## BRIEF RESUME OF U.S. TOBACCO FOR 1961

### Production

An overall crop of approximately 2,051 million pounds was harvested by United States and Puerto Rican tobacco growers in 1961. Production has been trending upward since the sharp setback in 1957, but is still considerably below the peak of 2.4 billion pounds in 1951. The 1961 output was 4 percent above the 1960 crop (1,971 million pounds). The national yield per acre reached a new record high of about 1,708 pounds, increasing 21 pounds over 1960 and 176 pounds over the average of the 5 years 1955-59. A sharp increase in the burley tobacco yield was the most significant change from 1960, rising to about 1,810 pounds based on marketings (1,639 pounds in 1960). The overall harvested acreage in 1961 was 1,200 thousand acres, 2.8 percent higher than the previous year. However, the 1961 acreage was 34 percent below 1951, while production was only 13 percent lower because of the sharp rise in average yields per acre during the period.

### 1961-62 Auction marketing season

Table A below shows sales and average prices for the 1961 crop, with comparisons for the 1960 crop, for those types sold at auction (Maryland markets do not open until April 24, 1962, for sale of 1961 crop).

#### Five-cured

Five-cured tobacco marketings in 1961 averaged 64.2 cents per pound, up 3.7 cents over 1960 and a record high. The crop contained a slightly larger proportion of the quality grades compared with other recent crops, and prices averaged higher for a number of grades. The combined effect of both factors resulted in a record high average price. Net sales by producers were 1,249 million pounds or very close to the total for the previous crop (1,247 million). Receipts under price support totaled 70.3 million pounds or 5.6 percent of net sales by growers. While the percentage was slightly higher than for the previous two crops (4.2 in 1960 and 5.1 in 1959), it was considered to be a relatively low percentage of sales.

Usage of flue-cured tobacco in cigarettes has been increasing more nearly in relation to gains in cigarette output. Domestic manufacturers entered the marketing season with slightly low inventories relatively to usings, and thus they bought strongly from the 1961 crops to maintain and increase stocks. The export demand was maintained at substantial levels from the 1961 crop. Export accounts for slightly over one-third of the market of flue-cured tobacco.

#### Burley

The 1961 burley tobacco crop also sold at a record high price, averaging 66.6 cents per pound. Net sales totaled 575 million pounds, up 91 million from the previous season, and the largest since 1954 (664 million). Despite the sharp increase in volume of sales, the demand was very strong, the spread in prices between the top and bottom quality grades being very narrow. Domestic cigarette manufacturers bought very heavily to maintain their stocks position. Only about 2 percent of net sales were placed under price support loans, about the same as during the previous year.

#### Fire-cured and dark air-cured

Sales of fire-cured and dark air-cured tobacco totaled 75.5 million pounds from the 1962 crop, up 10.3 million compared with the previous year. All types showed an increase in volume. The average prices for the fire-cured types fell below those of the previous year because of an increased proportion of lower qualities. The lower average quality more than offset generally higher prices by grades.

The market averages for the dark air-cured types ranged from about the same to 5 percent higher than in the previous year. The average for type 37 was substantially above the 1960 figure. Prices for most grades averaged higher in all three types of dark air-cured, but the quality was lower than in the previous year for types 35 and 36.

A larger proportion of each of the fire-cured types was placed under price support loans compared with the previous year, but a smaller percentage of the dark air-cured sales was pledged for loans.

#### Carryover stocks of U. S. tobacco

Tobacco dealers and manufacturers report inventory stocks of leaf tobacco quarterly to the Tobacco Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, with the stocks segregated according to U. S. types. Stocks on the quarterly reporting date used as the beginning of the marketing year are referred to as carryover stocks. The carryover date is July 1 for flue-cured and shade-grown cigar wrapper, and October 1 for all other kinds.

Carryover stocks of domestic tobaccos totaled 3,745 million pounds at the beginning of the 1961-62 marketing year--down 2 percent from the previous year and 15 percent below the peak level 5 years earlier. As shown in Table B, these stocks are segregated according to quantities held by domestic manufacturers, under loan, and by dealers. Stocks under price support loans declined again during the past year. This largely reflected a decrease in flue-cured loan holdings as of the beginning of the marketing year. However, most of the burley loan stocks have been sold since the beginning of the marketing year.

#### Leaf tobacco utilization

Indicated consumption of U. S. grown leaf during the past market year totals 1,490 million pounds (farm-sales-weight), 2.8 percent above the prior year, but still considerably below the record disappearance in 1952-53. Imported tobacco usage reached a new high of 171 million pounds (unstemmed equivalent), surpassing the previous year by 4.3 percent. Imported tobaccos account for approximately one-third of the leaf used in cigars in the United States and slightly over nine percent of the leaf going into cigarettes. Of the overall leaf utilization, cigarettes accounted for an estimated 1,343 million pounds or slightly over four-fifths of the total. The remainder is about equally divided between cigars, and the smoking-chewing manufacturers. The usage of leaf has climbed during the past two years after having remained rather static for several years. The overall quantity used in cigarettes reached a record high, slightly exceeding the previous peak in 1952-53. However, the output of cigarettes during the 1960-61 year was 18.6 percent higher than in 1952-53.

# LEAF TOBACCO DISAPPEARANCE IN U. S.

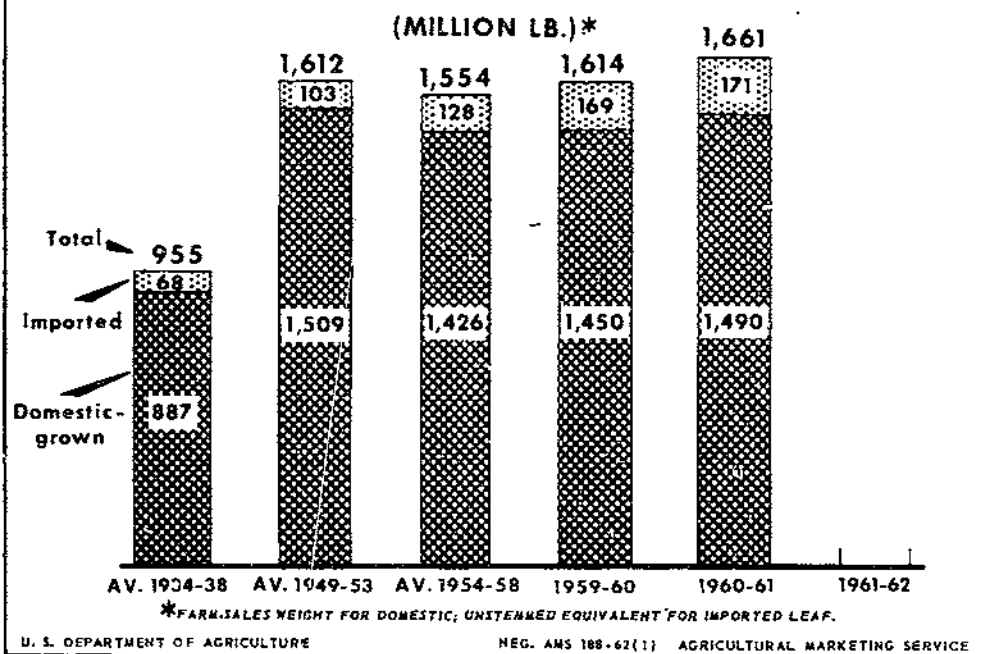

# DOMESTIC CONSUMPTION OF TOBACCO

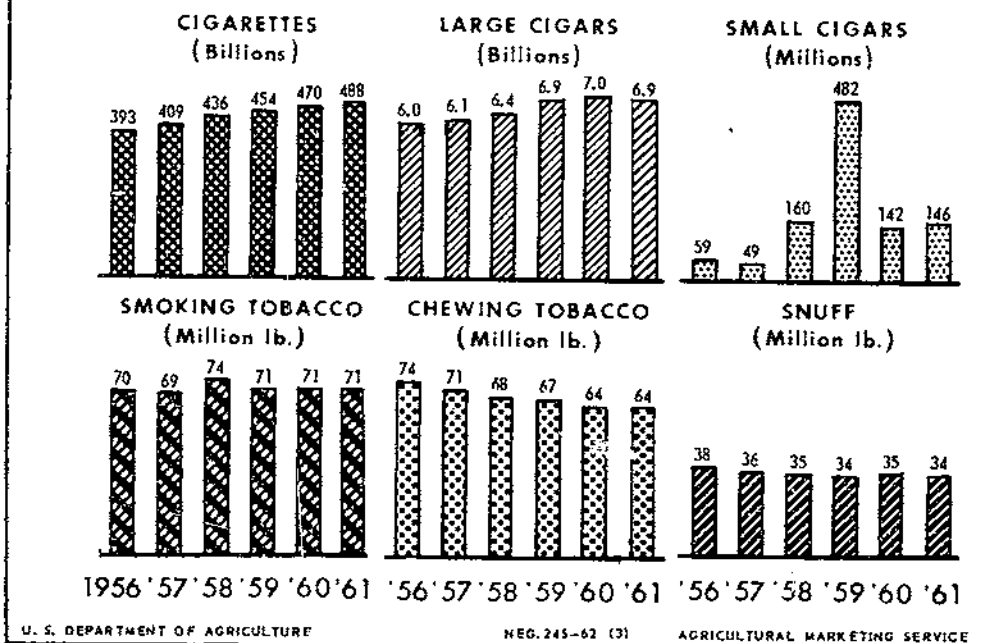

Cuba continued as our principal supplier of cigar leaf although its relative importance decreased to 58 percent of the total compared with 71 percent the previous year. The Philippine Republic increased in importance during the past year (30 percent of total), as well as Colombia (1.7 percent), and Dominican Republic (2.0 percent). Turkey and Greece are traditionally the principal suppliers of imported cigarette leaf (62 and 27 percent respectively in 1961).

Stocks of imported Cuban leaf held in the inventories of dealers and manufacturers at the time of the announcement of the embargo on imports in early February 1961 were sufficient for about 16 or 17 months' duration at the rate of usage during the past year. However, the rate of usage of Cuban leaf is expected to gradually decline as other kinds of tobacco are used in substitution and thus result in a stretch-out of present stocks. An acceleration in the upward trend in imports of cigar leaf from other countries is likely, as it appears that cigar manufacturers are developing other foreign sources of supplies of imported cigar leaf.

#### Tobacco products

The output of cigarettes rose to 528.3 billion in 1961, up 4.2 percent from 1960 and marked another record high. Domestic consumption as indicated by taxable removals reached 488.1 billion, up 3.8 percent from the previous year. The per capita consumption of cigarettes, based on population 15 years and over, was at the record level of 3,989 in 1961 or nearly 200 packs per capita. An estimated 61 million persons are regular cigarette smokers or about 48 percent of the population 15 years and older (July 1, 1961). In addition, 4 or 5 million more persons smoke cigarettes occasionally. The proportion of the population using cigarettes has been rising as the percentage of women smokers increase and this has been an important factor in per capita gains. However, part of the gain is thought to result from higher average daily rate of usage by smokers.

Taxable removals of cigars in 1961 was 6,936 million, a slight decline from the previous year (6,955 million in 1960). Cigar consumption had been trending upward in recent years and the dip in 1961 is thought to be only a temporary interruption in this trend. The repeal of state taxes on cigars in New York and Michigan as of July 1, 1961, had a retarding effect on removals during the first half of 1961 and this was an important factor in the decline for the year.

Smoking tobacco output in 1961 was about 74 million pounds or just slightly above the previous year. Imported smoking tobacco, mainly from the Netherlands, accounted for slightly over one million pounds of the total U.S. consumption, considerably above 1960.

Chewing tobacco as a whole held about even with the previous year--65.2 million pounds (64.9 million in 1960). Snuff output turned downward after fluctuating within a narrow range during the three previous years. The production of snuff was 33.8 million pounds in 1961 (34.6 million in 1960).

Consumers spent an estimated \$7.9 billion for tobacco products in 1961 or slightly over 2 percent of total disposable income. This represents an increase of \$392 million or 5.2 percent over 1960. Cigarettes account for 88 percent of the total. Expenditures for cigarettes increased 2 percent more than unit consumption largely because of higher average state taxation. A total of 16 states increased the tax on cigarettes in 1961.

#### Leaf tobacco exports

Exports of leaf tobacco were 562.5 million (farm-sales-weight) pounds in 1961, compared with 557.4 million in 1960. This level of exports for 1961 is about equal to the five year average for 1955-59. World consumption of tobacco is increasing, particularly cigarettes, which is helping the United States to hold its level of trade despite offsetting factors. U.S. tobacco exports are facing competition from expanding production in many foreign countries, plus increasing trade barriers. In addition, our prices are generally higher than our major competitors, such as the Rhodesian Federation and Canada.

Flue-cured tobacco exports, which normally make up about 80 percent of the total, were down slightly from the previous calendar year level. However, larger exports of burley and fire-cured tobacco more than balanced this decline. Exports of these kinds of tobacco were at the highest level in a number of years.

The United Kingdom has been our most important export customer since early colonial days, accounting for 30 percent of our shipments of tobacco in 1961. Other leading customers were Germany (15.5 percent), Netherlands (6.0 percent), Sweden (3.8 percent), Belgium (3.4 percent), Switzerland and Denmark (2.8 percent for each).

# BRIEF CLASSIFICATION OF LEAF TOBACCO

(Covering classes and types)

## CLASS 1, FLUE-CURED TYPES

- Type 11: Old Belt flue-cured; produced in the Piedmont sections of Virginia and North Carolina.  
Type 12: Eastern North Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of North Carolina, north of the South River.  
Type 13: South Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of South Carolina and the southeastern counties of North Carolina, south of the South River.  
Type 14: Georgia and Florida flue-cured; produced in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

## CLASS 2, FIRE-CURED TYPES

- Type 21: Virginia fire-cured; produced in the Piedmont and mountain sections of Virginia.  
Type 22: Tennessee-Kentucky fire-cured, eastern district, Clarksville, Springfield, and Hopkinsville; produced in a section east of the Tennessee River, in southern Kentucky and northern Tennessee.  
Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, and Murray; produced in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

## CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

### LIGHT AIR-CURED (CLASS 3a)

- Type 31: Burley; produced in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.  
Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced in five counties of southern Maryland--Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

### DARK AIR-CURED (CLASS 3b)

- Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.  
Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.  
Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced in central Virginia, north of the James River.

## CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

- Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.  
Type 42-44: Ohio filler; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.  
Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Mata); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico.

## CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

- Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 52: Connecticut Havana Seed; produced in the Connecticut and Housatonic Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.  
Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.  
Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

## CLASS 6, CIGAR-WRAPPER TYPES

- Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

## MISCELLANEOUS TYPES OF DOMESTIC TOBACCO

- Type 72: Louisiana Perique.

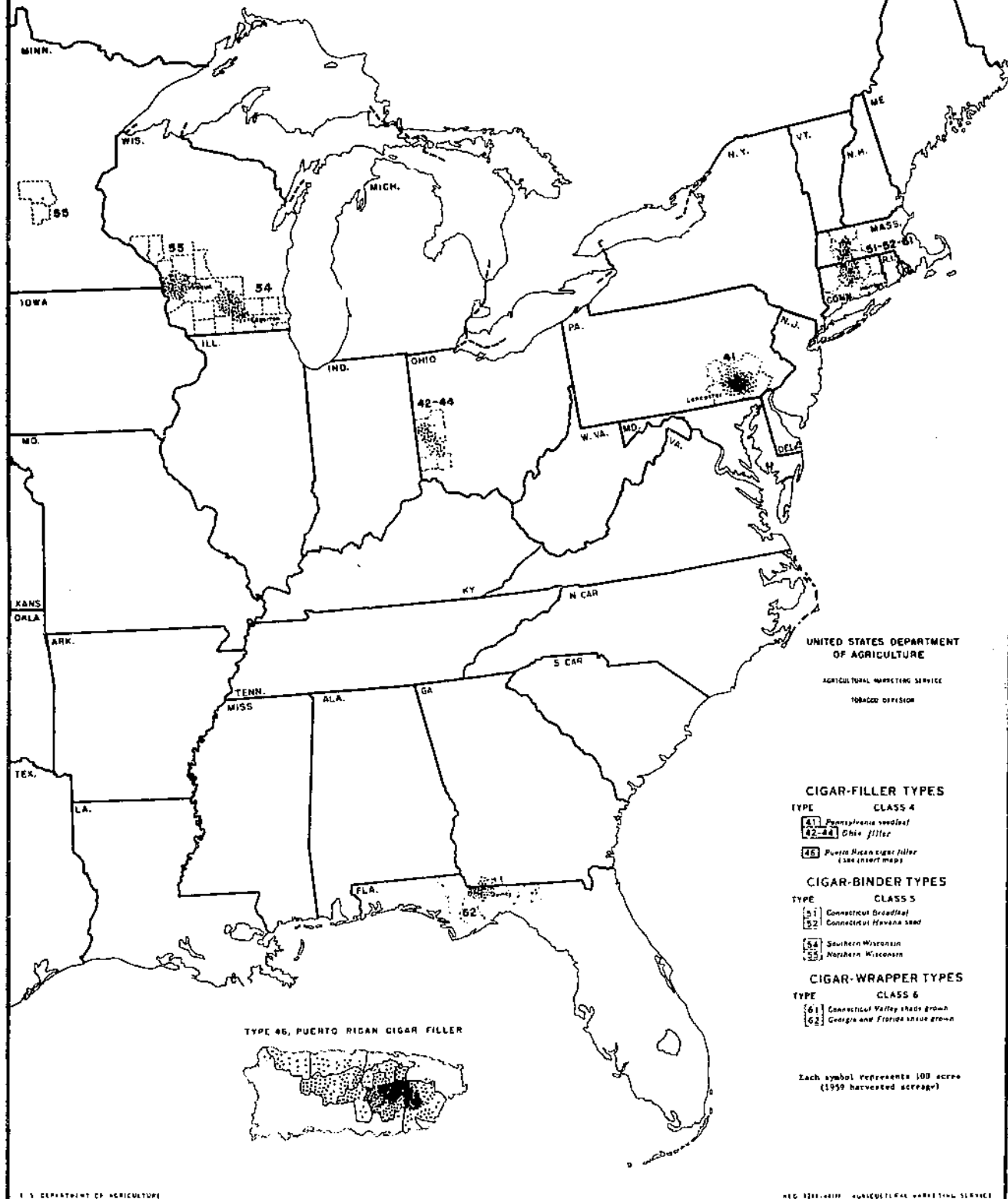
