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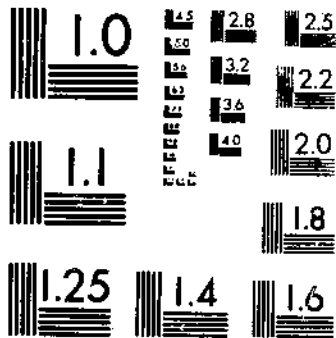
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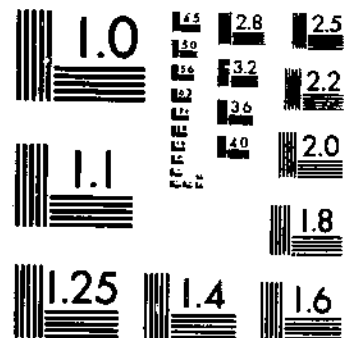

1976 SUMMARY OF FEDERAL MILK ORDER MARKET STATISTICS

Federal milk marketing orders are established under the authority of the Agricultural Marketing Agreement Act of 1937, as amended. The Secretary of Agriculture is authorized by this statute, under certain conditions and with producer approval, to issue milk marketing orders which require handlers to pay at least the minimum specified prices for milk purchased from producers. The complete orders are published in the United States Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 1000 to 1199.

This is an annual summary of statistical data published in a monthly report which also is entitled, "Federal Milk Order Market Statistics." These data have been compiled from reports made by market administrators who administer these orders in the respective markets. The data for 1976 are preliminary; those for 1975 are revised.

MILK MARKETING AREAS UNDER FEDERAL ORDERS AS OF JANUARY 1, 1977

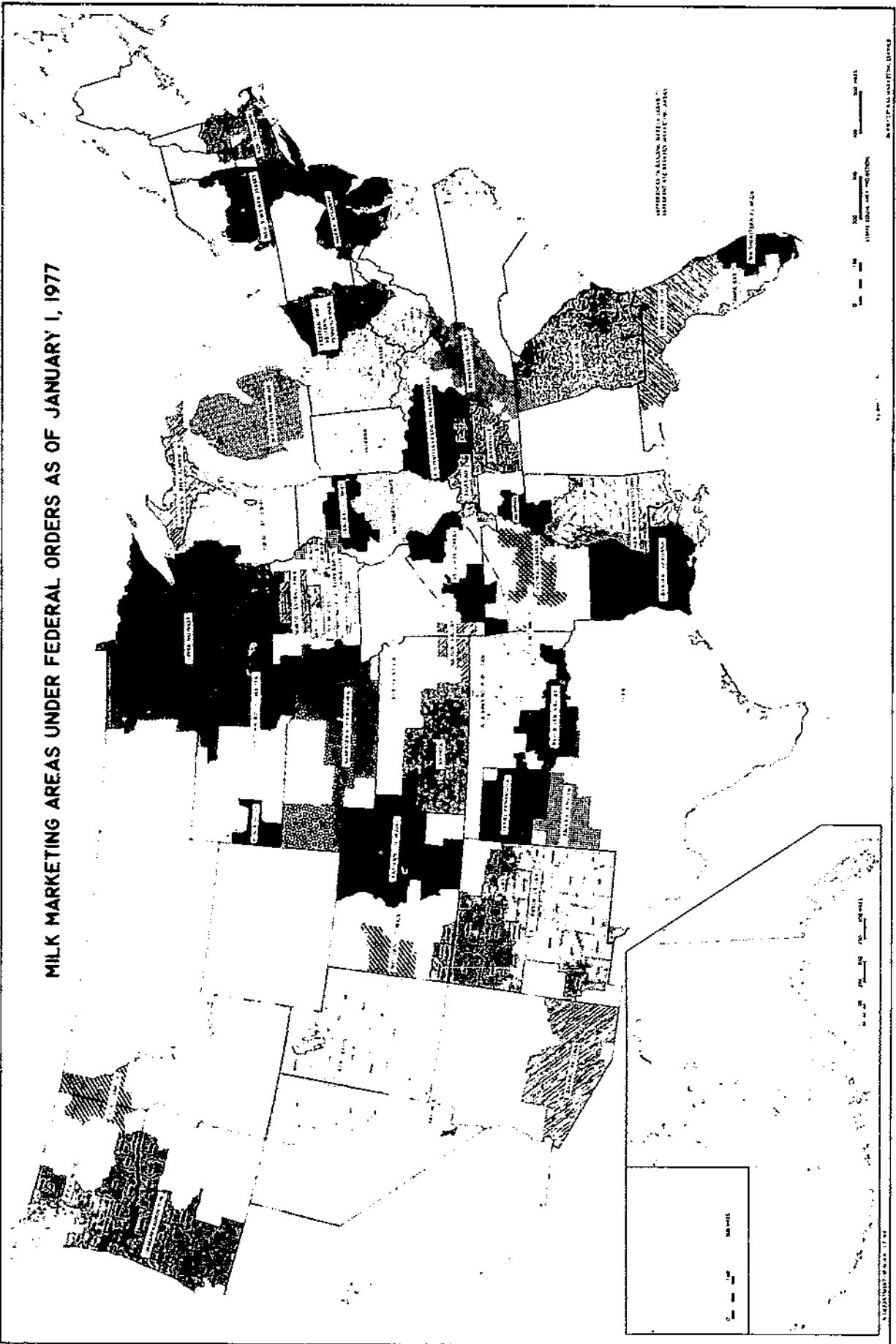

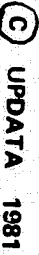
