# BRIEF RESUME OF U.S. TOBACCO FOR 1962

## Production

Tobacco production increased to a near-record level in 1962, exceeding 1961 production by about one-tenth. The overall United States and Puerto Rican production totaled around 2.3 billion pounds and was second in size only to the 1951 output (2.4 billion pounds). The overall yield per acre rose to a new record high of about 1,830 pounds per acre, surpassing last year's previous record by 5 percent, and the average for the 10 years, 1951-60, by about 26 percent. Yields per acre for both flue-cured and burley, the two most important kinds, rose substantially compared with the previous year. Harvested acreage was 1,254 thousand acres in 1962 (including Puerto Rico), an increase of 4.4 percent over the previous year. However, because of the sharply upward trend in yields in recent years, total acreage is well below the record level (1,986 thousand acres in 1946).

## 1962-63 Auction marketing season

Table A below shows sales and average prices for the 1962 crop, with comparisons for the 1961 crop, for those types sold at auction (Maryland markets do not open until April 23, 1963, for sale of the 1962 crop).

## Flue-cured

The largest flue-cured crop since 1956 was marketed in 1962. Although the average price declined from the previous year's level, the value of sales reached a record high. The average price was 60.1 cents per pound compared with 64.2 cents for the 1961 crop. The 1962 average price was the third highest, being just slightly under 1960. The decline in the average price reflected both a higher proportion of lower quality grades and a decline in grade prices. The average market price for about three-fourths of the grades was down compared with the previous year. The export demand was not as strong as during the previous season, particularly by the United Kingdom, our principal flue-cured export market. Net sales by producers were 1,400 million pounds, or 12 percent above the previous crop (1,249 million pounds). This was the fourth largest volume of sales on record, being exceeded in 1951, 1955, and 1956. Receipts under price support in 1962 totaled 237 million pounds, or 16.9 percent of net sales by growers (70.3 million pounds in 1961 and 5.6 percent). The larger crop, poorer average quality, and weaker export demand were contributing factors to the sharp increase in loan receipts over 1961.

Indicated domestic usage of flue-cured tobacco did not increase during the previous marketing year, and manufacturers appear to have bought largely on a replacement basis. Domestic manufacturers' inventories of flue-cured as of January 1, 1963, were only slightly larger than a year earlier.

### Burley

The average price received for the 1962 burley crop declined to 58.5 cents per pound, about 8 cents under the record high received for the 1961 crop. However, net sales of 670 million pounds were a record, slightly exceeding the previous high volume of the 1954 crop (664 million pounds). Average prices for the medium and lower quality tobaccos were down considerably from the previous season, but a stronger tone was reflected for the better qualities. The price spread between the better and lower qualities was the greatest in a number of years. The 1962 crop contained a larger percentage of heavier bodied tobaccos than in recent years. The proportion of unripe qualities was higher than usual. The highest percentage of sales was placed under loan (9.5 percent) since the 1955 crop (15.6 percent).

### Fire-cured and dark air-cured

Sales of fire-cured and dark air-cured tobacco were somewhat larger than the volume marketed the previous year. Generally, the tone of the market demand in all areas was a little weaker than during the previous marketing season. Because of the trend away from the dark tobacco to the lighter cigarette types, the demand normally is not brisk. However, it was better than usual in the 1961 season.

A larger percentage of sales was placed under loan for each of the dark types, compared with the previous season. Except for type 21, Virginia fire-cured, the general quality of the crops was not considered as good as in 1961. The Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured types contained a smaller proportion of qualities desired by export outlets.

### Carryover stocks of U.S. tobacco

Tobacco dealers and manufacturers report inventory stocks of leaf tobacco quarterly to the Tobacco Division, Agricultural Marketing Service, with the stocks segregated according to U.S. types. Stocks on hand as of the quarterly reporting date used as the beginning of the marketing year are referred to as carryover stocks. The carryover date is July 1 for flue-cured and shade-grown cigar wrapper, and October 1 for all other kinds.

Carryover stocks of domestic leaf at 3,754 million pounds were approximately the same as on hand a year earlier. As shown by Table B, stocks held under loan were considerably less than at the beginning of the previous year, but this was balanced by an increase in stocks held by manufacturers. Reduced loan stocks of flue-cured was the principal factor in the overall reduction. Burley loan holdings also showed a sizeable decrease. Loan receipts from the 1962 crop were rather substantial compared with the 1961 crop, and loan stocks are likely to be higher at the beginning of the next marketing year. Stocks held by manufacturers were 7 percent higher than at the beginning of the previous year, and the highest since 1957.

### Leaf tobacco disappearance

Usage of leaf tobacco by U.S. manufacturers held near the level of the previous year, as indicated by the total of disappearance of the various types of tobacco. Consumption of domestic tobaccos was 1,493 million pounds (farm-sales-weight equivalent) compared with 1,490 million during the previous year. Usage of imported tobaccos, as indicated by import statistics at 171 million pounds (unstemmed equivalent), was the same as during the previous year.

Rather substantial increases had been posted in domestic consumption during the previous two marketing years. However, the rate of gain in cigarettes, which accounts for slightly over four-fifths of the overall leaf usage, was less than in recent years. The usage of leaf increased even less, percentage-wise, than cigarette output. This was probably the result of some further increase in the proportion of filter-tip brands, which require less tobacco, and the utilization of sheet tobacco. Also, there was a slight increase in the use of Oriental leaf.

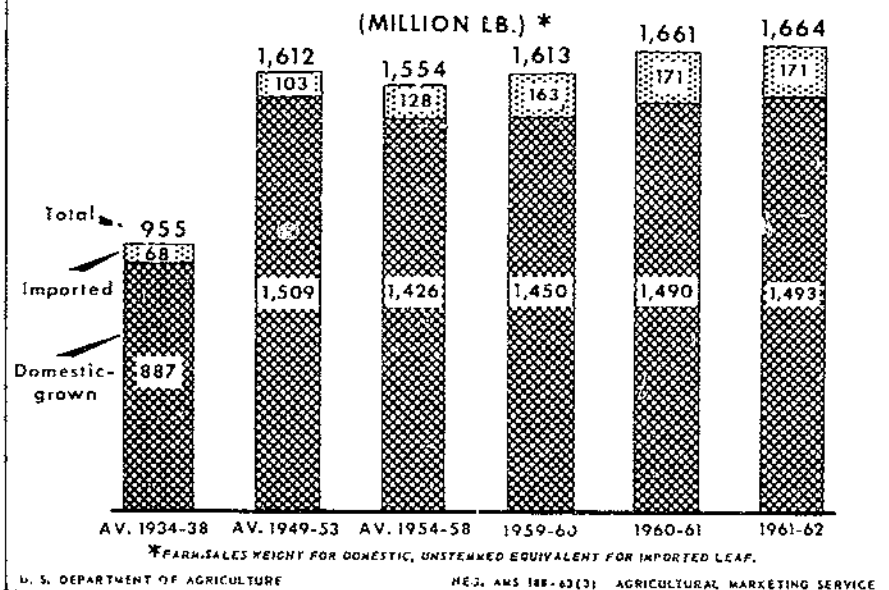

# DOMESTIC CONSUMPTION OF TOBACCO

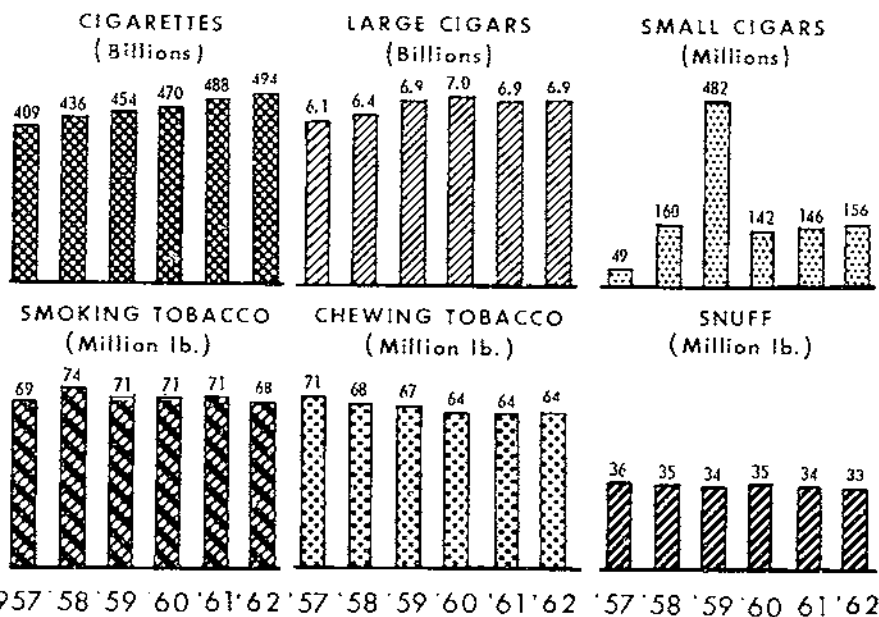

Imports of cigar leaf for consumption declined slightly to 43 million pounds (unstemmed equivalent) for the year ending June 1962 (47 million the previous year). Since the embargo on further imports of Cuban leaf, the usage of stocks on hand of this type has been at a declining rate, as manufacturers stretch out inventories. Cuban leaf represented just slightly over one-half of the imported tobacco usage during the year ending June 1962, compared with four-fifths five years ago. The usage of Cuban leaf has been declining even more rapidly in recent months. The quantity from the Philippines, the second most important source, also decreased, but the quantity from other countries doubled compared with the previous year (from 4.6 to 9.1 million pounds). Colombia and the Dominican Republic were the principal suppliers, but among the other countries were Indonesia, Brazil, and Paraguay.

Usage of Oriental cigarette leaf based on import statistics increased to 128 million pounds, compared with 124 million pounds the previous year. Most of the increase was from Turkey, which supplied 63 percent of the usings. Greece, the second most important source, supplied about one-fourth of the total.

### Tobacco products

Cigarette output of 535.5 billion was at a record level in 1962, but the increase was only 1.4 percent over 1961. This rate of gain was considerably below that experienced in recent years. The average increase for the five years, 1957-61, was 4.5 percent. Domestic consumption of 494.5 billion was also a new record, and represented an increase of 1.3 percent over the previous year. This rate of gain was less than the percentage increase in numbers of persons of smoking age, and the rate of per capita consumption declined to 3,958 compared with the record level of 3,985 in 1961. The publicity concerning cigarette smoking and health, perhaps, was a contributing factor to the lower per capita usage.

Taxable removals of cigars totaled 6,947 million during 1962, or just slightly ahead of the 6,937 level for 1961. The totals have varied only slightly for the past four years. The proportion of the cigars manufactured in Puerto Rican factories was 6.9 percent of the total (483 million) as against 5.1 percent in 1961. Imports from Cuba, which had been the leading supplier of imported cigars, were cut off following the embargo imposed in February 1962. The Philippines is now the leading supplier but overall imports of cigars amounted to only 0.3 percent (22 million in 1962) of total consumption.

Smoking tobacco output was 70.9 million pounds, a decrease of 3.3 million from 1961, and the second lowest level on record (lowest, 70.5 million in 1956). Imports of smoking tobacco, principally from the Netherlands, continued to trend upward, totaling 1.4 million pounds during the 1961-62 fiscal year compared with 1.1 million for the previous year.

Chewing tobacco manufactured in 1962 totaled 64.7 million pounds compared with 65.2 million in 1961. The decrease was in twist and scrap chewing. The output of snuff, at 33.2 million pounds, was also down slightly from the previous year's level (33.8 million).

Retail sales of tobacco products totaled an estimated \$7,780 million in 1962, compared with \$7,605 million in 1961. This represents slightly over 2 percent of consumer disposable incomes. Expenditures for cigarettes of \$6,846 million accounted for 88 percent of the total. Combined excise taxes by Federal, State, and local governments totaled about \$3.2 billion, or slightly over two-fifths of consumer expenditures.

### Leaf tobacco exports

Exports of leaf tobacco declined to 529.1 million pounds (farm-sales-weight) in 1962, compared with 562.7 million in 1961. Exports to the United Kingdom, which normally takes one-third of all exports, were down sharply.

The European Economic Community (Common Market) countries account for about one-fourth of our exports. The application of an ad valorem duty by the Common Market, versus a flat rate per pound perhaps is some disadvantage to U.S. exports. Currently, it appears that the Common Market external tariff will be 28 percent ad valorem (except for tobacco valued over 1.27 per pound), with a minimum of 13.2 cents per pound and a maximum of 17.2 cents. In other words, the flexible range applies to tobacco valued between 47.1 cents and 61.4 cents per pound. The duty for most imports from the U.S. will be at the maximum rate because of the higher price level of our leaf. For many of our competitors, the minimum duty will be applicable, or a difference of 4 cents per pound.

Our share of the free world exports of tobacco currently is about 30 percent of the total, compared with 38 percent in the 1950-54 period. World exports have increased about one-fourth compared with the average for the 1950-54 period, while U.S. exports are about the same, volumewise.

(Covering classes and types)

## CLASS 1, FLUE-CURED TYPES

- Type 11: Old Belt flue-cured; produced in the Piedmont sections of Virginia and North Carolina.  
Type 12: Eastern North Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of North Carolina, north of the South River.  
Type 13: South Carolina flue-cured; produced in the coastal sections of South Carolina and the southeastern counties of North Carolina, south of the South River.  
Type 14: Georgia and Florida flue-cured; produced in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

## CLASS 2, FIRE-CURED TYPES

- Type 21: Virginia fire-cured; produced in the Piedmont and mountain sections of Virginia.  
Type 22: Tennessee-Kentucky fire-cured, eastern district, Clarksville, Springfield, and Hopkinsville; produced in a section east of the Tennessee River, in southern Kentucky and northern Tennessee.  
Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, and Murray; produced in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

## CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

### LIGHT AIR-CURED (CLASS 3a)

- Type 31: Burley; produced in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.  
Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced in five counties of southern Maryland--Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

### DARK AIR-CURED (CLASS 3b)

- Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.  
Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.  
Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced in central Virginia, north of the James River.

## CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

- Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.  
Type 42-44: Ohio filler; produced in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.  
Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Mata); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico.

## CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

- Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 52: Connecticut Havana Seed; produced in the Connecticut and Housatonic Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.  
Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.  
Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

## CLASS 6, CIGAR-WRAPPER TYPES

- Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.  
Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

## MISCELLANEOUS TYPES OF DOMESTIC TOBACCO

- Type 72: Louisiana Perique.  
Type 73: All domestic types of tobacco not otherwise classified.  
Type 77: Domestic Aromatic.

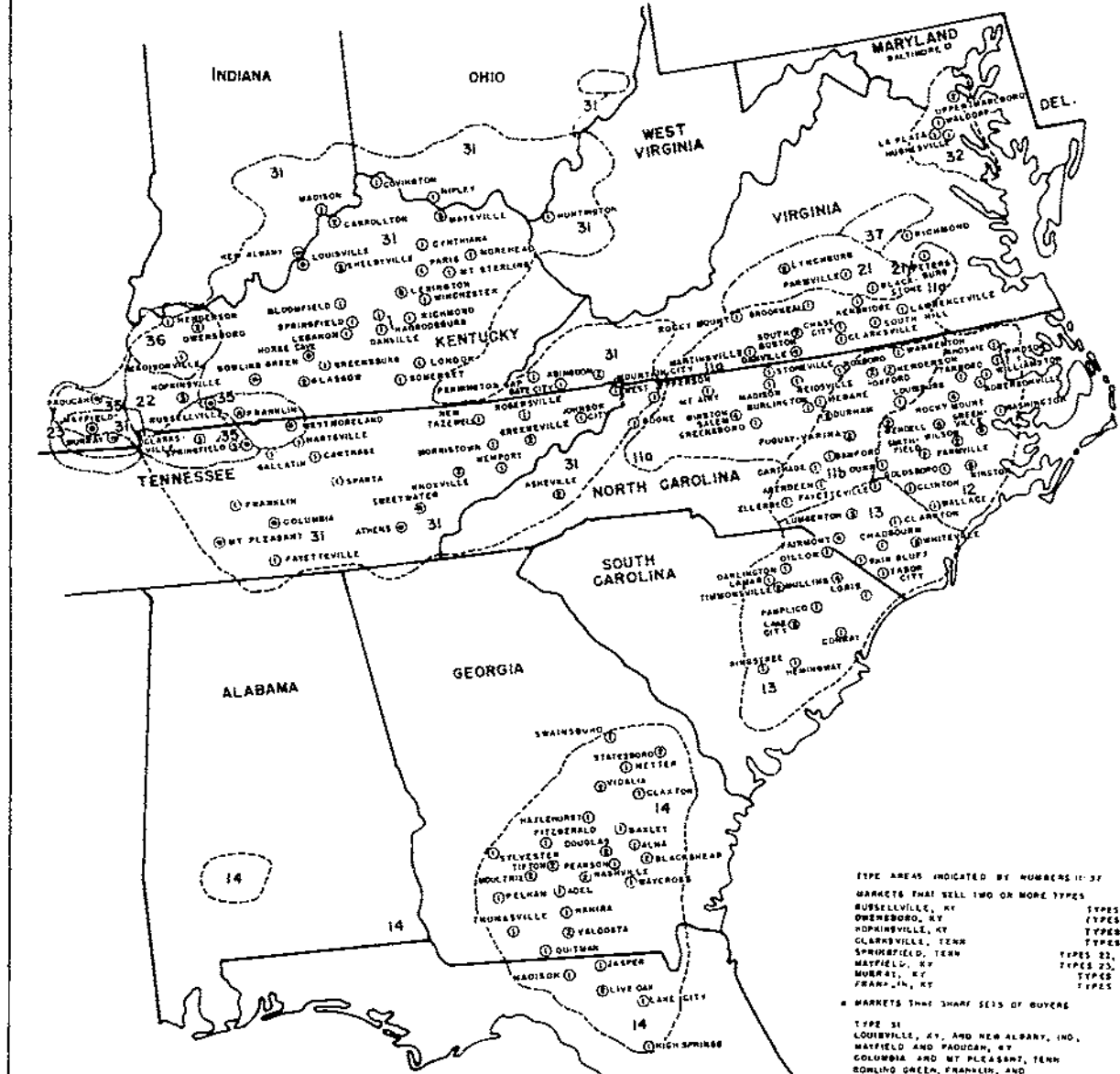

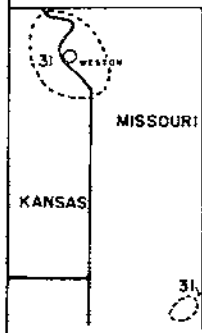

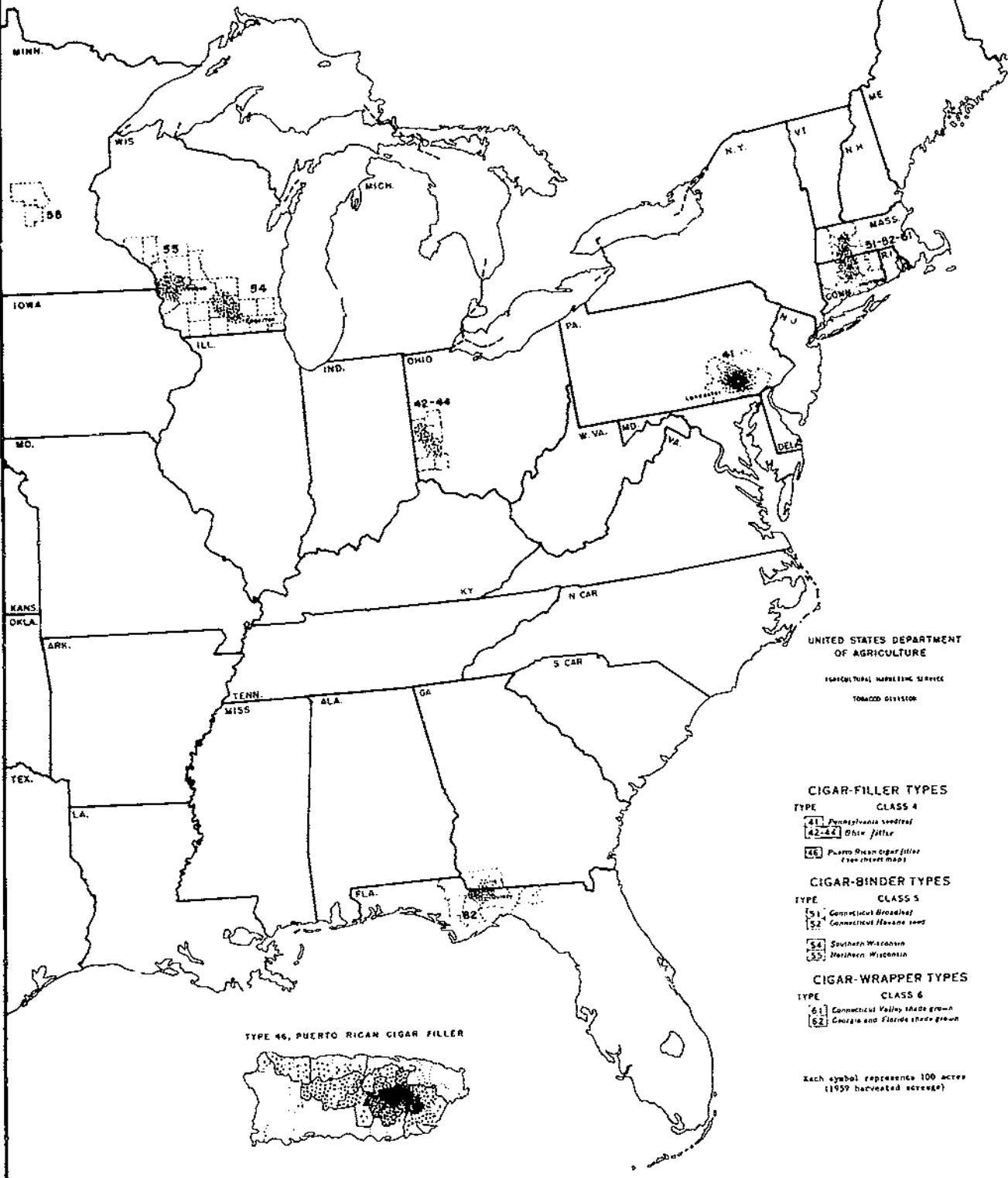
