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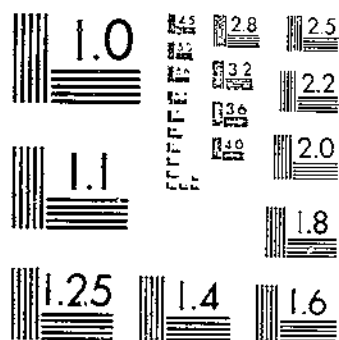
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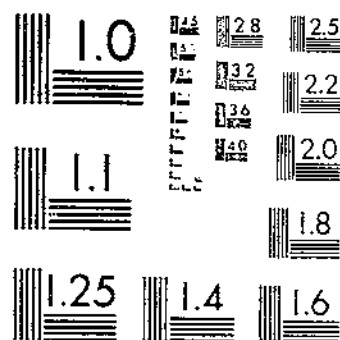

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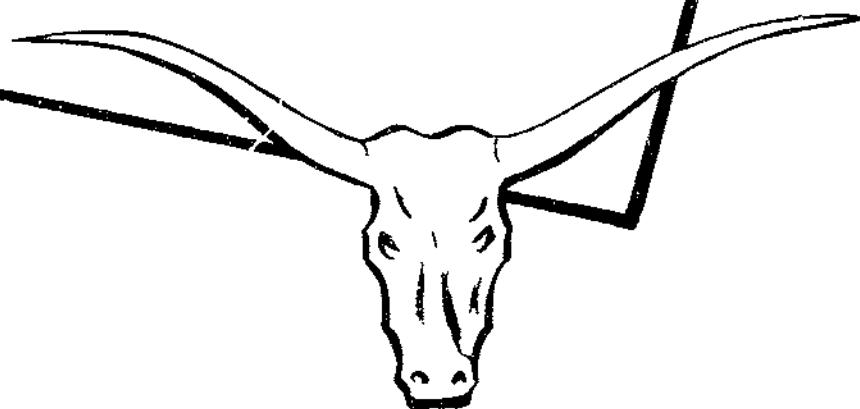

INTRODUCTION

This 24th edition of Livestock Market News Statistics and Related Data brings livestock, meat, and wool statistics up-to-date through the calendar year 1956. This statistical bulletin has been prepared by the Livestock Division of the Agricultural Marketing Service, United States Department of Agriculture, for the convenience of those interested in such information.

Most of the data in the bulletin have been collected by field offices of the Livestock Division in the course of their market reporting activities. The estimates of numbers of livestock on farms, cattle and lambs on feed, livestock produced, prices received by farmers, and income data have been provided by the Agricultural Estimates Division of AMS. Data on the number of animals slaughtered and meats processed under Federal inspection are from the records of the Agricultural Research Service. Foreign trade and national income data are from the official records of the Department of Commerce. Retail meat prices for the United States are from the official publications of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Certain of the data for early years are from the Statistical Yearbook of the Chicago Drovers Journal. Any variations from data previously published are due to later revisions.

Weekly and monthly data for keeping most of the information in the bulletin current may be obtained from "Livestock Division Market News," a weekly mimeographed publication. Space is available on some tables for that purpose.

^{1/} A unit is considered as one milk cow or its equivalent as measured by average rates of feed consumption. Each kind of livestock and poultry is converted into the standard animal unit according to the proportion its feed consumption bears to the consumption of one milk cow. In grain-consuming animal units the livestock and poultry are combined by a set of factor weights that represent consumption of grain and other concentrate feeds in a year. In roughage-consuming animal units, numbers are combined by a different set of weights that represent the consumption of hay pasture and other forage in a year. Animal units are designed to take into account all livestock and poultry fed in the year beginning October 1. They are computed by multiplying the numbers of different classes of cattle, sheep, horses and mules, and hogs and pullets on farms January 1 in each State by factors that reflect the feed consumption of these classes for a year. In addition the number of pigs raised, broilers, farm chickens and turkeys raised are multiplied by factors that represent their feed consumption. Thus the total for a given kind of livestock or of all livestock gives the animal units fed in a year.
