


MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME AND RELATED DATA, BY COUNTIES
Including Rural Farm Income

INTRODUCTION

Data on median family incomes are a useful analytical and administrative tool for comparing and ranking counties. The median income and other data presented here were assembled primarily to aid in the research program of the Economic Research Service in the problems and processes of area economic development, and to meet similar needs of other agencies concerned with this subject. The information will also be of use to persons interested in other aspects of agriculture involving income comparisons between areas.

The data are presented in three tables. Table I gives 6 items of information for all counties in each of the 50 States: (1) 1959 median incomes of all families, (2) 1949 median incomes of all families (in 1959 dollars), (3) percentage change between 1949 and 1959 in median incomes of all families, (4) 1959 median incomes of rural farm families, (5) percentage of commercial farms in Class VI (farm sales of less than \$2,500) in 1959, and (6) eligibility status of the county (in its entirety or in part), as of October 1, 1963, for assistance from the Area Redevelopment Administration under the terms of Public Law 87-27.

In table II, counties are arranged alphabetically by States into quintiles, according to 1959 median income of all families. The quintile including counties with the highest median family incomes is called the first, and that including counties with the lowest median family incomes is called the fifth. The quintile into which the counties fell in 1949 is denoted by Arabic numerals in parentheses opposite the county name. Thus, Madison County, Ala., the first county listed under FIRST QUINTILE, is followed by (4), to show that in 1949 it fell in the fourth quintile. For Kalawao, Hawaii, classified as a county in 1959, and for Alaska, 1949 data were not available.

In table III, the counties are arranged in quintiles according to median incomes of rural farm families in 1959. The quintile into which the counties fell on the basis of median incomes of all families (table II) is indicated by Roman numerals following county names. Thus, Kings County, Calif., which in 1959 was in the first quintile based on median farm family income and in the second quintile based on median income of all families, is

listed in table III under FIRST QUINTILE, with II opposite the county name. Counties with less than 400 rural farm inhabitants as defined by the census are not included in the quintiles, but are listed at the end of the table as UNCLASSIFIED, with an asterisk denoting the counties that had no rural farm population.

The publications from which statistics were taken are grouped under "Sources of Data" in Literature Cited, page 5. Other publications, not relied upon directly in the preparation of the report, were added for readers interested in additional sources of current income data.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Counties

Income and other data are shown for 3,102 counties. As in the 1960 Census of Population, the 25 parishes of Louisiana and the 24 election districts of Alaska as then constituted are included as county equivalents (5). 1/ Also counted are the District of Columbia; Baltimore City; St. Louis City; Los Alamos, N. Mex.; and Hampton City and Newport News, Va. Although they are distinct political entities, the other 30 independent cities of Virginia are combined with the counties in which they are located in recognition of their interdependence economically and culturally.

Statistics for Yellowstone National Park are reported with the counties of Wyoming.

Incomes

Median income is the income at that point in a distribution which separates recipients into two equal groups, one with incomes above and the other with incomes below the median. Comparisons based on median incomes are less subject to distortion resulting from the presence or absence of small numbers of households with very high and very low incomes than are comparisons based on average incomes. A further reason for the use of median incomes is that low median incomes of farm families and of all families, together with high percentages of low-production commercial farms, are major criteria for designation of farm and other areas for participation in the Area Redevelopment Administration program.

Income data are presented for families only. Information for unattached individuals was not included because income statistics are unduly affected in many counties 2/ with relatively limited civilian populations by the presence of large and fluctuating numbers of military personnel, living in group quarters. Also, some counties have relatively small indigenous populations and comparatively large enrollments of college or university students. Most of these students reside in dormitories, rooming houses, or similar accommodations and are counted as unrelated individuals.

In both the 1950 and 1960 censuses of population, family income was defined as income to the family head and other family members consisting of monetary receipts in the form of (1) wages and salaries, (2) net returns from self-employment in farming or other businesses or professions, and (3) rents, interest, dividends, Social Security benefits, pensions, military allotments, unemployment insurance, public assistance, contributions for support from individuals not part of the immediate household, and so on.

This definition should be kept in mind in comparing these and other data based on the census with such estimates as those of "personal income" made by the Office of Business Economics (15, 16, 17), "money income" compiled in connection with Current Population Reports (14), and "net dollars" and "cash income" as used in Sales Management (18).

Data for 1959 median incomes of all families and of rural farm families are from the individual State reports of the C series for the 1960 Census of Population (6). Comparable statistics for 1949 median incomes of all families are from the B series of State reports for the 1950 Census of Population (4).

Median family incomes in 1949 were expressed in 1959 dollars by increasing reported values by 22.4 percent, the percentage by which consumer prices in general expanded over the 10-year intervening period (3, 8, 9). Nationally, median incomes of all families, as converted in this manner to constant dollars, rose by approximately 50 percent between 1949 and 1959 (table I, p. 85). This was an increase of about \$1,900. At the county level, however, an increase of approximately 50 percent in median family in one county may represent an addition of \$2,500 or more, whereas an expansion by 100 percent or more in another may reflect an increment of \$1,000 or less.

In addition, the possibility should be kept in mind that median values may have been affected more in some counties than in others by understatement of incomes (13, 19). Another possibility is that changes locally may stem from reductions in the number of families in certain farm and other low-income groups. In some counties, this decline was accompanied by no change or a less pronounced decrease in the number of families in the higher income classes. In others, the actual number of families with higher incomes had increased with the opening of added sources of employment by additions to or expansions of industry.

Commercial Farms in Class VI

Percentages of commercial farms in economic class VI in 1959 were computed from the State reports of the census of agriculture taken in the fall of 1959 (7).

Area Redevelopment Act Designations

Subsection 5(a) of the Area Redevelopment Act called for the designation of areas as eligible for assistance on determination of the

existence of severe, long-term unemployment. 3/ More specifically, the areas thus designated were to include those in which the Secretary of Labor found that current unemployment was 6 percent or more of the work force, and had averaged this rate and exceeded the national average (a) by 50 percent for 3 of the preceding 4 calendar years, (b) by 75 percent for 2 of the 3 preceding years, or (c) by 100 percent for 1 of the 2 preceding years.

Subsection 5(b) provided for the designation of additional areas, including Indian Reservations, which did not meet the requirements of the preceding section, but which were found to contain critical "numbers and percentages of low-income families", and in which there existed "substantial and persistent unemployment and underemployment". Listed as relevant factors for consideration in establishing standards for eligibility were (1) relationship of level of family income in the area to national levels of family income, (2) number and proportion of low-income farm families, (3) previous identification with a rural development project administered by the Department of Agriculture, (4) availability of manpower for supplementary employment, and (5) proportion of the population receiving public assistance. Also stipulated was a distribution of redevelopment projects that would provide experience with the program in as many States and under as many varied circumstances as possible.

With the assistance of representatives of the Departments of Agriculture, Interior, and Labor, these basic requirements were incorporated by the Area Redevelopment Administration (1) into the following criteria for classification of 5(b) areas:

5(b) 1, areas of low incomes.--Median family income (from 1960 Population Census) of not more than \$1,887, one-third the national median of \$5,660.

5(b) 2, areas of low farm incomes.--Median rural farm family income (from 1960 Census of Population) of not more than \$1,415, one-fourth the national median family income of \$5,660.

5(b) 3, rural development areas.--As recognized by the Department of Agriculture before May 1, 1961, the date of approval of the Area Redevelopment Act. Participation on the part of the States in this cooperative program was voluntary, and selection of counties and areas was determined largely by local interest in the development of area resources (10, 11).

5(b) 4, areas of low production farming.--Sixty percent or more of commercial farms in economic class VI in 1959.

5(b) 5, very small labor market areas of substantial and persistent unemployment.--Designation to be on the basis of recommendations made by the Bureau of Employment Security using, in so far as available data permit, the same criteria as those used in designating 5(a) areas.

5(b) 6, other areas.--Designated to allow participation in a State or territory otherwise excluded from participation in the Area Redevelopment program, and where inclusion of the county would complete or "round out" an economic grouping.

5(b) Indian Reservations (IR).--Designated with the assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. Criteria include the existence of severe unemployment or underemployment, an inadequate resource base, insufficient incomes to sustain acceptable living standards, and a high rate of dependence on public assistance.

As of October 1, 1963, all or parts of 1,161 counties, comprising more than a third of the counties in the 50 States, were listed as eligible for assistance by the Area Redevelopment Administration (2). Of this total, 917 counties qualified under an individual basis of designation; the others qualified under two or more. Changes of redevelopment area status are contemplated for approximately 175 counties or parts of counties.

The symbol "IR" indicates the presence in the county of an Indian reservation qualifying as an ARA area. In the Dakotas and Minnesota, "IR" is followed by "a" to indicate that the entire county is included in the reservation. The symbol "p" following other area designations (chiefly in New England) means that only part of the county has been designated.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The C series of reports from the 1960 Population Census contain additional county data on incomes, including further detail for the urban, rural nonfarm, and rural farm populations; incomes of persons and selected occupational groups; and average incomes for all earners, wage and salary workers, and self-employed persons. If statistics on aggregate incomes are desired, the task of computing can be avoided by referring to appropriate sections of the county tables in the 1962 County and City Data Book (12). In addition to annual issues of the Survey of Buying Power (18), other private organizations and some State agencies publish various statistics on income and related items at the county level.
