**BRIEF RESUME FOR 1960 AND OTHER FACTORS RELATING TO U. S. TOBACCO INDUSTRY**

**Production**

United States tobacco production (including Puerto Rico) totaled about 1,987 million pounds in 1960, 9 percent above 1959, and the largest crop since 1956. The record U. S. tobacco production was in 1951 (2,360 million pounds). The increased production in 1960 over the previous year resulted from record yields per acre, as harvested acreage was about the same both years. Yields per acre in the flue-cured area jumped 15.5 percent in 1960 compared with the previous year. This carried the overall U. S. average yield in 1960 to 1,700 pounds per acre, exceeding by 100 pounds the previous record level attained in 1958. Total U. S. harvested acres in 1960 was 1,169 thousand (1,178,000 in 1959). All major kinds of tobacco were produced under marketing quota and acreage allotments, except Pennsylvania and Puerto Rican filler types, and shade-grown wrapper. Allotted acreages were the same in 1960 as in 1959 for most growers of each kind of tobacco.

Estimated world tobacco production in 1960 was a record 8.8 billion pounds. Thus, U. S. production at slightly under 2 billion pounds made up about 22 percent of the world total. Production outside the U. S. has been increasing rather rapidly in recent years, whereas U. S. production has been curtailed through reduced acreage allotments because of excessive supplies. During the years 1950-54, U. S. tobacco production was 28 percent of the world total. Increased foreign production has been in the cigarette tobaccos, particularly flue-cured, burley, and Oriental. Some of this increased foreign production is giving the U. S. tobaccos sharp competition in the export market. Also, many countries who were formerly our export customers are now producing much of their own requirements.

1960-61 Auction marketing season

Table A below shows sales and average prices for the 1960 crop, with comparisons for the 1959 crop, for those types sold at auction (Maryland markets do not open until April 25, 1961, for sale of 1960 crop).

**Flue-cured**

A flue-cured crop of 1,250 million pounds was marketed in 1960, nearly 16 percent larger than the previous year, and the highest volume since 1956. Flue-cured is the principal kind grown in the U. S. (slightly over 60 percent in 1960), and is used primarily in cigarettes. Competition was relatively strong throughout the 1960 marketing season, both by domestic cigarette companies and export buyers, and growers received a record average price of 60.5 cents per pound. The 1959 price, the previous high, was 58.4 cents per pound. Despite the sharp increase in production over the previous year, receipts under price support loans totaled only 4 percent of the crop, the lowest since the present program was started in 1946. Overall carryover stocks of flue-cured leaf by domestic manufacturers were the lowest relative to consumption in several years. Thus, they were buying strongly to meet their flue-cured leaf requirements. About 35 to 40 percent of flue-cured production is normally exported, and the 1960 crop was generally considered of desirable export quality. With larger available volume, buying by exporters perhaps was the greatest in several years. Market prices, generally speaking, were fairly close to the 1959 averages for most grades.

## Burley

Burley tobacco producers received 64.3 cents per pound for the 1960 crop, second only to the record high for the 1958 crop (66.1 cents). Burley is the second most important domestic type (about 25 percent of the U. S. total in 1960) and is used largely in cigarettes, although significant quantities are used in smoking and chewing products. Sales totaled only 481 million pounds, down 21 million from the previous year, and considerably below domestic usage plus exports. Disappearance of burley leaf is likely to be 65 to 70 million pounds above the 1960 production. A rather large surplus of burley was built up during 1953 and 1954. Acreages were sharply reduced in 1955 and have been held at that level since then in an effort to reduce the surplus. A substantial reduction has been made in the surplus during the past several years and acreage allotments under the marketing quota program have been increased 6 percent for 1961, in comparison with 1960 and other recent years.

From a quality standpoint, the 1960 crop had a relatively high proportion of lower quality tobaccos. However, as in other recent years, the spread in prices between top and poorer quality grades was very narrow. Prices for the lower qualities were higher than for the 1959 crop and more in line with the price pattern for the 1958 crop.

Exports account for 6 to 7 percent of burley disappearance--an important factor in the market demand. The higher prices perhaps will tend to limit exports from the 1960 burley crop.

### Fire-cured and dark air-cured

Dark tobacco production currently accounts for about 3 1/2 percent of the U. S. total (2 1/2 percent fire-cured and about 1 percent dark air-cured). In the early 1900's, dark tobaccos made up over 30 percent of the total U. S. production. However, the trend in consumption for many years has been toward the milder, lighter tobaccos and away from fire-cured and dark air-cured kinds, both in the U. S. and abroad. Rather large surpluses of these types has been a chronic problem for growers for many years.

Generally speaking, the 1960 crop throughout the dark tobacco producing areas contained a higher than usual proportion of better quality grades. This heavier proportion of better qualities resulted in higher average prices for each of the types compared with 1959. Grade prices in most of the areas were near 1959 levels except type 36 where they were slightly lower. The proportion of the crop received under loan was the lowest in several years, again with the exception of type 36.

### Carryover stocks of U. S. tobacco

Tobacco dealers and manufacturers report inventory stocks of leaf tobacco quarterly to the Tobacco Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, with the stocks segregated according to U. S. types. Stocks on the quarterly reporting date used as the beginning of the marketing year are referred to as carryover stocks. The carryover date is July 1 for flue-cured and shade-grown cigar wrapper, and October 1 for all other kinds.

The overall carryover stocks of domestic tobaccos at the beginning of the 1960-61 marketing year showed a further decline, marking the third year that stocks have been reduced. As shown in table B, the 1960 carryover stocks of 3,831 million pounds were 578 million pounds below the peak level in 1957. These stocks are segregated according to quantities held by domestic manufacturers, under loan, and by dealers. Manufacturers' stocks were some larger than a year earlier largely because of substantial purchases of loan stocks. The overall stocks under price support loans showed a substantial reduction during the past year.

### Leaf tobacco utilization

Utilization of domestic-grown leaf in tobacco products during the past marketing year increased to 1,450 million pounds, up 2 percent from the past year. Consumption of imported leaf at 164 million pounds (unstemmed equivalent) was up 4 percent. As illustrated by table C, foreign grown tobaccos have made up an increasing proportion of our total leaf utilization in recent years. Cuba has been our principal source of cigar leaf imports (70 percent in 1960), although Philippine leaf has increased sharply in recent years (23 percent in 1960). Imported cigarette leaf comes principally from Turkey and Greece (63 percent and 28 percent, respectively, in 1960).

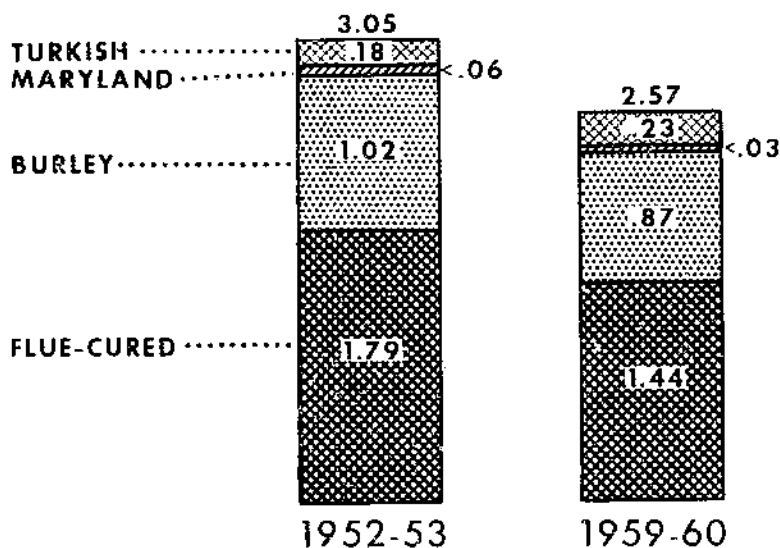

The utilization of domestic-grown tobacco was the largest in 6 years, although considerably below the peak in 1952-53. Cigarettes are our most important product, accounting for about 80 percent of total tobacco consumption in the 1959-60 year. Domestic leaf usage in cigarettes had remained rather static in recent years, notwithstanding sustained increases in cigarette output. However, estimated use of domestic-grown leaf in cigarettes increased about 4 percent in 1959-60, while cigarette output gained 5.5 percent. This lag in leaf usage compared with cigarette gains is considerably less than in other recent years (see table 18, page 47). During the immediately preceding year, output of cigarettes increased 6.8 percent, while leaf usage increased less than 1 percent.

Pounds-Farm Sales Weight



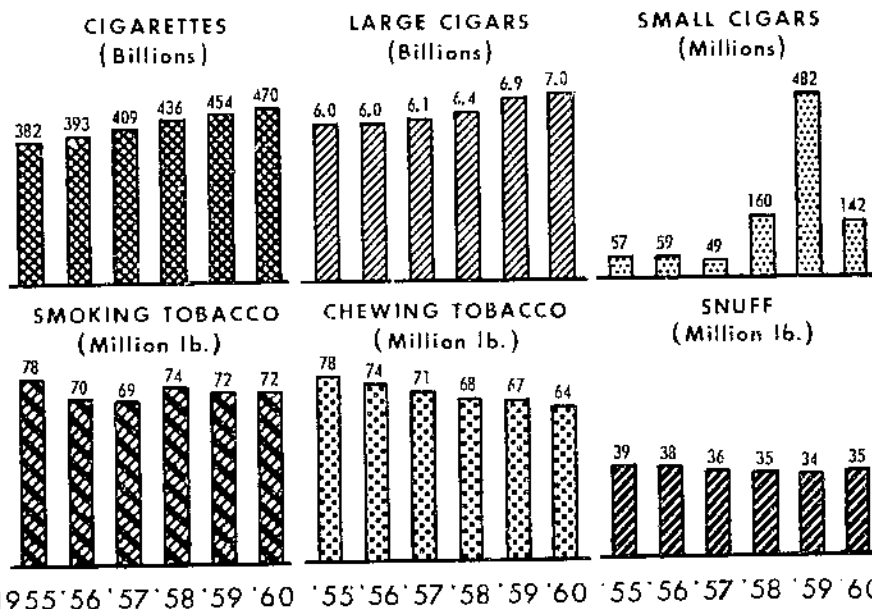

Domestic leaf requirements have increased but are still well below the record quantities utilized in 1952-53. Cigarette output during the 1959-60 fiscal year was 16 percent above the 1952-53 level. Estimated domestic leaf usage was 5 percent less than 1952-53 leaf requirements. Accordingly, about 20 percent more cigarettes are produced currently from a pound of leaf than was the case in 1952-53. Filter tip cigarettes (which require less tobacco), reconstituted tobacco (allowing more complete utilization of the leaf and tobacco particles), and a higher proportion of imported Turkish leaf are perhaps the principal factors in the relative decline in the usage of flue-cured and burley tobacco.

The lower leaf requirements per unit of output are illustrated by chart 1. Compositions shown in the chart, with the exception of imported leaf, are on a farm-sales-weight basis. Usage of imported Oriental leaf since 1952 has increased from 0.18 to 0.23 pounds per 1,000 cigarettes, while that of domestic tobaccos has decreased. Although the percentage of Oriental has increased, the proportion used currently is about the same as that used in pre-World War II blends.

The number of cigars produced in the U.S., including Puerto Rico, has increased almost one-sixth in the past five years. However, the average weight and dimension of cigars has been decreasing. In addition the use of homogenized or reconstituted tobacco sheet has greatly reduced leaf requirements for binder purposes. The result of these two factors has been a slight reduction in total leaf requirements, notwithstanding the sharp increase in the number of cigars. The amount of domestic-grown leaf used in cigars has decreased more than the total, as the proportion of imported leaf has increased. It is estimated that imported cigar tobaccos now constitute about 30 percent of the leaf used in cigars, compared with 20 percent five years earlier.

The quantities of tobacco consumed in smoking and chewing tobacco and snuff has trended downward over the years. However, the drop during the past several years has been relatively small. Around one-tenth of the leaf tobacco used in the U.S. is for these products.

### Tobacco products

Consumption of cigarettes and cigars continued to climb in 1960. Tax-paid removals of cigarettes increased to 470 billion, surpassing last year's previous record high by 3.6 percent. Cigar consumption was near 7 billion, only 0.9 percent above 1959, but substantially above the 6 billion level of 4 years ago. This was the highest level of cigar consumption since the early 1920's. Smoking tobacco consumption was about the same as during the previous year, and snuff recovered about 3 percent from the previous year, but chewing tobacco usage continued on a downward trend (chart 2).

Per capita consumption of cigarettes in the U.S. (including armed forces overseas) climbed to the record level of 3,908, up 2.4 percent from 1959. The per capita rate has shown rather substantial increases during the past several years, averaging 2.9 percent annually since 1955. The per capita rate of cigarette usage is considerably higher in the U.S. than in any other country (Canada is second). However, consumption is increasing rapidly in many countries around the world.

The trend toward lower-priced cigars continued in 1960. As shown by table D, the proportion of cigars selling for 8 cents or more fell to 39.7 percent, compared with 41.2 percent in 1959, and nearly 50 percent just a few years earlier. The offsetting gains in 1960, compared with 1959, were in Class B and Class C cigars. Variations in prices and sizes of cigars makes it extremely difficult to determine statistically the relationship between price, income, and consumption of cigars. However, it is generally felt that the demand for cigars is elastic, as compared

with a relatively inelastic demand for cigarettes. The fact that increased cigar consumption has been in lower-priced lines seems to support the feeling that the demand for cigars is elastic. The higher level of unemployment late in 1960 probably was a limiting factor in cigar consumption gains during the year.

Expenditures for tobacco products in the U.S. climbed to a new high of about 7.5 billion dollars in 1960, for a 7 percent increase over 1959. Probably around one-half of this increase was accounted for by higher excise taxes on cigarettes and cigars in a number of States. Consumer expenditures for tobacco products has been a little more than 2 percent of total disposable income in recent years and this rate was maintained during 1960.

### Leaf Tobacco Exports

Exports of leaf tobacco during the past calendar year were 556 million pounds (farm-sales-weight), up 7 percent from the low 1959 level (519.6 million). Higher flue-cured exports accounted for most of the gain. The 1960 leaf exports were about equal to the average of the 5 previous years. The U.S. is the leading country in tobacco exports, currently accounting for about one-third of the free-world total, but its share of the world trade has been trending downward. Factors in this downward trend are (1) expanded production in competing countries, (2) higher prices of U.S. grown leaf, and (3) trade restrictions and barriers which limit or sometimes preclude importation of U.S. leaf. Flue-cured leaf is our most important export type, accounting for slightly over 82 percent of the total, as shown in table E.

# BRIEF CLASSIFICATION OF LEAF TOBACCO

(Covering classes and types)

## CLASS 1, FLUE-CURED TYPES

- Type 11: Old Belt flue-cured; produced in the Piedmont sections of Virginia and North Carolina.  
Type 12: Eastern North Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of North Carolina, north of the South River.  
Type 13: South Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of South Carolina and the south-eastern counties of North Carolina, south of the South River.  
Type 14: Georgia and Florida flue-cured; produced in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

## CLASS 2, FIRE-CURED TYPES

- Type 21: Virginia fire-cured; produced in the Piedmont and mountain sections of Virginia.  
Type 22: Tennessee-Kentucky fire-cured, eastern district, Clarksville, Springfield, and Hopkinsville; produced in a section east of the Tennessee River, in southern Kentucky and northern Tennessee.  
Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, and Murray; produced in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

## CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

### LIGHT AIR-CURED (CLASS 3a)

- Type 31: Burley; produced in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.  
Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced in five counties of southern Maryland--Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

### DARK AIR-CURED (CLASS 3b)

- Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.  
Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.  
Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced in central Virginia, north of the James River.

## CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

- Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.  
Type 42-44: Ohio filler; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.  
Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Mata); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico.

## CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

- Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 52: Connecticut Havana Seed; produced in the Connecticut and Housatonic Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.  
Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.  
Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

## CLASS 6, CIGAR-WRAPPER TYPES

- Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

## MISCELLANEOUS TYPES OF DOMESTIC TOBACCO

- Type 72: Louisiana Perique.  
Type 73: All domestic types of tobacco not otherwise classified.  
Type 77: Domestic Aromatic.

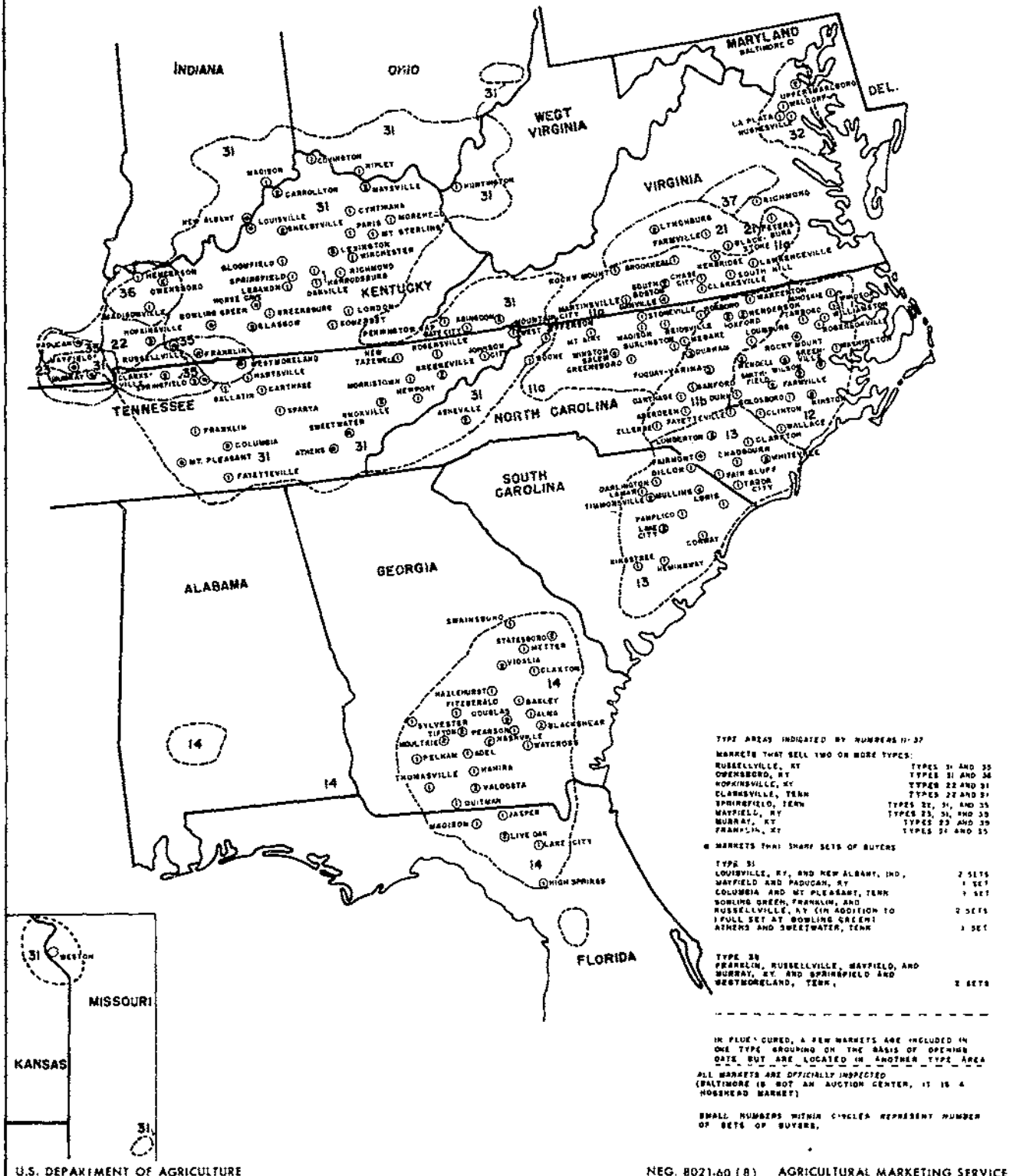

- Type 81: Cuba (Havana).  
Type 82: Sumatra and Java.  
Type 83: Philippine Islands (Manila).  
Type 84: All foreign-grown cigar-leaf not otherwise classified.

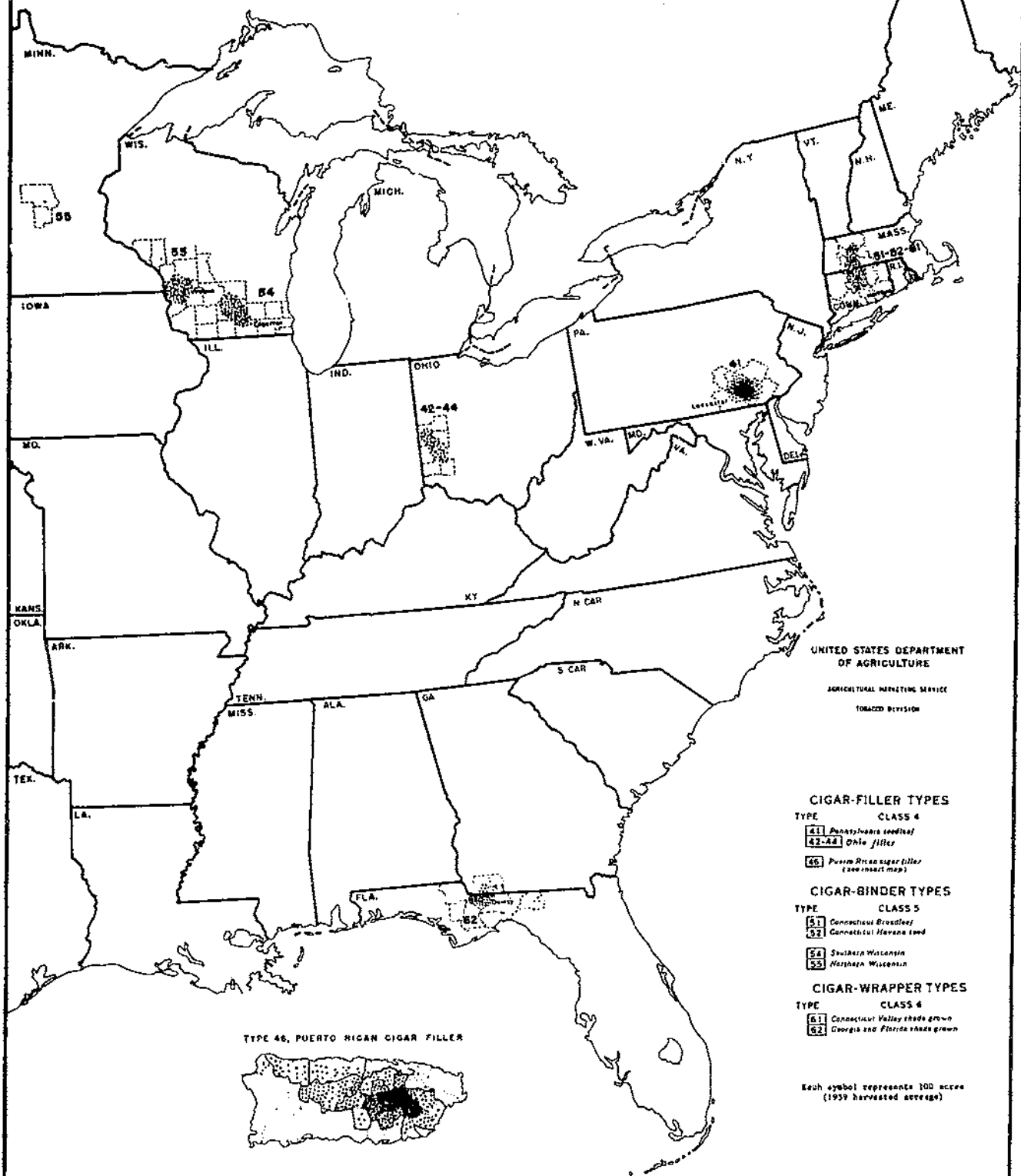
