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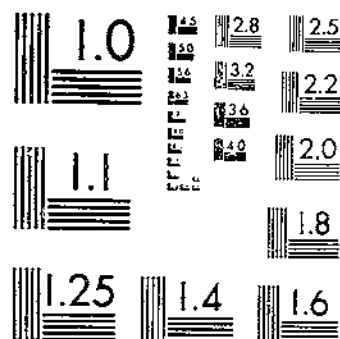
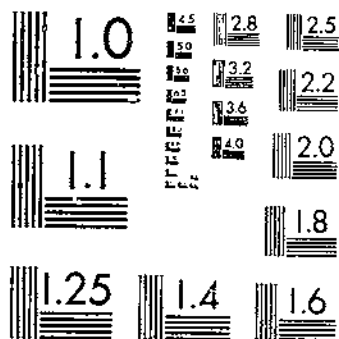

## INTRODUCTION

This handbook brings to date and revises the original Volume I of "Sugar Statistics" released in June, 1953 (unnumbered) by the former Production and Marketing Administration. It is designed to make readily available data accumulated in the administration of the Sugar Acts, beginning with the Jones-Costigan Act of 1934, and to provide a medium through which all appropriate revisions of data previously released may be incorporated.

The data contained in this handbook were compiled from reports submitted to the Department, from statistical and official documents of other Government agencies and from trade sources.

More detailed data pertaining to the individual domestic sugar producing areas are contained in "Agricultural, Manufacturing and Income Statistics for the Domestic Sugar Areas", Volume II of Sugar Statistics released in December 1954 (Statistical Bulletin No. 150).

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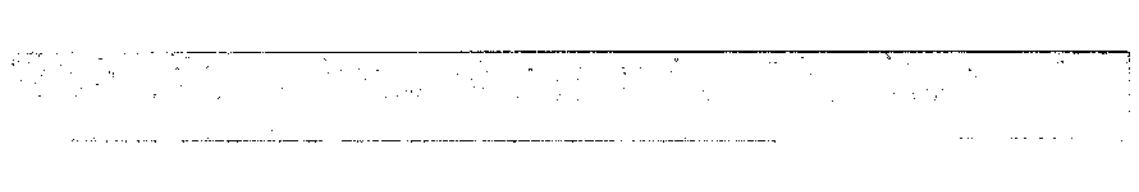

1/ A regulation issued on September 3, 1936 under the authority of the Jones-Costigan Act established 1936 quotas of 7,937,453 gallons for Cuba, 830,894 gallons for the Dominican Republic, and 16,368 gallons for Great Britain, for "sirups and sugar mixtures", after the Cuban quota for the year had been exceeded. However, no such records were kept in 1943 and 1944 when Cuba exported to the United States flavored and colored sirup in the amounts shown in the table. These products were "liquid sugar", as defined in the Sugar Act; they were entered under some or all of the following Tariff Paragraphs: 39, 501, 502, 806, and 1558; but their amount was never ascertained from U. S. import statistics. Similarly, Mexico exported to the United States 224,000 gallons of flavoring sirups in 1942, 10,617,000 gallons in 1943 and 2,901,000 gallons in 1944; this product was also "liquid sugar". These Cuban and Mexican export figures are on a commercial weight basis. Beginning May 1, 1944, these sirups became subject to sugar rationing and, as a result, imports ceased.

The Philippine Independence Act of March 24, 1934, (Tydings-McDuffie Act), limited the duty-free imports in the United States from the Philippine Islands to 800,000 long tons of raw sugar and 50,000 tons of refined sugar in any calendar year, and made imports in excess of those quantities subject to the full U. S. duty. These provisions became effective on November 15, 1935, with the establishment of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, and were to expire in ten years when all Philippine sugars imported by the United States were to become full-dutiable.

Under the Philippine Islands Trade Relations Act which became law on April 30, 1946, the Philippine annual sugar quota for the period January 1, 1946 to December 31, 1973, was fixed at 952,000 short tons (850,000 long tons), of which not to exceed 56,000 short tons (50,000 long tons) may be refined sugar. For the period January 1, 1974 to July 3, 1974, the quota was fixed at 476,000 short tons, of which not to exceed 28,000 tons may be refined sugar.

During the period April 30, 1946, to December 31, 1955, Philippine sugars, up to the quotas, entering the United States were free of duty.

For the period January 1, 1956 to December 31, 1958, the duty on Philippine sugars, under quota limitations, entering the U. S. will be 5 percent of the lowest duty rate on sugar prevailing. This rate will then be increased progressively by three year periods; to 10 percent beginning with 1959 and then successively to 20, 40, 60 and 80 percent and to 100 percent of the lowest prevailing rate from January 1 to July 3, 1974. Beginning July 4, 1974 the duty will be the full duty rate.

SECTION VIII.-- INTERNATIONAL

THE INTERNATIONAL SUGAR AGREEMENT

On April 29, 1954, the President ratified the International Sugar Agreement with the advice and consent of the Senate. The objectives of this Agreement are to assure supplies of sugar to importing countries and markets for sugar to exporting countries at equitable and stable prices; to increase sugar consumption throughout the world; to maintain the purchasing power in world markets of sugar-exporting countries by providing adequate returns to producers and making it possible to maintain fair standards of labor conditions and wages. These objectives in many ways are similar to those of our domestic program.

A Protocol of amendments to the Agreement was negotiated at a United Nations Sugar Conference held in Geneva in October and November 1956. The Protocol entered into force on January 1, 1957 on a provisional basis, after Governments holding 60 percent of the votes of importing countries and 75 percent of the votes of exporting countries under the distribution set out in the Annex to the Protocol had issued notifications containing an undertaking to seek to obtain under their constitutional procedure not later than July 1, 1957 either ratification or acceptance of, or accession to, the Protocol, or accession to the Principal Agreement, as amended, in accordance with the Protocol. To become fully binding on any participating country, the Protocol requires ratification, acceptance, or accession.

The principal provisions of the Agreement are as follows:

(1) Price stabilization

The original Agreement provided as a price objective a zone of stabilized prices between 3.25 cents and 4.35 cents per pound of 96° sugar, f.a.s. Cuban port. This price zone relates to so-called world free market sugar, that is, sugar moving in international trade outside of any preferential system, as defined in the Agreement itself. The Protocol substituted more complex provisions for the former "zone of stabilized prices", but authorized the International Sugar Council, the body administering the Agreement, to adjust export quotas when the price is between 3.15 cents and 4.00 cents.

(2) Export control

Exporting member countries agree that their net exports to the free market will not exceed their export quotas. Sugar exports to the United States for consumption therein are not considered free market exports and are not charged against export quotas. The basic export and Special Reserve tonnages during the intended life of the Protocol, 1957 and 1958, compare with the previous basic export tonnages as shown in Table 74.

Special Reserve tonnages of 95,000 for China (Taiwan), and 20,000 for the Philippines have been included in the tabulation. These tonnages are disregarded for purposes of deficit reallocations which are prorated in proportion to basic export tonnages only, after consummation of the priorities in Article 14 (7).

Export quotas in effect during any calendar year are established by the International Sugar Council in line with the estimated requirements of the free market and in proportion to the basic export and Special Reserve tonnages, subject to certain priorities, deficit declarations, and reallocations. In general, quotas in effect at any time may not be less than 80 percent of basic export and Special Reserve tonnages (not less than 90 percent in the case of basic export tonnages of less than 50,000).



Under Article 15, France and Belgium together continue to have the right annually to export 175,000 tons of sugar to the Netherlands and The Federal Republic of Germany without charge to their basic quotas. Moreover, "France may export to the free market a quantity of sugar not exceeding 70,000 tons which is not chargeable against her net export quota." This is intended to indemnify France for the loss of her preferential position in Vietnam, Cambodia, and Laos.

Other clauses of the Protocol (1) permit Hungary to export sugar to the USSR without quota charge, as previously provided for Czechoslovakia and Poland; (2) provide a fixed 5,000 ton quota for Panama, as previously provided for Nicaragua; and (3) provide a fixed 20,000 ton quota for Portugal for exports (from the Portuguese province of Mozambique) to the Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland.

Although the British Commonwealth is a net importer, there are within it a number of sugar exporting Dominions and other areas. The amount which these territories may export will be increased from 2,450,000 English long tons, *tel quel*, in 1956 and 1957 to 2,500,000 tons in 1958. If any portion of the combined Commonwealth export quota is shipped to the world free market, such exports are automatically offset by Commonwealth imports in addition to the minimum which would be imported if all exporting Dominions and other Commonwealth areas exported only to Commonwealth destinations. India does not participate in these arrangements.

Under the terms of the Protocol, all quotas are suspended when the price per pound of 96° sugar, destined to the free market, *f.a.s.* Cuban port, has been above 4.00 cents, for 17 market days. This has been the case since January 25, 1957.

Quotas charged to exporting member countries, 1954-1956 are shown in Table 75.

#### Limitation of imports from non-participants

To prevent non-participants from gaining advantage at the expense of participants, participating importing countries agree to limit their sugar imports from non-participants as a group to their total imports from those countries in 1951, 1952, or 1953. Importing countries may notify the International Sugar Council that they are not bound by this obligation when the price exceeds 4.00 cents per pound.

## G L O S S A R Y

**ADJUSTED QUOTAS:** Individual area or country basic quotas as adjusted to reflect deficit prorations.

**BASIC QUOTAS:** Established for individual areas or countries whenever the annual requirements determination is made or revised by the Secretary of Agriculture. Basic quotas do not reflect deficit prorations.

**BLACKSTRAP MOLASSES:** A by-product of the manufacture of sugar from sugarcane, or of the refining of raw sugar; obtained when all of the commercially recoverable sugar has been removed. It is a heavy, viscous liquid containing 48 to 55 percent total sugar (sucrose and invert), which is used mainly for livestock feed and to a lesser extent in the manufacture of industrial alcohol and other chemical products. This product sold commercially contains about 52 percent total sugar.

**DIRECT-CONSUMPTION SUGAR:** The term "direct-consumption" means any sugars which are principally of crystalline structure and any liquid sugar (exclusive of liquid sugar from foreign countries having liquid sugar quotas), which are not to be further refined or otherwise improved in quality. - Section 101(e) of the Sugar Act of 1948, as amended.

**EX-QUOTA SUGAR:** That sugar imported into the United States which is exempt from quota charge. This sugar is entered under bond for the purpose of reexportation or for use as livestock feed.

**LIQUID SUGAR:** The term "liquid sugar" means any sugars (exclusive of sirup of cane juice produced from sugarcane grown in continental United States) which are principally not of crystalline structure and which contain, or which are to be used for the production of any sugars principally not of crystalline structure which contain, soluble non-sugar solids (excluding any foreign substances that may have been added or developed in the product) equal to 6 percent or less of the total soluble solids. - Section 101(f) of the Sugar Act of 1948, as amended.

**PRIMARY DISTRIBUTORS:** Primary distributors consist of continental cane sugar refiners, domestic beet processors, importers of direct-consumption sugar, and mainland cane processors. Beginning with 1955 certain revisions were made in the classification of operations of primary distributors. The revised categories are:

## G L O S S A R Y

PRIMARY DISTRIBUTORS: (Continued)

Refiners - Those who distribute direct-consumption sugar, all or any part of which they customarily refine from purchased raw sugar.

Beet processors - Those who distribute direct-consumption sugar which they customarily process from sugar beets.

Importers - Those who distribute imported direct-consumption sugar and who do not customarily process nor refine sugar. (Prior to 1955 direct-consumption sugar imported from Hawaii by a refiner was included in this category.)

Mainland cane processors - Those who distribute direct-consumption sugar processed by them from sugarcane but who do not customarily purchase raw sugar for refining. (Prior to 1955 operations of all mainland cane mills including those owned by refiners were included in this category. Processor-refiners' overall operations are now included in the refiners category.)

PROMEDIO PRICE: A Spanish term for the officially pronounced January-October average prices of raw sugar available for shipment at various Cuban ports published by the Cuban ministry of Agriculture. This price serves as a basis for liquidation of cane to planters and salaries to sugar laborers.

RAW SUGAR: The term "raw sugar" means any sugars (exclusive of liquid sugar from foreign countries having liquid sugar quotas), whether or not principally of crystalline structure, which are to be further refined or improved in quality to produce any sugars principally of crystalline structure or liquid sugar. - Section 101(d) of the Sugar Act of 1948, as amended.

RAW VALUE: The "raw value" of any quantity of sugars means its equivalent in terms of ordinary commercial raw sugar testing ninety-six sugar degrees by the polariscope, determined in accordance with regulations to be issued by the Secretary. The principal grades and types of sugar and liquid sugar shall be translated into terms of raw value in the following manner:

## G L O S S A R Y

(1) For direct-consumption sugar, derived from sugar beets and testing ninety-two or more sugar degrees by the polariscope, by multiplying the number of pounds thereof by 1.07;

(2) For sugar, derived from sugarcane and testing ninety-two sugar degrees by the polariscope, by multiplying the number of pounds thereof by 0.93;

(3) For sugar, derived from sugarcane and testing more than ninety-two sugar degrees by the polariscope, by multiplying the number of pounds thereof by the figure obtained by adding to 0.93 the result of multiplying 0.0175 by the number of degrees and fractions of a degree of polarization above ninety-two degrees;

(4) For sugar and liquid sugar, testing less than ninety-two sugar degrees by the polariscope, by dividing the number of pounds of the "total sugar content" thereof by 0.972.

(5) The Secretary may establish rates for translating sugar and liquid sugar into terms of raw value for (a) any grade or type of sugar or liquid sugar not provided for in the foregoing and (b) any special grade or type of sugar or liquid sugar for which he determines that the raw value cannot be measured adequately under the provisions of paragraphs (1) to (4), inclusive, of this subsection (h). - Section 101(h) of the Sugar Act of 1948, as amended.
