 60 pounds per bushel, sweetpotatoes 55 pounds per bushel. Potatoes -- estimates for acreage, yield, production, farm disposition, price and value, by States, for the period 1866-1948 remain as presented in Statistical Bulletin No. 122 issued in March 1953. Sweetpotatoes -- estimates for acreage, yield and production, by States for 1944-1948 remain as presented in Statistical Bulletin 108 issued March 1952; 1939 to 1943 estimates were issued in April 1947; 1929-1938 were issued March 1943; 1924-1928 were issued June 1936; and estimates for 1868-1923 were issued February 1937. Farm disposition, value and sales estimates by States, 1944-1948 remain the same as presented in Statistical Bulletin 115 issued October 1952; and estimates for 1909-1943 were issued March 1948.

POTATOES -- SWEETPOTATOES

Revised Estimates by States 1949-55, Acreage, Yield,
Production, Price and Value, Farm Disposition and
January 1 Stocks

The following tables present revised estimates of the acreage, yield per acre, production, season average price received by growers, and value for the crop years 1949-55. The bulletin also includes revised farm disposition for the crop years 1949-55 and the revised January 1, 1950-56, merchantable potato stocks. Yield per acre, production, disposition, stocks, and prices are in hundredweight.

SEASONAL GROUPS FOR POTATOES

Since potatoes are harvested in some parts of the United States every month in the year, the estimates have been divided into six seasonal groups within the calendar year.

The States have been classified under the various seasonal groups according to the period, or periods, when the heaviest supplies of each crop are usually harvested. Estimates for 22 States are divided among two or more seasonal groups. The six seasonal groups for potatoes are as follows:

<u>SEASON</u>	<u>USUAL TIME OR HARVEST</u>
Winter	January through March
Early Spring	April through first half of May
Late Spring	Second half of May and June
Early Summer	July and first half of August
Late Summer	Second half of August and September
Fall	October through December

The beginning and end of these seasons are not fixed dates but approximations, as there is necessarily some overlapping. Generally the marketing season follows closely the harvesting season except for the fall crop where marketing from storage extends into the first six months of the following year.

The present seasonal group arrangement replaces the old series of calendar-year estimates in which the States were classified as Early, Intermediate and Late.

BASIS OF REVISIONS

The revised estimates are based primarily upon information furnished currently by crop reporters, State Statisticians and cooperating State agencies. This includes annual State Farm Census data in some States, check data -- such as rail shipments, Federal-State inspections and truck shipments -- and information available through marketing officials and programs. As customary, whenever data from a United States Census become available, the estimates have been revised to reflect trends indicated by the 1954 and earlier Censuses of Agriculture.
