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Digest

October-June Exports Disappointing (see p. 2). U.S. farm exports remained sluggish during the first 9 months of fiscal year 1983, 16 percent below those of a year earlier. As a result, the export forecast for fiscal year 1983 was lowered to \$34.3 billion. Two-thirds of the decline from last year's \$39.1-billion figure is expected to be in export volume.

October-June Agricultural Imports Up 6 Percent (see p. 34). U.S. imports of agricultural products rose 6 percent above similar months the previous year to \$12.4 billion. Value increases for fruits, vegetables, meat, cocoa beans, and wine more than offset declines in sugar and crude rubber. Coffee, the largest agricultural import item, remained virtually unchanged from its year-earlier value.

U.S. Dollar Continues Strong in World Markets (see p. 56). Appreciation of the U.S. dollar against other major currencies continued in August, primarily because of relatively high interest rates payable on dollar deposits. The outlook through September is for the dollar to remain strong.

Asia: A Major Market for U.S. Agricultural Products (see p. 62). Four Asian countries currently import more than \$1 billion in U.S. farm products annually, and rank among the top 10 world markets. In fiscal year 1982, U.S. agricultural exports to Asia declined nearly 12 percent because of weak international economic conditions and lower prices. Between 30 and 33 percent of U.S. farm product exports are generally shipped to Asia.

October-June Exports Disappointing

Export Values And Tonnages Down

U.S. agricultural export progress for the first 9 months of fiscal year 1983 (October 1982-June 1983) continued the sluggish movements that began in the summer of 1981. Exports through June 1983 totaled \$26.6 billion, down 16 percent, or \$5.2 billion, from those of a year earlier. As a result, the export forecast for the current fiscal year was lowered to \$34.3 billion in August, down 12 percent from fiscal year 1982's \$39.1 billion. Total export volume for fiscal year 1983 is now projected at 143 million tons, down 9 percent from the previous year's level.

After a 10-percent appreciation in 1981 (in real terms), the dollar appreciated against other major currencies another 9 percent in 1982, further eroding the competitiveness of U.S. products in world markets. At the same time, improved agricultural production and debt problems have reduced foreign demand, and exporters are aggressively seeking to maintain or expand their market shares.

Soybean Shipments Lower

Exports of soybeans and soybean meal were initially expected to provide a much needed lift in fiscal year 1983 with world demand forecast at relatively high levels. This scenario faded in the spring and early summer as European crushing rates declined and Brazilian and Argentine soymeal entered the market. The present export forecast calls for a 1-million-ton decline in soybeans and a slight increase in soybean meal. Meanwhile, blended credit sales to Yugoslavia have benefited the soybean oil market.

Exports to Yugoslavia consequently accounted for 20 percent of the 665,000 tons shipped through June.

Feed Grain Export Prospects Dim

The U.S. feed grain export market appears to be in a period of long-term adjustment. Over the past few years, exports have shifted to Pacific rim countries--notably Japan, Korea, Taiwan, and China--and away from Western and Eastern Europe and the Soviet Union. The latter markets have shown signs of structural and policy adjustments that would negatively affect U.S. feed grain exports. For example, in the European Community (EC), the minimum price set for grains marketed domestically has risen 7 percent annually during the past 3 years while world prices have declined. This situation has limited U.S. sales (primarily of corn) and has encouraged increased EC production of wheat and barley. Spain and Portugal--our third and fifth largest corn markets--are expected to enter the EC by the end of the decade, making U.S. feed grain export prospects pessimistic.

Exports to Europe and USSR Drop

Eastern Europe has scaled down assistance to its pork and poultry sectors. U.S. sales to markets such as Poland, East Germany, and Romania pushed feed grain exports to this region up to 7.5 million tons in 1980. Financial constraints could limit sales to less than 2 million tons this year. The Soviet Union has indicated that it is diversifying its supply of imported grain. Therefore, even though Soviet grain imports have averaged 35 million tons over the past 4 years, compared with 15 million the previous 4 years, the U.S. share has fallen. Thus far in fiscal year 1983, corn exports to the four leading East Asian markets were each up by more than 1 million tons over those of the previous year, while total European and USSR imports from the United States had fallen by one-half.

Feed Grain Exports to Mexico Up

Mexico is another country that could significantly alter the U.S. feed grain situation in both the long term and short term. Reduced Mexican feed grain crops (primarily corn and sorghum) could result in U.S. shipments of over 8 million tons in 1982/83. Through June, Mexico had purchased 5.4 million tons of corn and sorghum compared with less than 800,000 tons a year ago. Mexico's capability to expand corn production is limited since much of the land harvested for corn is small-holder subsistence farming. With the expectation of continued growth in consumption, imports of U.S. feed grains may become more consistent in the eighties.

Wheat Exports Lower

Wheat and flour exports (in grain equivalent) reached 29.3 million tons during October-June, 17 percent below those of a year earlier, despite a 2.9-million-ton increase in exports to India. The two largest markets--China and the Soviet Union--have purchased substantially less U.S. wheat this year largely because of diversion to other suppliers and improved crops. The forecast for total U.S. wheat exports during the current fiscal year now stands at 37 million tons, 17 percent below last year's level and the lowest level since fiscal year 1980.

Rice Exports To Fall about One-Fourth

Thailand, Taiwan, China, and Pakistan are aggressively marketing their rice at significantly lower prices in fiscal year 1983. Thai competition has seriously affected U.S. rice exports to Nigeria, formerly one of our largest markets. Total U.S. rice exports are expected to fall about a fourth this year to 2.2 million tons, with the bulk of that decline in milled rice.

Corn Gluten Feed Exports Higher

Corn gluten feed is one of the few commodities that has expanded during the present export downturn. Continued export growth is largely a result of the EC's Common Agricultural Policy, in which a variable import levy on grain currently raises the import price by approximately 50 to 60 percent. Corn gluten feed, soybeans, soybean meal, and other nongrain feeds enter the EC duty-free. Almost all U.S. corn gluten feed exports are shipped to the EC. Shipments of 2.7 million tons through June are up 28 percent over last year's figures.

Cotton Exports
Down 30 Percent

Cotton exports through June were down 29 percent from year-earlier levels to 881,000 metric tons. Although most of the major textile producers--China, Japan, Korea, Taiwan, and Hong Kong--have lower import needs in 1983, the U.S. export reduction also reflects loss of market shares. Nonetheless, export prices have risen to over \$1,500 per ton with the expectation of a 25-percent reduction in the U.S. cotton crop for 1983/84.

Livestock
Product Exports
Dip

Animal product exports through the first 9 months of fiscal year 1983 were 12 percent below those of a year earlier. Major commodities showing increases included beef and nonfat dry milk. Poultry meat exports continue the slide that began early in 1982, partially offsetting these gains. Nigeria, Egypt, and Mexico are among the countries that have significantly reduced their imports of U.S. poultry meat.

Dried Bean
Exports
Fall

Dried bean exports have fallen precipitously in fiscal year 1983 with almost no shipments expected to go to Mexico as they draw down stocks. Through June, exports of dried beans to Mexico were almost nil compared with 414,000 tons a year ago. (Steve Milmoe, World Analysis Branch)

October-June Agricultural Imports Up 6 Percent

U.S. imports of agricultural commodities rose 6 percent to \$12.4 billion in the first 9 months of fiscal year 1983 (October 1982-June 1983) from \$11.5 billion during the same months a year earlier. Value increases in some competitive and noncompetitive products--mainly fruits, vegetables, cattle, meat products, cocoa beans, and beverages--more than offset declines in sugar, vegetable oils, and natural rubber.

Noncompetitive Imports Up 6 Percent

Noncompetitive imports totaled \$4.2 billion, 6 percent over those of a year earlier. Green coffee, accounting for over 48 percent of all noncompetitive imports, totaled \$2 billion, up 5 percent from those of the previous year. The quantity imported rose 4 percent to 781,000 tons, while unit import prices averaged slightly above the \$2,555 per ton (\$1.15 per pound) during the first 9 months of fiscal year 1982. Natural rubber, the second leading noncompetitive import, declined 4 percent in value due to lower prices, as the quantity imported increased 2 percent. Over 55 percent of all natural rubber came from Indonesia, with another 26 percent from Malaysia. Cocoa beans, the third U.S. leading noncompetitive import, rose 31 percent in value to \$336 million, and 52 percent in volume. With increased domestic consumption, chocolate manufacturers continued to take advantage of declining prices, due primarily to the large supplies of world cocoa beans. Nearly 45 percent of the cocoa bean volume came from the Ivory Coast and over 25 percent from Brazil and the Dominican Republic. Cocoa products, tea, and bananas also increased.

Competitive Imports Up 6 Percent

Competitive imports of \$8.2 billion were 6 percent above their year-earlier value. Beef and veal, which accounted for nearly 65 percent of all meat imports, increased 7 percent in value and 10 percent in volume. Increased export availabilities in Australia and rising demand for manufacturing grade beef contributed to the increase in imports. Australia supplied 42 percent of the beef volume, and New Zealand shipped 24 percent. Canned pork, mainly from Poland, as well as fresh pork from Canada increased substantially. Pork imports from Denmark also rose sharply to 44,000 tons.

Sugar imports dropped further to \$715 million, while the volume declined 36 percent to 1.9 million tons. Import unit prices for sugar during the first 9 months of fiscal year 1981/82 declined 46 percent from the 1980/81 average but slowly began to recover in 1982/83. Larger domestic production, stocks, higher duties, and the U.S. import quota effectively reduced sugar imports and reflect the rise in U.S. sugar prices in 1983. Import sources shifted radically again during the first 9 months of fiscal year 1983, with the Dominican Republic replacing Brazil as the principal supplier. Imports from Brazil, Argentina, Thailand, and Australia dropped

significantly. Reduced production generally caused the quantity to decline from Brazil, Argentina, and Australia. Conversely, imports from the Philippines, Guatemala, Peru, and South Africa increased sharply.

Fruit imports increased 22 percent to \$807 million, spurred by concentrated orange juice from Brazil, canned pineapple from the Philippines, and fresh grapes from Chile. Vegetable imports expanded by only 2 percent to \$959 million, with most fresh vegetables from Mexico increasing. Fresh tomatoes, cucumbers, eggplant, and green peppers are the major vegetables imported from Mexico.

Imports of live animals rose 44 percent in value, mainly due to cattle and swine from Mexico and Canada where Canadian and Mexican currencies depreciated relative to the U.S. dollar. Imports of dairy products increased 10 percent with substantial gains in cheeses from New Zealand and Western Europe, and casein from Ireland. Malt beverage imports increased by 14 percent in value but only 10 percent in quantity due to higher prices. Wine imports rose 7 percent to \$631 million, primarily from Italy, France, and West Germany. Among other competitive imports, values increased for poultry products, cashew nuts, palm oil, molasses, and tobacco.

U.S. agricultural imports for fiscal year 1983 are forecast at \$16.2 billion, about 6 percent above the fiscal year 1982 total. Improved U.S. economic conditions have led to an increase in imports of most agricultural products this year, especially fruits, vegetables, cheeses, meat, wine and tobacco. (Charles E. U.S. Dollar Continues Strong in World Markets

The U.S. dollar has sustained the upward trend begun in late 1982 against the five major currencies most important to U.S. agricultural trade. In August, the dollar reached a 9-1/2-year high against the German mark, and continued to set records vis-a-vis the French franc and Italian lira. The rise in the value of U.S. currency has been fueled primarily by high interest rates, although other factors, such as the uncertainty surrounding the international financial situation, have also encouraged the acquisition of dollars.

Federal Reserve Policy Important

High interest rates payable on dollar deposits relative to other currencies make U.S. currency more attractive to hold for speculative purposes. For this reason, the most important news circulating in foreign currency markets concerns the activities of the Federal Reserve Board (Fed) that are viewed as affecting credit availability. The most widely held belief concerning future Fed behavior is that the rate of growth in the money supply will be slowed, thereby raising interest rates. Dollar deposits will continue to be accumulated as long as these expectations continue, regardless of the actual outcome.

International Debt and the Dollar

Recent reports on the problems related to international lending have also had repercussions on the value of the dollar. At least 90 percent of international debt is denominated in dollars. Increased demands for borrowings and higher debt service payments have helped bid up the foreign exchange value of the dollar. The continued high level of interest rates and the possibility that they will go higher have raised the repayments, in dollars, for debt taken out at floating interest rates, also serving to drive up the value of U.S. currency.

Outlook Through September

Prospects for higher interest rates should prevent much erosion of the dollar's value into mid-August. However, the expectation is that U.S. currency will lose some of its appeal as the trade deficit worsens and the actions of the Federal Reserve become apparent. Current estimates are for the dollar to remain above 2.6 marks and 235 yen for the remainder of fiscal year 1983. (David Stallings, World Analysis Branch)

Asia: A Major Market for U.S. Agricultural Products

Asia has emerged as an increasingly important participant in international agricultural trade and a growing market for U.S. farm exports during the last three decades. With over 60 percent of the world's population, Asia ^{1/} has long been recognized as having vast potential for increased food consumption as its nations succeed in their efforts to accelerate economic growth and to provide conditions for improved incomes for their citizens.

Japan, with phenomenal economic growth in the fifties and sixties, was the first Asian nation to emerge as a major world trading partner. In the process, it became the first billion-dollar market for U.S. farm products. South Korea and Taiwan followed a similar path about a decade later, reaching the billion-dollar market status in 1978 and 1980, respectively. The economic expansion in all three countries generated demand for additional, more varied food and other consumer goods and, through export expansion, provided the foreign exchange to purchase goods from abroad. China was the fourth Asian country to purchase over \$1 billion of U.S. agricultural products in 1 year, taking in excess of \$1.9 billion in fiscal year 1980. Exports to China have grown in waves, unlike the pattern in the other markets. Exports surged in the early seventies after diplomatic relations opened, declined in mid-decade, and

increased sharply in fiscal year 1978. These 4 countries were among the top 10 markets for U.S. agricultural products in fiscal years 1980 through 1982.

Lower prices dropped the value of exports to Asia by nearly 12 percent in fiscal year 1982, while quantities remained near the 1981 level. Values declined in exports to Japan, China, and South Korea as exports to other Asian markets were up moderately.

The United States has shipped between 30 and 33 percent of its agricultural exports to Asia during the last decade. The share exceeded 33 percent for several years in the early seventies, slipped to slightly under 30 percent from 1975 to 1978, and has edged upward in recent years. The drop in sales to Asia in fiscal year 1982 was about proportional to the overall drop in U.S. farm-product exports.

The United States exports a wide variety of agricultural products to Asia, but four categories of products are particularly important: food grains, coarse grains, soybeans, and cotton. They have accounted for over 70 percent of agricultural exports to Asia in recent years.

Food Grains

Rice is the predominant food staple in Asia. It is a high-quality, well-liked food providing the bulk of the calories in the Asian diet. Domestic production provides most of the supply, with several countries exporting sizable quantities. U.S. rice exports to Asia go mainly to Korea and Indonesia.

Wheat is not produced in significant amounts in Asia, except in South Asia and China, and historically, has not been important in the Asian diet. However, with better incomes, consumers search for more variety in their diets, and wheat and wheat products have been widely accepted. Expanding wheat imports have been an important part of the increase in agricultural exports to Asia. Food distribution policies in several countries have contributed to the growth in demand for wheat. Wheat is a cheaper source of calories than rice under normal price relationships on the world market. India, Bangladesh, and Indonesia have imported wheat to supplement domestic grain supplies for distribution through governmentally directed programs to consumers.

Policy changes in China in 1977 led to rapid growth in wheat imports, with the United States providing a major share. China emphasized expanding production of cash crops such as cotton, oilseeds, and sugarcane by raising procurement prices, supplying more inputs, and guaranteeing grain rations. Wheat imports provided a substantial portion of the grain to honor this guarantee. Rapid income growth also contributed to increased demand. By fiscal year 1980, China had become the largest export market for U.S. wheat.

Coarse Grains
and Soybeans

The increase in demand by Asian countries for coarse grains and soybeans is derived primarily from expansion of livestock production. Rapid growth in domestic meat production is usually derived from expansion of the hog and poultry sectors. In both, there is biological potential for rapid growth, the needed technology transfer is more manageable, and concentrate feeds, readily available on the world market, are the primary source of nutrients.

Fish traditionally has been the major source of animal protein in Asian diets, particularly in East and Southeast Asia. However, with increasing affluence, Asian consumers are eating more meat. Other reasons consumers are seeking more varied diets are limited fish supplies in deep sea fishing areas and increased fish prices.

Japan was the leader in increasing meat consumption and in expanding livestock production to increase domestic supplies. South Korea and Taiwan followed a similar path a few years later, developing sizable livestock industries and becoming major markets for U.S. coarse grains and soybeans. Livestock industries have been developed in several Southeast Asian countries in the past decade. While still relatively modest in size, their growth has led to increased feed demand. However, Thailand has been in a position to supply much of its neighbors' coarse grain requirements.

Cotton

China, India, and Pakistan are the only major Asian cotton producers, although many Asian countries have large textile industries. Textiles industries in Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, and Hong Kong were important contributors to economic expansion during the rapid growth periods of each of these countries. The United States supplied major portions of the increased cotton used. Cotton has been second only to wheat as a component in the rapid growth in U.S. agricultural exports to China which began in fiscal year 1978. In fiscal years 1981 and 1982, China, Japan and other East and Southeast Asian countries purchased about 83 percent of total U.S. cotton exports.

Current Prospects

The 1981/82 declines in U.S. agricultural exports to Asia are continuing in 1982/1983. However, exports to the region are expected to fare somewhat better than to other areas of the world as economic growth prospects are brighter, especially for East and Southeast Asia. According to current forecasts, Asia will again purchase over one-third of U.S. agricultural exports in fiscal 1983, increasing its share slightly.

Sharply lower sales to China account for most of the current decline. China has record domestic supplies of grains, cotton, and oilseeds in 1982/83. Large domestic supplies, more competition for wheat sales, and strains in U.S.-China relations have caused export estimates to drop to less than \$600 million for the year. Only a minimal amount of cotton and no soybeans are expected to come from the United States. Wheat exports will drop by more than 6 million tons because of lower total Chinese imports and a reduced U.S. share. However, coarse grain exports are increasing.

The economic recession in Japan appears to be bottoming out. The steep drop in U.S. agricultural exports between fiscal years 1981 and 1982 has slowed appreciably but has not reversed in fiscal year 1983. Cotton exports declined sharply. Grain and oilseed shipments have been running 3 to 4 percent above last year's volume, but prices have been lower.

U.S. exports to East and Southeast Asia are increasing slightly this year because of expanding volumes for most major items except cotton and rice. Expectations of cotton exports to the area's three major importers--Korea, Taiwan and Hong Kong--have been lowered. Currently, the United States is shipping record levels of bulk exports--wheat, coarse grains, and soybeans--to the region but at relatively low prices.

The most buoyant region is South Asia where U.S. farm exports are expected to climb to a record \$1.3 billion. The sharp increase stems primarily from larger purchases of U.S. wheat by all South Asian countries, particularly India. Increased purchases of U.S. soybean oil are also forecast. (Carmen O. Nohre, Asia Branch)

Japan To Increase Imports of U.S. Grains and Meats

Japan has long been one of the most important markets for U.S. agricultural exports, especially grains and oilseeds. A new report by USDA's Economic Research Service, *Japan's Feed-Livestock Economy: Prospects for the 1980's*, helps explain why that has been so and why future farm exports to Japan will probably rise even higher.

Each year, Japan purchases about 20 percent of total U.S. corn exports, 50 percent of U.S. sorghum exports, and more than 20 percent of U.S. soybean exports. By 1990, the United States may be able to increase its grain and soybean exports by a third and quintuple its beef exports, according to William Coyle, author of the report. In contrast, the Japanese market for imported dairy products, pork, and poultry will show little or no growth. The United States provides more than 65 percent of Japan's imports of coarse



grains (corn, barley, sorghum), 95 percent of its soybean imports, and 71 percent of its soybean meal imports.

The report includes extensive tables and charts on Japanese consumption, production, and trade of beef, dairy, poultry, fish, and feed grains, including projections through 1990.

Agriculture in China...

"U.S. business executives rivet their attention to stock market activity, prices, and interest rates, while their Chinese counterparts look for annual production and procurement plans, control targets, and administrative orders . . ." (Francis C. Tuan and Frederick W. Crook, authors of the new report, *Planning and Statistical Systems in China's Agriculture*).

Planning is at the heart of the Chinese agricultural system. This Economic Research Service report is a comprehensive description of how the Chinese have gathered their farm data and used it to plan production in recent years.

This new report on China is excellent background on a budding agricultural market for U.S. goods. Because of high domestic demand, China is an important purchaser of grain, oilseeds, and fibers—major U.S. export commodities.



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
