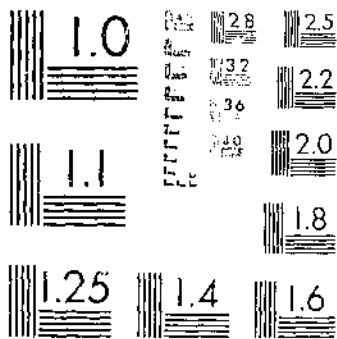

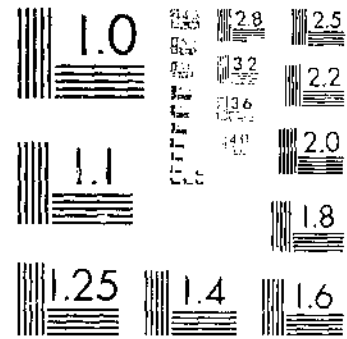

# BRIEF CLASSIFICATION OF LEAF TOBACCO

(Covering classes and types)

## CLASS 1, FLUE-CURED TYPES

- Type 11: Old Belt flue-cured; produced principally in the Piedmont sections of Virginia and North Carolina.
- Type 12: Eastern North Carolina flue-cured; produced principally in the coastal sections of North Carolina, north of the South River.
- Type 13: South Carolina flue-cured; produced principally in the coastal sections of South Carolina and the southeastern counties of North Carolina, south of the South River.
- Type 14: Georgia and Florida flue-cured; produced principally in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

## CLASS 2, FIRE-CURED TYPES

- Type 21: Virginia fire-cured; produced in the Piedmont and mountain sections of Virginia.
- Type 22: Tennessee-Kentucky fire-cured, eastern district, Clarksville, Springfield, and Hopkinsville; produced principally in a section east of the Tennessee River, in southern Kentucky and northern Tennessee.
- Type 23: Kentucky-Tennessee fire-cured, western district, Mayfield, and Murray; produced principally in a section between the Tennessee, Ohio, and Mississippi rivers in western Kentucky and northwestern Tennessee.

## CLASS 3, AIR-CURED TYPES

### LIGHT AIR-CURED (CLASS 3a)

- Type 31: Burley; produced principally in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia, Virginia, North Carolina, and Missouri.
- Type 32: Southern Maryland; produced principally in five counties of southern Maryland--Prince Georges, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Marys.

### DARK AIR-CURED (CLASS 3b)

- Type 35: One Sucker; produced in north-central Tennessee and south-central Kentucky.
- Type 36: Green River; produced in the northern part of Kentucky in the territory adjacent to Owensboro and Henderson.
- Type 37: Virginia sun-cured; produced principally in central Virginia, north of the James River.

## CLASS 4, CIGAR-FILLER TYPES

- Type 41: Pennsylvania Seedleaf; produced principally in Lancaster County, Pa., and the adjoining counties.
- Type 42-44: Ohio filler; produced principally in the Miami Valley section of Ohio and extending into Indiana.
- Type 46: Puerto Rican sun-grown, including primed (Deshojado) and stalk-cut (Mata); produced on the Island of Puerto Rico

## CLASS 5, CIGAR-BINDER TYPES

- Type 51: Connecticut Broadleaf; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.
- Type 52: Connecticut Havana Seed; produced in the Connecticut and Housatonic Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.
- Type 53: New York and Pennsylvania Havana Seed; produced in the Big Flats and Onondaga sections of New York, and extending into Pennsylvania.
- Type 54: Southern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, south and east of the Wisconsin River.
- Type 55: Northern Wisconsin; produced in Wisconsin, north and west of the Wisconsin River, and in eastern Minnesota.

## CLASS 6, CIGAR-WRAPPER TYPES

- Type 61: Connecticut Shade; produced in the Connecticut Valley sections of Connecticut and Massachusetts.
- Type 62: Georgia and Florida Shade; produced in southwestern Georgia and north-central Florida.

## MISCELLANEOUS TYPES OF DOMESTIC TOBACCO

- Type 72: Louisiana Perique.
- Type 73: All domestic types of tobacco not otherwise classified.

## FOREIGN TYPES

- Type 81: Cuba.
- Type 82: Indonesia.
- Type 83: Philippine Islands.
- Type 84: Brazil.
- Type 85: Colombia.
- Type 86: Dominican Republic.
- Type 87: Paraguay.
- Type 88: All foreign-grown cigar-leaf not otherwise classified.
- Type 90: Foreign-grown cigarette and smoking tobacco (Turkish and other).

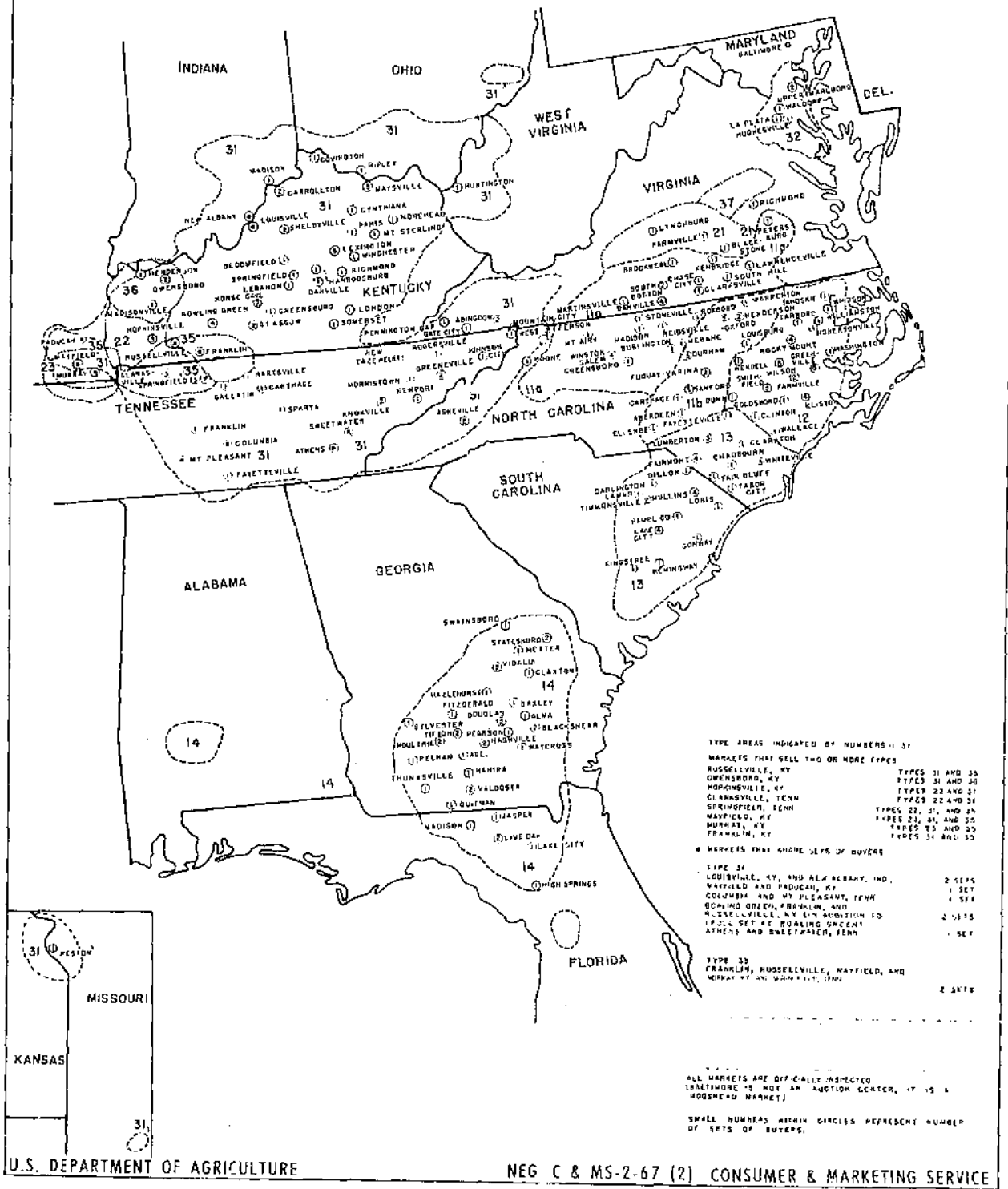

(CIGAR LEAF PRODUCING AREAS NOT SHOWN)



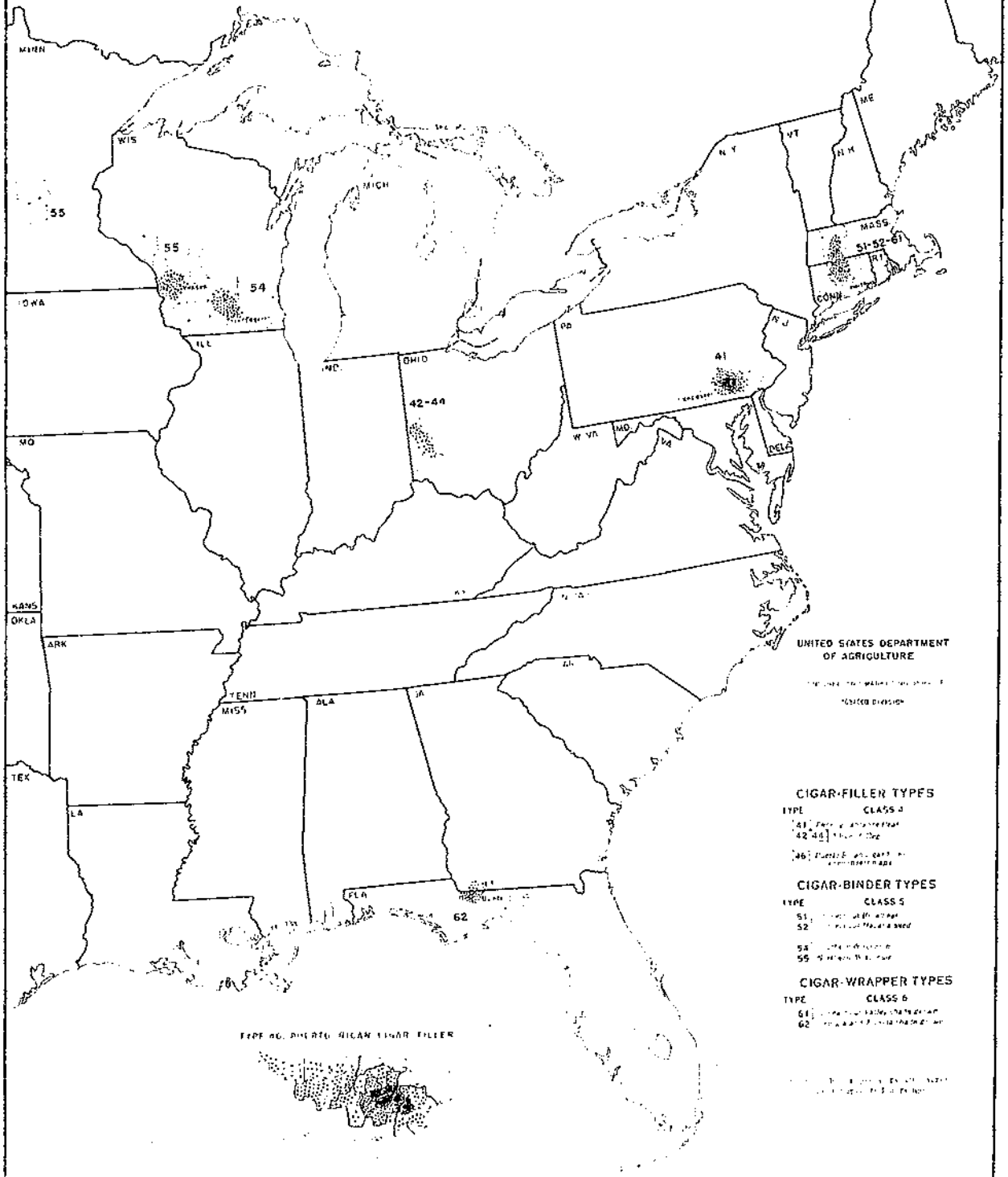

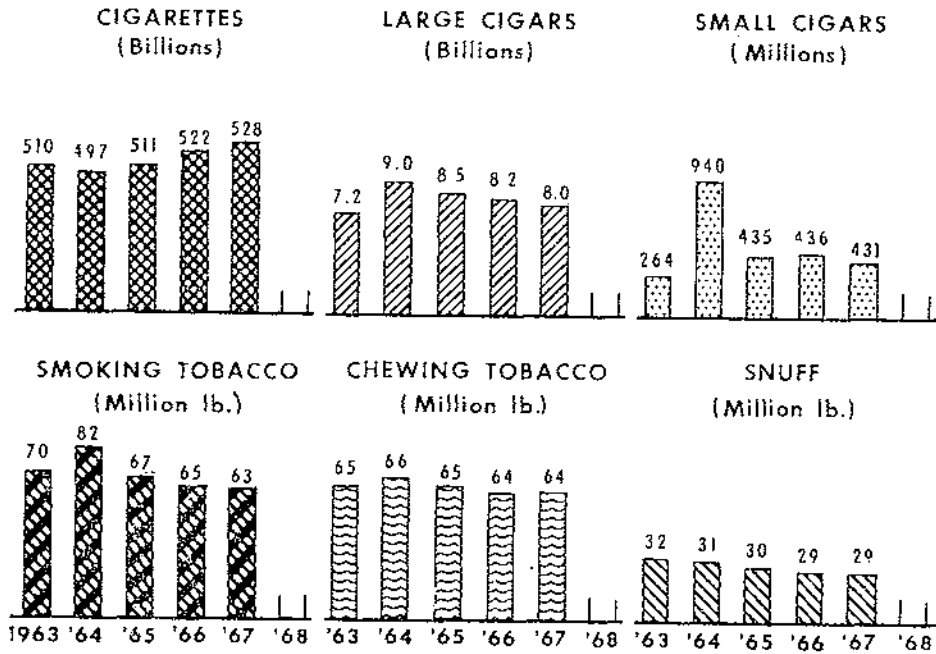

# DOMESTIC CONSUMPTION OF TOBACCO

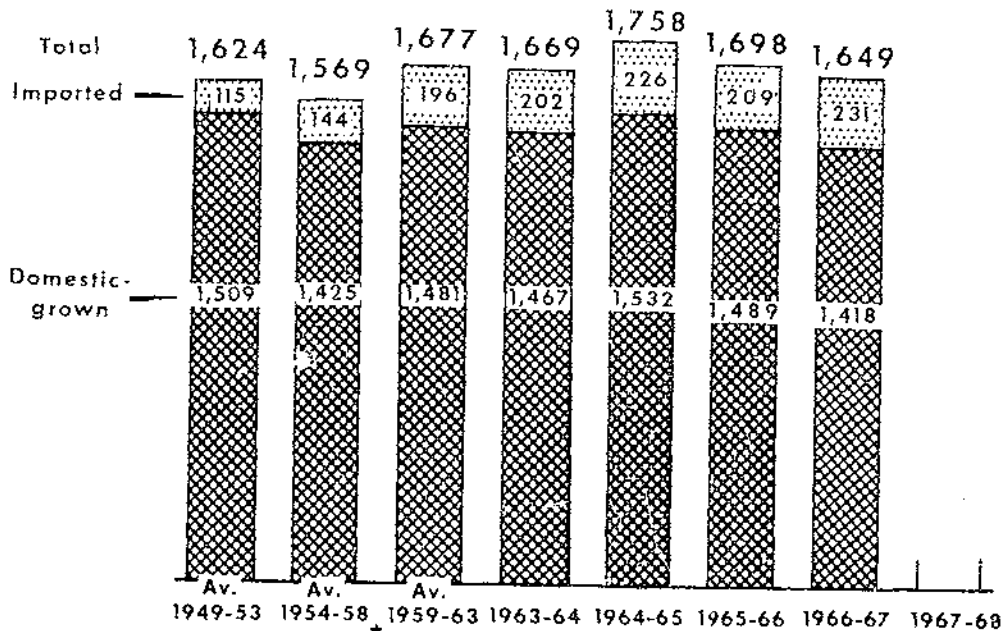

## BRIEF RESUME OF U.S. TOBACCO FOR 1967

### Production

The United States and Puerto Rico tobacco harvest in 1967 totaled 2,019 million pounds compared with 1,900 million in 1966. A larger crop of flue-cured was responsible for the increase. The national average yield per acre (including Puerto Rico) was 2,040 pounds per acre compared with 1,927 in 1966.

### 1966-67 auction marketing season

Table A shows sales and average prices for the 1967 and 1966 crops for those types sold at auction. Maryland markets do not open until April 16, 1968, for sale of the 1967 crop.

Record prices were paid for burley, Kentucky and Tennessee fire-cured, and the three dark air-cured types. The flue-cured crop was 14 million pounds larger than 1966 due to the carry forward of undermarketings from the two prior crops under the acreage-poundage program plus considerable overmarketing this past season. Loan receipts of flue-cured in 1967 jumped to 22.7 percent of sales for the fourth largest volume on record.

The record prices for burley were paid for a crop considered to be superior in quality to the one grown in 1966. It was also a smaller crop by some 48 million pounds. Loan receipts were 12.0 percent of net sales compared with 10.7 percent in 1966. Growers voting in a regular referendum in March approved acreage controls for another three years. Maryland growers voted down controls for the third straight year.

The 1967 crop of Kentucky and Tennessee fire-cured (type 22 and 23) was the smallest ever and sold for the highest price on record. Volume was about 10 million pounds below 1966. Quality was good and loan receipts were extremely small. Virginia fire-cured declined both in volume and price. Quality of the crop was below 1966.

The dark air-cured types followed the same pattern of fire-cured. Record prices were paid for considerably smaller amounts of leaf while loan receipts were minor. Quality of types 35 and 36 was not as good as the 1966 crop, but Virginia sun-cured showed improvement.

## Carryover stock of U.S. tobacco

Tobacco dealers and manufacturers report inventories of leaf tobacco quarterly, with the stocks segregated according to U.S. types. Stocks on hand as of the quarterly reporting date used as the beginning of the marketing year are referred to as carryover stocks. The carryover date is July 1 for flue-cured and shade grown cigar wrapper, and October 1 for all other kinds.

Carryover stocks of U.S. and Puerto Rican tobacco totaled 4,180 million pounds, a drop 222 million pounds from last year's level. Smaller stocks of flue-cured and cigar tobacco accounted for most of the decrease. Loan holdings, as shown in table B, totaled 1,043.5 million pounds and were 134 million below the level of 1966. Manufacturers' holdings were down 108 million pounds for the lowest level in nine years.

## Domestic leaf usage

The indicated use of tobacco in products declined from last year. Consumption of domestic-grown tobacco at 1,418 million pounds, was down 71 million pounds. The usage of imported tobacco rose to a record high of 231 million pounds, 22 million above the previous year.

During the past fiscal year the production of cigarettes showed an increase of almost 2 percent. However, the amount of leaf used in their manufacture was estimated to be lower than the previous year. This estimate is based on the disappearance of the three domestic cigarette types (see table 17-19). Cigar production for the same period showed a decline for the third straight year. Usage of imported cigarette leaf was up 12 million pounds and imported cigar leaf increased by 10 million.

## Tobacco products

Taxable removals of cigarettes for calendar year 1967 reached a new high of 528 billion, a gain of 1.0 percent over 1966 (522 billion). Filter tips continued to increase their share of the market and accounted for close to 73 percent of total sales. The new 100 millimeter brands (all filter tipped) accounted for 10 percent of all sales. Per capita consumption of cigarettes in 1967 was 4,280 per person 18 years and older, which was slightly below the 1966 level.

Removals of large cigars for the year were 8.0 billion, a decline of 2.5 percent from 1966.

Domestic invoices of smoking tobacco for 1967 amounted to 63 million pounds compared to 65 million in 1966. Sales of chewing tobacco were 64 million pounds, the same as the previous year, and snuff remained at 29 million pounds.

Consumers spent approximately 9,460 million dollars for tobacco products in 1967. This was 437 million more than in 1966. Cigarettes accounted for the entire increase. Expenditures were divided as follows: Cigarettes, 8,450 million, (up 5.7 percent); cigars, 710 (down 1.4 percent); and other tobacco products, 300 million (down 2.3 percent).

## Leaf tobacco exports

Exports totaled 642 million pounds (farm-sales-weight) during 1967. This was 17 million pounds above 1966 and the largest since 1946. Flue-cured exports at 528 million pounds increased 19 percent. Burley shipments at 55 million were the same as last year. Maryland exports increased 45 percent to 16 million pounds, which was the largest amount since 1927. Fire-cured and dark air-cured also had higher exports, but cigar wrapper declined. The United Kingdom was the major outlet with 24 percent of the total. West Germany was second with 20 percent and the Netherlands third with 7 percent.
