




INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report on Tobacco Statistics is a compilation of the most frequently used statistics relating to tobacco. Most of the data in this issue covers only the last 5 years; averages are included for earlier periods in some instances. Data covering longer periods may be found in the Annual Report on Tobacco Statistics for 1947.

Tobacco is a commodity that is important to agriculture and business and as a source of revenue for Federal, State, and local governments. Growers received \$936 million for the 1957 crop, and, in cash receipts to farmers, tobacco ranked fourth among the field crops. Total revenue derived from direct Federal and State tobacco taxes during the 1957-58 fiscal year was nearly \$2,350 million.

In 1958 leaf tobacco exports were valued at \$354 million and ranked third in value among agricultural export classifications. Cigarette consumption, as indicated by tax-paid removals, totaled 436 billion cigarettes in 1958. Estimated consumer expenditures for all tobacco products in the United States were about \$6.5 billion.

Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, and Murray; produced in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

Groups applicable to Types 21, 22, and 23:

A, wrappers. B, heavy leaf. C, thin leaf. T, short leaf. X, lugs. N, nondescript. S, scrap.

CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

LIGHT AIR-CURED (CLASS 3a)

- Type 31: Burley; produced in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.

- Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced in five counties of southern Maryland—Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

DARK AIR-CURED (CLASS 3b)

- Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.
Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.
Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced in central Virginia, north of the James River.

Groups applicable to Types 35, 36, and 37:

A, wrappers. B, heavy leaf. C, thin leaf.
T, tips. X, lugs. N, nondescript.
S, scrap.

CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

- Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.
Type 42-44: Ohio filler; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.

Groups applicable to Types 41 and 42-44:

C, strippers (farm wrappers, tops, and binders).
X, crop-run (stemming). Y, farm fillers or ground leaves. N, nondescript. S, scrap.

- Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Mata); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico.

Groups applicable to Type 46:

C, superior. X, inferior. Y, trashy.
S, scrap. N, nondescript.

CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

- Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.

- Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.

- Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.

- Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

Groups applicable to Types 53, 54, and 55:

B, binders, (R, binder pickers). C, strippers (sorted non-binder). X, crop-run (stemming). Y, farm fillers. N, nondescript. S, scrap.

CLASS 6, CIGAR WRAPPER TYPES

- Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.
Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

Groups applicable to Types 61 and 62:

A, wrappers. B, stout wrappers and binders.
C, fillers or tips. N, nondescript. S, scrap.




