




## PREFACE

This report presents statistical information on the volume of lumber, plywood, veneer, hardboard, particleboard, insulation board, and bolts used in manufacturing industries in 1965. It includes wood used in products made for sale; wood used for pallets, containers, skids, jigs, models, patterns, and flasks made and used in the same establishment; and wood used for dunnage, blocking, and bracing.

All data were derived from a sample survey of the manufacturing industries in the United States as classified in the 1957 Standard Industrial Classification Manual, as amended, published by the Bureau of the Budget. The survey is the sixth in a series of periodic surveys of wood used in manufacturing, and is one of a group of studies conducted as one phase of the Forest Survey, authorized by Section 9 of the McSweeney-McNary Forest Research Act of 1928, as amended. This act authorized and directed the Secretary of Agriculture to cooperate with state and other agencies "in making and keeping current a comprehensive survey of the present and prospective requirements for timber and other forest products...."

This 1965 survey of wood used in manufacturing industries differs from similar surveys in 1928, 1933, 1940, 1948, and 1960 in some important aspects. Mainly, the 1965 survey covered 127 selected manufacturing industries that were estimated to consume 95 percent of the volume of wood used in 1960. The 1960 survey covered 423 out of 425 manufacturing industries. Surveys prior to 1960 included 189 selected industries that were considered the more important wood users. See Appendix; "Comparability with former surveys" for this and other differences between the individual surveys.

Tables showing the amounts reported by the 127 industries and amounts estimated to have been used by all 423 industries in 1965 are included with the text. The data presented in the detailed appendix tables are based on the 127 reporting industries and have not been adjusted for full industry coverage.

Direct comparison of wood volumes used for specific industries is possible when the industry was included in both the 1960 and 1965 surveys. Direct comparisons of wood used by products are also valid since these amounts are based on the volumes of wood used and purchases of wood items by industries included in both the 1960 and 1965 studies.

The authors and the Forest Service are indebted to the owners and operators of the manufacturing establishments who supplied the basic data, to officials of trade associations who provided advice in formulating the questionnaire, and to personnel of the Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce, for their cooperation throughout the survey.

Special acknowledgement is given to Clark Row for help in planning this survey. The help of James E. Blyth, Dennis B. Bradley, Eugene M. Carpenter, Noel D. Cost, Edwin Kallio, Daniel D. # TOTAL WOOD USED IN MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, 1965

17.5 billion square feet of wood used in 1965--largest volume since 1928

In 1965, manufacturing industries used 17.5 billion square feet, 1-inch basis, of wood (table 1). As shown in the tabulation below, this was 22 percent more than the 14.3 billion square feet consumed in 1960, and the largest volume used since 1928.

Lumber accounted for four-fifths of the wood used

Lumber accounted for 82 percent of the wood used in manufacturing in 1965 (table 1, fig. 1). Bolts composed another 7 percent of the total,



veneer and plywood 7 percent, particleboard 2 percent, and hardboard and insulation board 1 percent each.

The volume of lumber use rose from 11.7 billion square feet, 1-inch basis, in 1960 to 14.3 billion square feet in 1965--a rise of 22 percent. During the same period the use of bolts increased 61 percent, hardboard 45 percent, and particleboard 304 percent. In contrast, the use of veneer decreased 19 percent, and plywood, 22 percent.

### Over one-half of wood used in five industries

Five industries--wood products, n.e.c.<sup>1</sup>; millwork; nonupholstered wood household furniture; hardwood dimension and flooring; and containers--consumed 9.7 billion square feet, or about 56 percent of the total volume of wood used in 1965 (table 2 and fig. 2). Substantial amounts of wood were also used in prefabricated wooden structures and structural members, other furniture and fixtures, trailer coaches, morticians' goods industries, and in certain industries in the primary metal and machinery groups (app. table 1).

### Wood used in manufacturing industries, by industry, 1965



Between 1960 and 1965, most of the principal using industries showed a large increase in wood use. For example, use in wood products, n.e.c., industry rose 59 percent, and use in nonupholstered wood household furniture, 50 percent. In contrast to these general trends, however, use in the wooden container industry, except cooperage, decreased 12 percent, and the prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members industry fell 26 percent.

### Three-fourths of the wood used went into six major products

More than 12.6 billion square feet of wood--76 percent of the total used in 1965--went into furniture, millwork, containers, pallets, flooring, and prefabricated wooden buildings and structural member products (table 3 and fig. 3). As in 1960, the largest volume of wood--23 percent of the total--was consumed in furniture products. The second largest volume--15 percent of the total--was used in millwork products.

Wood use in furniture and millwork showed substantial increases between 1960 and 1965 (fig. 4). There was also some increase in use for pallets. Wood used for containers, however, has been consistently declining for a number of years. As a result, use in wooden containers in 1965 was 2.2 billion square feet--3 percent below 1960 and the smallest volume ever reported in this series of studies. Use in flooring in 1960 and 1965 was unchanged at a level of about 1.2 billion square feet of wood.

### Wood used in manufactured products, by product, 1965





## Eighty-five percent of wood used went into products made for sale

Of the total 17.5 billion square feet of wood used in 1965, 85 percent went into products made for sale; 10 percent into containers, pallets, jigs, models, patterns, and flasks made and used in the same plant; and 5 percent into dunnage (table 4).

In the 1960-65 period, wood use in products made for sale rose 24 percent. There were also increases in the volume of wood used in pallets and dunnage. Use in containers, however, showed a 10 percent decline.

## Dollar value of purchases of wooden parts, containers, and pallets up 60 percent over 1960

The estimated value of purchases of wooden parts, containers, and pallets in all manufacturing industries in 1965 was \$1,403 million—60 percent higher than the dollar value of purchases in 1960 (table 5 and app. tables 36 and 37). Three-fifths of the total purchases in 1965 were purchases of dimension, cut-to-size stock, and fabricated parts. Pallets and wooden containers composed most of the remainder.

Purchases of most items showed an upward trend between 1960 and 1965. The rise was especially large for dimension, cut-to-size stock, and prefabricated parts, with the total value of purchases nearly doubling.

The nonupholstered wood household furniture industry purchased \$178.2 million of dimension, cut-to-size, and fabricated parts in 1965 (table

6). This is about a fifth of all purchases of dimension and cut-to-size items. Substantial purchases were also made in several other industries such as the millwork industry.

Most industries showed a substantial increase in purchases between 1960 and 1965. The growth was largest in the trailer coach, cooperage, and nonupholstered wood household furniture industries.

## Changes in wood use per \$1,000 of value of shipments varied between forms of wood and industries

There were large variations in the amount of wood use per \$1,000 of value of shipments in manufacturing industries in 1965 (table 7 and app. table 5). Lumber use, for example, ranged from as low as 2 board feet per \$1,000 of shipments in industries such as motor vehicles and parts, to 6,909 board feet per \$1,000 in the wooden container, except cooperage, industry. The largest use per \$1,000 of shipments for all forms of wood--lumber, veneer, plywood, hardboard, and insulation board--was in the five major wood-using industries listed in table 7.

There were varying trends in wood use per \$1,000 of shipments in the wood-using industries between 1960 and 1965. The five major wood-using industries, with few exceptions, showed an increase in wood use for all forms of wood, except plywood, which decreased in four of the five industries (table 7). Most other industries showed some decline for all forms of wood.

# LUMBER

**14.3 billion board feet of lumber used in 1965--substantially above earlier surveys**

In 1965, manufacturing industries used about 14.3 billion board feet of lumber (table 8). This was roughly 20 percent above the volumes reported in 1940, 1948, and 1960 and was nearly 3 times the volume in 1933.

The trend in lumber use in earlier survey years closely paralleled the trend in total lumber consumption in the U.S. As a result, in all years manufacturing industries used about a third of the lumber consumed in the country.

Five industries--millwork, wood products, n.e.c.; nonupholstered wood household furniture; hardwood dimension and flooring; and containers--were the major lumber users in 1965 accounting for 58 percent of the lumber used in 1965 (table 9, fig. 5, and app. table 6). Substantial volumes were also used in the prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, saw-

## Lumber used in manufacturing industries, 1965



mill and planing mills, upholstered wood household furniture, and trailer coach industries.

There were large increases in lumber use between 1960 and 1965 in all of the major wood-using industries except wooden containers. Use in this industry showed a slight decrease from 1.2 billion board feet in 1960 to 1.1 billion board feet in 1965.

## Over three-fourths of lumber used in five products

About 10.4 billion board feet, or 77 percent of the total lumber consumed in 1965, was used in the manufacture of five products: furniture; millwork; pallets; wooden containers, except cooperage; and flooring (table 10, fig. 6 and app. tables 13 through 16). The largest part of the remaining volume was used in the manufacture of prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, trailer coaches, motor vehicles, handles, and caskets.

Between 1960 and 1965, the volume of lumber used in most of the important wood-using products showed a substantial rise. There was, however, no significant change in the volume used for flooring and a small decline in the amount used for prefabricated wooden building and structural members.

## No trend in use of softwood lumber but hardwood use rising

Of the lumber used in manufacturing industries in 1965, more than half, or 7.3 billion board feet, was cut from native softwood species (table 11 and app. tables 7 through 10). Although this volume was 22 percent higher than in 1960, it is not significantly different from the volumes consumed in 1940 and 1948.

## Lumber used in manufactured products, 1965



Hardwood lumber cut from native species accounted for slightly less than half of the lumber used in manufacturing in 1965. The volume consumed, however—6.9 billion board feet—was nearly double the volume reported in 1948 and 23 percent higher than that of 1960.

Ponderosa pine, Douglas fir, and southern yellow pine accounted for 47 percent of the softwood used (fig. 7). Oak was the principal hardwood species, representing 29 percent of total hardwood consumption (fig. 8). Maple, yellow-poplar, and gum were also important, each accounting for about 9 percent of hardwood volume consumed.

Millwork plants used 1.8 billion board feet of softwood lumber, or 27 percent of all native softwood lumber used (app. table 7). Other industries using large volumes of softwood lumber were the wood products, n.e.c., industry; prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members; and the nailed and lock corner wooden boxes and crates industry.

The hardwood dimension and flooring industry used 1.6 billion board feet or 25 percent of the total native hardwood lumber consumed in the manufacturing industries. The second largest

### Native softwood lumber used in manufacturing industries, by species, 1965



### Native hardwood lumber used in manufacturing industries, by species, 1965



consumer was the nonupholstered wood household furniture industry which used 22 percent of the native hardwoods consumed.

About 104 million board feet, or one percent of the total lumber used in manufacturing industries in 1965, was cut from imported woods.

Lumber from imported wood included 40 million board feet of mahogany, 25 million board feet of Philippine hardwoods, and 38 million board feet of other woods, such as banak, obeche, virola, and balsa.

The nonupholstered wood household furniture industry used 29 percent of the imported woods. The next two largest consumers were the mill-work industry (21 percent) and the boat building and repairing industry (15 percent).

## Most lumber used in products made for sale

Lumber used in products made for sale amounted to 11.8 billion board feet in 1965 and comprised 83 percent of the total volume consumed in the manufacturing industries (table 12). The remaining 2.5 billion board feet was almost equally divided between pallets and containers (made for own use), for dunnage, and a small volume (less than 0.5 percent) for jigs, models, patterns, and flasks (made for own use). Among products made for own use, except containers, lumber use increased between 1960 and 1965.

About half of the softwood lumber and 57 percent of the hardwood lumber used in products made for sale in 1965 was medium grade mate-

rial (app. tables 11 and 12). However, there was large variation in the grades of lumber used by the various industries. Wood office furniture manufacturers used the highest percentage of high quality softwoods. Special product sawmills consumed the largest percentage of high grade hardwoods. The wooden box and shook industry used mostly low grade softwoods and medium grade hardwoods. The pallet industry used large quantities of both low grade softwoods and low grade hardwoods.

## BOLTS

### 1.2 billion board feet of bolts used in 1965--61 percent more than in 1960

The volume of bolts used in manufacturing industries in 1965 was 1,242 million board feet--61 percent above 1960 (table 13 and app. table 17).

Special product mills<sup>2</sup> consumed the greatest volume of bolts used in 1965--37 percent of the total. The wood products, n.e.c., industry,

which produces wood turnings, wooden novelties, woodenware, and handles from bolts, consumed another 21 percent of the total. The hardwood dimension and flooring industry and the cooperage industry were also significant, using 12 percent and 10 percent respectively. Building paper and building board mills, wooden container industries, and sawmills and planing mills consumed most of the remainder.

Nearly half of the bolts consumed in 1965 went into cooperage. The manufacture of shingles used another 18 percent (table 14). Sizable volumes of bolts were also used for products such as containers, sporting goods, and furniture.

The use of bolts for cooperage nearly tripled between 1960 and 1965. There was also a substantial rise in use of shingles and a small increase in use in all other products.

About two-thirds of the total volume of bolts (841 million board feet) used in 1965 was hardwoods, the same proportion as in 1960 (app.

table 18). White oak, used principally for cooperage, was the most important hardwood species. Three-fifths of the softwoods used was western redcedar, used principally for shingles.

Use of nearly all species showed an increase in 1965 over the 1960 volumes.

## VENEER

Veneer use in manufacturing totaled 4.4 billion square feet in 1965-- slightly below 1960

In 1965, manufacturing industries used about 4.4 billion square feet (surface measure) of veneer (table 15 and app. table 19). This was about 1 percent below the volume in 1960, the only earlier survey year for which comparable data are available.

About 28 percent of the veneer used in 1965 was consumed in the wooden container industry and 25 percent in the nonupholstered wood household furniture industry. Another 23 percent was used in veneer and plywood plants in the manufacture of veneer for cut-to-size parts for resale (table 15 and fig. 9).

The small decline in veneer used in manufacturing between 1960 and 1965 reflected a 38 percent drop in use in the container

## Veneer used in manufacturing industries, by industry, 1965



industries, the largest user of veneer in both 1960 and 1965. In contrast, consumption in the nonupholstered wood household furniture industry increased 64 percent and millwork plants 80 percent in the 1960-65 period. Practically all of the veneer consumed in 1965 was used in products made for sale.

### Two-thirds of the veneer used in the manufacture of furniture and containers

Thirty-four percent of the veneer used in 1965 went into the manufacture of furniture (table 16, fig. 10, and app. table 24). An additional 31 percent was consumed in the manufacture of containers. Other important veneer-using products were millwork, 464 million square feet, and matches, 209 million square feet. Smaller amounts were used in trailer coaches, musical instruments, handles, and flooring.

## Veneer used in manufactured products, by product, 1965



The 1965 level of veneer consumption was higher than that of 1960 in furniture, millwork, and matches, but lower in containers and all other products.

## Eighty-eight percent of the veneer used in 1965 cut from native hardwood species

Native hardwood species comprised about 88 percent of the total veneer used in 1965 (table 17 and app. table 20). The most important hardwood species were gum--20 percent of the total--and yellow-poplar with 17 percent. Other important species were black walnut, birch, and oak.

Native softwoods, primarily Douglas fir and the true firs, accounted for 6 percent of the veneer used in 1965. Imported woods, mostly Philippine hardwoods and mahogany, made up the remaining 6 percent.

The wood household furniture industry consumed about 27 percent of the native hardwood veneer used in 1965 (app. table 22). Other industries using large volumes of native hardwood veneer were the veneer and plywood plants (26 percent) and the wirebound boxes and crates plants (19 percent).

The wooden container industries used 158 million square feet, or 62 percent of the total native softwood veneers (app. table 21). Other important using industries included paper mills (13 percent) and the nonupholstered wood household furniture industries (9 percent).

The millwork industry was the largest user of imported veneers consuming 130

million square feet or 49 percent of the total imported veneers (app. table 23). The nonupholstered wood household furniture industry used another 21 percent. Other major imported veneer-using industries were the trailer coaches and the veneer and plywood plants.

## PLYWOOD

### Almost 2.2 billion square feet of plywood used in 1965--22 percent below 1960

Plywood used in manufacturing industries amounted to 2.2 billion square feet, 3/8-inch basis, in 1965 (table 18). This level of consumption was 22 percent below the volume used in 1960.

Ninety-three percent of the plywood consumed in 1965 was used in products made for sale (app. table 26). The remaining 7 percent went into dunnage and products made and used in the same establishment.

Seven industries used about two-thirds of the plywood consumed in manufacturing in 1965 (fig. 11, table 18, and app. table 27). The nonupholstered wood household furniture industry was the largest user of plywood, consuming one-fifth of the total. The trailer coach industry, millwork plants, container industries, partitions and fixtures industry, and the prefabricated wood products industry, together, used about half of the total. The remaining 32 percent was used in varying quantities in almost all of the other industries included in the survey.

Five of the seven principal plywood-using industries consumed less plywood in 1965 than

## Plywood used in manufacturing industries, by industry, 1965



in 1960. Only the trailer coach industry showed a significant gain in the use of plywood. There was little change in the volume of plywood used in veneer and plywood industry between 1960 and 1965.

## One-third of plywood used in furniture

About a third of the plywood used in 1965 was consumed in the manufacture of furniture (table 19, fig. 12, and app. table 31). An additional 17 percent went into the manufacture of trailer coaches. Large volumes were also used for millwork and containers (app. table 32).

Of the major products, only trailer coaches showed an increase in use, up 27 percent from the 1960 level. Use in furniture declined 11 percent and in containers 60 percent.

## Plywood used in manufactured products, by product, 1965



Softwood plywood accounted for 56 percent of total--nearly all Douglas fir

Softwood plywood composed 56 percent of the plywood used in manufacturing in 1965 (table 20 and app. table 28). About 94 percent of the softwood was made from Douglas fir.

Native hardwood plywood composed another 34 percent of the plywood consumed in 1965 (app. table 29). Birch, gum, oak, and black walnut were the most important hardwood species.

Imported plywoods accounted for 10 percent of total use in 1965 (app. table 30). Philippine hardwoods composed about 66 percent of the

imports. Mahogany, imported birch, and "other" comprised 1 percent each of the total plywood.

In 1965, the trailer coach industry used about 23 percent of the softwood plywood. Other industries using large volumes of softwood plywood were the prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, nonupholstered wood household furniture, and millwork plants, each consuming about 8 percent of the total volume.

Forty-two percent of native hardwood plywood was used in the nonupholstered wood household furniture industry. Other important users of native hardwood plywood were the millwork and veneer and plywood industries.

Three industries, millwork, nonupholstered wood household furniture, and trailer coaches, used 80 percent of the imported plywood. Substantial volumes were also used in the wood partitions and fixtures industry and the boat building and repair industry.

### TRENDS IN COMBINED USE OF VENEER AND PLYWOOD

Veneer and plywood use totaled 3.1 billion square feet in 1965--one-fifth less than in 1960

The combined volume of veneer and plywood used in 1965 was 3.1 billion square feet, 3/8-inch basis--21 percent below the level of use in 1960 but about the same as that in 1948 (table 21 and fig. 13).

In both 1965 and 1960, about 43 percent of the veneer and plywood used was softwoods, 48 per-

cent hardwoods, and 9 percent imported woods. In the earlier surveys this proportion was roughly one-third softwoods, two-thirds hardwoods, with only a small volume of imported woods.

Douglas fir has been the most important softwood species in all survey years. Gum and yellow-poplar have been the leading hardwood species in recent survey years.

## Trends in veneer and plywood used in manufacturing industries



## HARDBOARD<sup>3</sup>

Manufacturing industries consumed almost 1.8 billion square feet of hardboard--45 percent above use in 1960

Hardboard used in manufacturing in 1965 totaled 1.8 billion square feet, 1/8-inch basis (table 22 and app. table 33). This was 45 percent above the 1.2 billion square feet used in 1960, the only earlier year for which data are available.

The nonupholstered wood household furniture industry was the major user of hardboard, accounting for 21 percent of the total use in 1965 (table 22, fig. 14, and app. table 33). Veneer and plywood plants ranked second with 20 percent of the total. Substantial amounts of hardboard were also used in millwork; wood products, n.e.c.; partitions and fixtures; and prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members industries.

Consumption of hardboard in 1965 by the non-upholstered wood household furniture industry was 88 percent above the 1960 level of consumption, and that in millwork plants, 257 percent more. Consumption by wood products, n.e.c., industry in 1965 showed a very large rise of 488 percent over the 1960 level, but this

### Hardboard\* used in manufacturing industries, by industry, 1965



was probably due more to the change in classification which shifted hardboard cut-up plants from the paper industry to wood products, n.e.c., than to an actual increase in consumption in this industry. In contrast to these upward trends, the house trailer coach industry and most other industries used significantly less hardboard in 1965 than in 1960.

### One-third of hardboard used in furniture

About one-third, or 566 million square feet (1/8-inch basis), of all hardboard went into furniture in 1965 (table 23 and app. table 3). Large volumes of hardboard also were used in such products as millwork, 256 million square feet; fixtures and partitions, 98 million square feet; trailer coaches, 91 million square feet; and prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, 84 million square feet.

## INSULATION BOARD<sup>4</sup>

### Insulation board used in 1965 totaled 241 million square feet

In 1965 manufacturing industries used about 241 million square feet, 1/2-inch basis, of insulation board--7 percent of U.S. production (app. table 34). Practically all of this was consumed in products made for sale.

### Over half of the insulation board used in the manufacture of trailer coaches

The trailer coach industry was the largest consumer of insulation board in 1965, using 128 million square feet, over one-half of the total (table 24). Other industries using signifi-

The use of hardboard in 1965 in all major products increased over the 1960 level, except for trailer coaches.

cant amounts were millwork plants, prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, sheet metal plants, and hardwood dimension and flooring plants. The latter four industries consumed 94 million square feet, or about 39 percent, of the insulation board used.

In 1965, 53 percent of the total insulation board was used in manufacturing trailer coaches (table 25, app. table 3). Another two-fifths was used in millwork, prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members, metal siding, and refrigerators and air conditioners. The remaining volume went into a wide variety of products.

## PARTICLEBOARD

Particleboard used amounted to 570 million square feet--four times the volume used in 1960

Manufacturing industries consumed 570 million square feet, 3/4-inch basis, of particleboard in 1965 (table 26 and app. table 35). This was slightly more than four times the volume used in 1960, the only earlier year for which data are available.

Two industries account for over half of the consumption of particleboard

More than one-third--196 million square feet--of the particleboard consumed in 1965 was in the nonupholstered wood household furniture industry, and about one-fifth, by the wood products, n.e.c., industry (fig. 15, table 26, and app. table 35). Most of the particleboard used in this last industry was manufactured into cut-to-size custom stock which was shipped to other industries. Other industries using large amounts of particleboard were partitions and fixtures manufacturers, metal household furniture producers, and millwork plants. These three industries together consumed about one-fourth of the particleboard used.

Particleboard use in 1965 was 304 percent above 1960 levels in all manufacturing industries. The rise was especially large in the

### Particleboard used in manufacturing industries, by industry, 1965



nonupholstered wood household furniture industry where use increased 460 percent.

### Over four-fifths of particleboard used in two products--furniture and partitions and fixtures

Approximately 62 percent of the particleboard used by manufacturers in 1965 went into the production of furniture (table 27). Partitions and fixtures, a product closely related to furniture, used another 14 percent. Significant quantities of particleboard were also used in millwork and trailer coaches.

## APPENDIX

### Definition of Terms

Containers, wooden.--Includes nailed and lock-corner wooden boxes and shook; wirebound boxes made from lumber, veneer, and plywood; and veneer and plywood containers, except boxes and crates, including pails, drums, tubs, fruit and vegetable baskets, and hampers.

Cooperage.--Includes slack and tight cooperage. The cooperage industry (SIC 2445) includes establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing barrels, tubs, hogshead, and other containers made of staves, except fruit and vegetable baskets (Industry 2443). Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing tobacco hogshead stock are classified in Industry 2421, and those manufacturing cooperage stock in Industry 2429.

Establishment.--A factory, mill, or plant operating at a single location and performing a specified range of operations or producing a specified range of products.

Furniture and fixtures, n.e.c. (SIC 2599).--Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing furniture and fixtures, not elsewhere classified, including furniture especially designed for use in restaurants and factories. It also includes office and store fixtures, except metal and wood.

Hardboard.--A felted, wood-base, panel material manufactured of wood fibers, refined or partly refined, and formed into a panel having a density of approximately 26 pounds per cubic-foot or more, as defined by the Bureau of the Census for 1965. Newer definitions have been developed which define felted panels as: structural insulating board--density of 31 to 50 pounds per cubic-foot; and hardboard--density of over 50 pounds per cubic-foot. This report has retained the 1965 definition.

Hardware, n.e.c. (SIC 3429).--Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing miscellaneous metal products, usually termed "hardware," not elsewhere classified. Includes such items as builders' hardware, cabinet hardware, furniture hardware, door locks, fireplace equipment, luggage hardware, marine hardware, and vehicle hardware.

Household furniture, n.e.c. (SIC 2519).--Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing

reed, rattan, wicker, and plastic furniture.

Industry.--A group of establishments primarily engaged in the same or similar lines of manufacturing and having a high degree of specialization within the industry.

Insulating board.--A fibrous-felted, homogeneous, or laminated panel having a density range of approximately 10 to 26 pounds per cubic-foot.

Manufacturing industries.--Manufacturing industries comprise all establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing as defined in the 1957 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Manual and its revisions: Manufacturing is the mechanical or chemical transformation of substances into products. The assembly of component parts or products is also considered to be manufacturing if the result is neither a structure nor other fixed improvement. These activities, usually carried on in plants, factories, or mills; characteristically use power-driven machines and handling equipment.

The following industries are of special interest and are described under their alphabetic heading in this section:

Pallets.--Includes single-face and double-face pallets and all types of pallet boxes or bins.

Particleboard.--A panel material composed of small, discrete pieces of wood that are bonded together in presence of heat and pressure by a synthetic resin adhesive.

Prefabricated wooden buildings and structural members (SIC 2433).--Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing prefabricated

wooden buildings, sections, and panels; or in producing laminated or fabricated trusses, arches, and other structural members of lumber. Prefabrication on the construction site is not included in this industry.

Product.--The end item from materials processed by manufacturing establishments. The final product of a manufacturing establishment may be "finished" in that it is ready for utilization or consumption, or it may be "semi-finished" to become a raw material for an establishment engaged in further manufacturing.

Sawmills and planing mills (SIC 2421).--Only plants included which produced an annual value of \$50,000 in shipments of softwood cut stock, softwood flooring, and other general sawmill and planing mill products, n.e.c., such as tobacco hogshead stock, cooling tower stock, crossarm stock, and snow fence lath. Also included were plants producing \$50,000 value of shipments of products not primary to this industry, such as containers, furniture, millwork, etc. Products primary to this industry, such as rough lumber, sawed ties, and dressed lumber (ceiling, framing, matched, partition, shiplapped siding), were excluded in the survey.

Special product sawmills, n.e.c. (SIC 2429).--Mills primarily engaged in manufacturing excelsior, wood shingles and shakes, and cooperage stock. Wood flour and chips normally are in this industry but were excluded in this survey.

Species grouping.--Douglas fir and [western] larch are often reported in combination, and no attempt is made to separate such volumes. Cedar, eastern white, includes nothern and Atlantic white cedar. Tupelo includes water tupelo and black tupelo because of the difficulty in differentiation. Mahogany includes tropical American mahogany and Khaya, which is also known as African mahogany or Nigerian mahogany. Most manufacturers report only "Mahogany," and it is not possible to distinguish the two kinds. Parana pine is also known as Brazilian araucaria. Other foreign woods includes relatively large volumes of ayous, banak, cativo, cumala, shina, European birch, European elm, and Japanese birch.

Sporting and athletic goods, n.e.c. (SIC 3949).--Establishments primarily engaged in manufacturing sporting and athletic goods, not

elsewhere classified, such as fishing tackle; golf and tennis goods; baseball, gymnasium, and playground equipment; billiard and pool tables; and bowling alleys and equipment.

Standard Industrial Classification (SIC).--The standard industrial classification system in 1963 delineated 21 major groups and 425 detailed industries in the manufacturing segment of the economy. Each detailed industry was identified by a 4-digit number. Each industrial group comprised one or more of the 4-digit industries that have the same first three digits. Similarly, a major group consisted of the 3-digit groups that have the same first two digits and was identified by the 2-digit number.

Standard units of measure.--The standard units of measure used in this report by form of wood:

Veneer and plywood mills (SIC 2437).--Establishments primarily engaged in producing commercial veneer and those primarily engaged in manufacturing commercial plywood. Establishments primarily engaged in the production of veneer which is used in the same establishment for the manufacture of end products, such as fruit and vegetable baskets, are classed in Industry 2443, and wood boxes in industries 2441 and 2442. In this survey, veneer and plywood plants reported only the volumes of veneer or plywood used in remanufacture for cut-to-size (custom) stock.

Wood products, n.e.c. (SIC 2499).--Establishments primarily engaged in turning and shaping wood and manufacturing miscellaneous wood products, not elsewhere classified, such as lasts and related products, cork products, mirror and picture frames, baskets (except fruit), wood and sheet metal combination cooling towers, wood dowels, wood garment hangers, wood handles, wood ladders, wood and metal combination pallets and skids, toilet seats, snowfence, particleboard, and hardboard. In this survey only cut-to-size particleboard and hardboard were included; standard size panels and wall paneling were not included.

## Survey Procedure

This 1965 study of wood use in manufacturing was based on a survey of 127 major wood-using industries out of the total of 425 industries. The 127 industries are estimated to use about 95 percent of all wood utilized by the manufacturing segment of the economy for products made for sale and materials handling. Wood used for construction or maintenance of buildings and similar activities was excluded.

Sampling rates were determined by optimum allocation based on variations in wood use within employee size classes found in the 1960 study. Based on the predetermined sampling rates, a sample of 20,488 of the 60,122 establishments in the 127 four-digit industries was selected for study. In all cases except one, no establishment with fewer than five employees was sampled. An exception was made in SIC 2499, Wood Products, n.e.c., in which are included such diverse items as mirrors and picture frames, tool handles, pallets and skids, pencil slates, ladders, dowels, particleboard, and hardboard--all typically made by very small firms.

In industry 2421, Sawmills and Planing Mills, relatively few establishments do a substantial business converting standard-size lumber into finished products, parts, or cut-to-size stock. In this industry, plants were selected that shipped secondary parts with an annual value of \$50,000 or more.

Questionnaires were mailed by the Bureau of the Census on October 13, 1966. Three follow-up mailings were made approximately three weeks apart. The first and second mailings were reminder cards, and the third was a duplicate of the original packet. Census cutoff date was December 15, 1966. Personnel of the forest experiment stations made about 1,000 field follow-ups of the larger nonrespondent plants, in addition to the mail follow-up by the Bureau of the Census. The final cutoff date for receiving forms was February 15, 1967.

Questionnaires were returned to the Bureau of the Census and forwarded to the Forest Service for editing, coding, and analyzing. During editing and coding, every effort was made to discover and correct reporting errors. When necessary, manufacturers were asked for further information.

After editing and coding, the information was punched on cards and verified. Verified cards that were incomplete or contained inconsistent or impossible data were examined and corrected. The data were then tabulated by computer.

Specialists in the Forest Service, trade associations, and wood industries examined the resulting preliminary tables for reasonableness and consistency. Final corrections were based on further review, reappraisal of the original questionnaires and editing, coding, and punching.

## Accuracy of Survey

The survey was designed to obtain, on a national basis, an estimate of: 1) consumption of lumber and plywood for each industry, within a maximum error of 10 percent, and 2) consumption of other forms of wood, within a maximum error of 15 percent. The within-industry sampling rates varied from 4 to 100 percent of the establishment population as determined by optimum allocation based on variations in wood use found in the 1960 study.

The calculated standard errors of estimate for national totals were 2 percent for lumber, 7 percent for bolts, 6 percent for veneer, 3 percent for plywood, 7 percent for hardboard, 13 percent for insulation board, and 9 percent for particleboard.

The errors of estimate in some industries and forms of wood were larger than the desired  $10 \pm$  percent. Thus, some of the 127 industries were combined with related industries to obtain groups with an acceptable error of estimate. To avoid combining unrelated industries, data with a standard error larger than 15 percent are shown for some industries or groups of industries (app. table 1).

## Comparability with Former Surveys

The 1965 survey of wood use in manufacturing industries differs in some important respects from earlier surveys. The major differences are as follows:

1. Surveys prior to 1960 included 189 selected industries that were considered the most important wood users. The 1960 survey covered 423 out of 425 manufacturing industries. The 1965 survey covered 127 selected manufacturing industries that were estimated to consume 95

percent of the volume of wood used in 1960. The following tabulation gives the estimated additional volume used in the 296 manufacturing industries not surveyed in 1965.

2. The 1965 and 1960 survey collected data on wood use in manufacturing industries as defined in the Standard Industrial Classification Manual; previous surveys collected data only on wood use by products; i.e., containers, furniture, etc.

3. The 1965 and 1960 surveys were sample surveys; previous surveys covered 100 percent of the establishments in the 189 selected industries included in them.

4. Other differences have resulted from the modification of industry definitions. In all appendix tables that show data for earlier years, adjustments have been made to obtain comparability for changes in industry definitions.
