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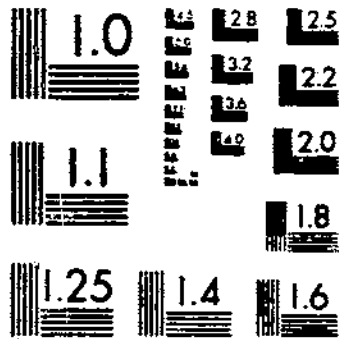
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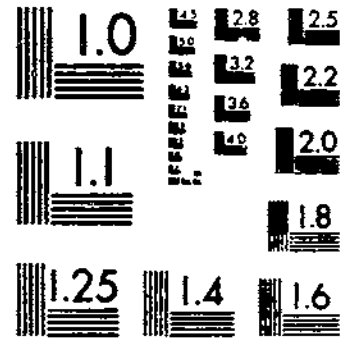
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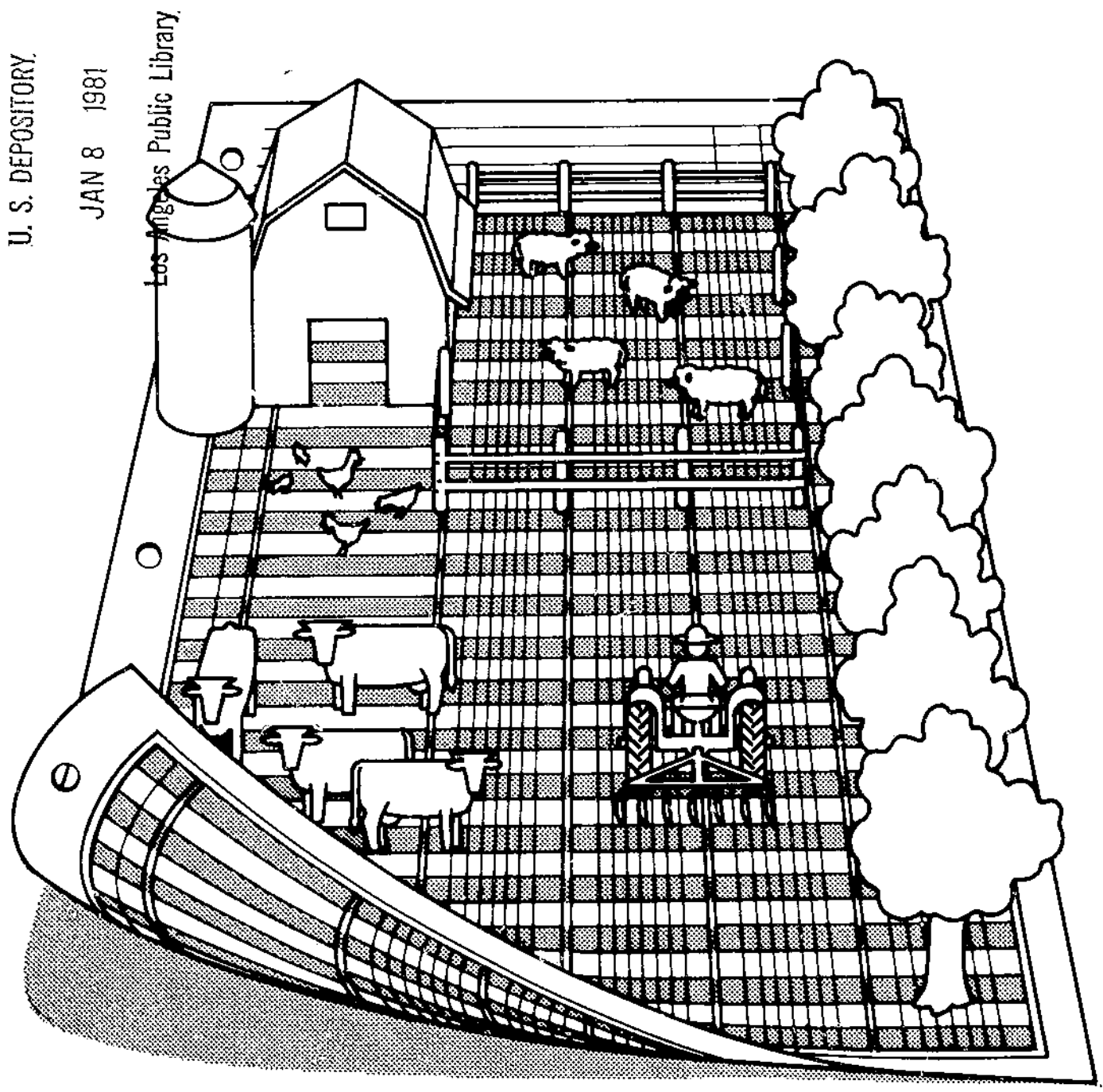
Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector:

Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1979

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PREFACE

The Economics and Statistics Service (ESS) has developed new procedures to measure statistically the economic status of the Nation's farms and farm operator income. Using the new procedures, long-standing data series such as farm income and the balance sheet of the farming sector will be brought up to date to better reflect the nature of today's farm sector.

One major feature of the new series is the separation of the operator's household and dwelling from farm production transactions, assets, and debt. This new format is more appropriate for expanding the aggregate accounts into subsector groups, which is planned for the years ahead.

This report, Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1979, marks the first application of the new set of financial measures. As the new series have not yet been officially adopted, they are presented for comparison side by side with the existing series.

This report is the first of four in the Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector series. Subsequent reports will be State Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, Production and Efficiency Statistics, and Costs of Production. These publications replace four familiar annual reports: Balance Sheet of the Farming Sector, Farm Income Statistics, State Farm Income Statistics, and Changes in Farm Production and Efficiency.

All of the income estimates in this report are on a calendar year basis. Many are used as basic data for the State and regional personal income estimates and the national income and product accounts of the U.S. Department of Commerce.

The data, while mainly based on information from the Statistics Divisions of ESS and the Census of Agriculture, also utilize information from other Government agencies and in some cases from private sources. As additional information becomes available, revisions are normally made for recent years.

This publication was prepared by the staff of the Farm Sector Analysis Section, Economic Indicators and Statistics Branch, National Economics Division, ESS.

HIGHLIGHTS

The Economics and Statistics Service has developed new procedures to measure statistically the economic status of U.S. farms and farm operator income. Long-standing data series such as farm income and the balance sheet of the farming sector are being revised to better reflect today's farm sector. Since the revised measures have not been officially adopted, they are published here with traditional measures of farm income, assets, and debt for 1977, 1978, and 1979.

The new measures will permit the earnings and financial dimensions of the farm business to be distinguished from farm family income and finances. Additional data, when available, will also provide a way to include more information on the financial status of farms by size, type, location, and ownership.

The revised balance sheet statistics differ from the familiar series mainly in that the assets and debts associated with the farm operator's household, dwelling, and motor vehicles are removed. Using the present accounts, total farm assets increased 14.2 percent from January 1, 1979, to January 1, 1980, from \$804.4 billion to \$918.9 billion. Under the revised set of accounts, the value of total assets increased 14.8 percent from \$715.2 billion to \$821.0 billion.

Total liabilities in the present accounts including operators' dwellings increased 15.6 percent, from \$136.1 billion on January 1, 1979, to \$157.3 billion on January 1, 1980. Under the revised format, liabilities were up 15.5 percent from \$126.8 billion on January 1, 1979, to \$146.4 billion on January 1, 1980.

The revised income accounts differ from the original net farm income accounts in two ways. Household income and expenses are removed as in the revised balance sheet accounts, and Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans are treated as loans, not commodity sales as in the present net farm income accounts.

Net farm income increased from \$26.1 billion in 1978 to \$31.0 billion in 1979, a gain of 19 percent. The relevant measure of net income under the new format, returns to operators, also increased 19 percent, from \$21.6 billion in 1978 to \$25.7 billion in 1979. Cash income from farming, a new measure reflecting farmers' cash flow, increased only 9 percent, however, from \$34.8 billion in 1978 to \$38.0 billion in 1979. Factor payments (returns to the factors employed in farm production--land, labor, and capital) increased 19 percent from \$43.9 billion in 1978 to \$52.4 billion in 1979.

Total production expenses in the net farm income account were up 18 percent in 1979, from \$100.8 billion in 1978 to \$118.6 billion. Total expenses in the new income account also increased 18 percent, from \$97.4 billion in 1978 to \$114.7 billion in 1979.

Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector:

Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1979

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has published a comprehensive set of income estimates relating to agriculture since the mid-twenties. The series have been revised and expanded through time, incorporating individual State estimates in 1949 and sales class distributions in 1960.

Revisions of the formats for these farm sector accounts which were formerly published in the Balance Sheet of the Farming Sector and Farm Income Statistics mark another step forward. A research project was initiated about 2 years ago to review and implement where possible the recommendations of two task force reports on farm financial accounts. The revised accounts presented in this report are the result of this effort.

The farm income and finance data series and information programs in use today originated in the forties when more than 5 million farms, mostly small, family operations, depended almost entirely on farming as their source of income. They were primarily designed to provide information about the farm sector as an aggregate unit. With relative homogeneity within the sector, these aggregate measures could be related to the well-being of the groups within it. However, the fundamental character and structure of agriculture have grown increasingly diverse. As a result, the existing economic accounts and data series are increasingly ineffective in providing insight into the true financial well-being of the various groups that make up today's changing farming sector. In some years, for example, there is an apparent paradox: total and average farm income rise sharply while the economic condition of some groups of farmers producing certain crops and livestock does not improve. Better information is needed to more correctly interpret the actual economic conditions of various subgroups of farmers.

The revised accounts presented in this bulletin were developed for two important reasons: first, to separate the aggregate accounts in a manner that would permit the earnings of the farm business unit to be distinguished from farm family income, and second, to permit a better analysis of the wealth and income status of the production units and the operators of those units by type of farm, value of sales class, and type of ownership (when the data are available).

The new accounts are based on the concept of separating the measurement of the economic viability of the production units (establishments) of the farm sector (a part of the business sector of the national economy) from the well-being of the farm

operator families (a part of the household sector of the national economy). Information on the nonfarm assets and debts of farm operators is limited and is not reported in this publication.

Publication of these accounts marks the first step in a long-term program of developing and implementing more comprehensive and informative measures of the economic performance of the production units and well-being of the operators in the farm sector. Important aspects of this upgrading process are identifying and collecting data which will provide more meaningful information in future years on farms by type, size, location, ownership, and other groupings.

In this 1980 report, the new income accounts include data for calendar years 1977, 1978, and 1979. The balance sheet statistics are as of January 1 of the respective year. Next year, longer historical series will be presented where data will allow. This year and for the next few years all the traditional measures of farm income will be published in addition to the newly-developed income accounts.

STRUCTURE OF THE NEW ACCOUNTS

The set of measures in Section I separately reports the financial condition of the farm sector from the income of farm operator families. This permits a clearer distinction between the economic status of the farm production establishment versus that of operator households. This will be especially useful for analysis which separates farms by value of sales class and by type. Some small farms, for example, may not be viable units from a farm production standpoint, but the operator household may have a satisfactory income when off-farm income is combined with farm income.

The agricultural production sector, covered by the revised accounts, includes farm establishments involved in agricultural production regardless of the source of labor. The production sector is separated from the marketing, processing, and distribution sectors within agriculture and can be subdivided according to geographic location, type of ownership, and type of farm (cash grain, livestock, tobacco, etc.). Disaggregation of the production sector according to business organization would include sole proprietors, partnerships, and corporations, although additional data are needed to provide a complete breakdown by this classification. Data by State are presently available and will be reported in a subsequent issue of Economic Indicators. As more data become available, gross and net income by type of farm will also be reported.

The terms "farm" and "establishment" represent the places on, or in, which the production process occurs. The establishment concept used for 1977, 1978, and 1979 in this report is the

official Census farm definition adopted in 1974 which includes places with annual sales, or potential sales, of \$1,000 or more.

Households include all families or individuals receiving income from the agricultural production sector. The main category of households emphasized in this report is farm operators, although some of the tables include landlords and employee categories as well. The operator category includes owners and tenants, as well as managers associated with corporate or institutional establishments.

In addition to households, income of the farm population is reported. The farm population includes all persons living on places with agricultural sales of \$1,000 or more who do not pay cash rent for the dwelling they occupy. This category does not include farm operators, landlords, or employees who do not live on farms.

COMPARISON OF ORIGINAL AND REVISED ACCOUNTS

The differences between the revised format of the new accounts and the original formats in the old accounts are summarized in figures 1 and 2. Details for the new accounts are presented in tables 1 through 33 in Section I. Details for the old accounts are shown in Section II, tables 34 through 49, for the balance sheet items and Section III, tables 50 through 101, for the income items.

The accounts presented in Section I basically differ from the accounts in Sections II and III because the household portion of wealth and income are removed. In the revised balance sheet accounts, the operators' dwellings are removed from real estate assets and real estate debt, and the household portions of automobiles and trucks are removed from the machinery and motor vehicles accounts. Household equipment and associated debt are also removed from the balance sheet accounts. The financial assets retained are those considered a part of the farm business, namely currency, demand deposits, and investment in cooperatives.

As shown in figure 1, the net result of these changes in balance sheet items on January 1, 1980, is a reduction in total farm assets from \$918.9 billion to \$821.0 billion. The percentage increase from 1978 to 1979 was 14.8 percent for the revised accounts and 14.2 percent for the original accounts. Total farm debt in the original account was \$157.3 billion, up 15.6 percent from the 1978 level. After excluding operators' households, total debt was \$146.4 billion, up 15.5 percent from that in 1978.

The revised income accounts mainly differ from the original net farm income accounts in two ways. Household income and expenses are removed as in the revised balance sheet accounts, and Com-

commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans are treated as loans and not as commodity sales, as they were in the net farm income accounts. As shown in figure 2, gross farm income in 1979 totaled \$149.6 billion under the net farm income account. The revised income account indicates total income of \$140.4 billion. The difference is primarily because the rental value of farm dwellings is excluded from the new income account, except for the rental value of hired labor dwellings, which is added back into other farm income.

Crop cash receipts and the value of the annual change in inventories also change in the new account because CCC stocks are treated as loans rather than sales. In 1979, crop receipts were greater under the new format, but this was about offset by a lower inventory value reflecting the net reduction in CCC stocks of \$940 million during 1979.

Production expenses totaled \$118.6 billion in 1979 in the net farm income account and \$114.7 billion under the revised format, primarily because expenses on the operator dwelling are removed. Rent to landlords is higher under the new income format because rent to all landlords is included. Under the original accounts, only rent to nonoperator landlords was included.

Returns to operators, which totaled \$25.7 billion under the revised income account, was thus \$5.3 billion lower than the \$31.0 billion of net farm income in 1979. This difference largely reflects the exclusion of about \$9 billion of imputed income from the gross rental value of farm dwellings, along with a reduction of about \$4 billion in expenses associated with operator dwellings.

The first five tables in Section I are summary tables and provide an overview of the balance sheet, production transactions, cash flow, and returns to equity. The remaining tables in Section I show more detail for production expenses, cash receipts, balance sheet items, and selected classifications by State and sales class.

Table 1 summarizes several overall measures of the farm sector's financial status, production transactions, and operators' income. The financial summary relates to balance sheet accounts and includes assets, debts, and equity under the revised format where the operator and household assets are removed from the accounts as described earlier. Balance Sheet items are reported as of January 1 each year. "Production transactions" and "production income" are new terms designed to describe goods produced and expenses associated with their production.

The object of the "transaction" account concept embodied in the revised accounts is to measure the income from agricultural

production establishments so that the value added by the farm production sector can be distributed to the institutions or classes of individuals, such as sole proprietors, partnerships, or corporations, controlling the sector's resources. The account depicts the income-producing process as a series of transactions including various sources of receipts and allocations of expenses.

In the transactions summary, total receipts are designated gross receipts. Gross receipts are \$140.4 billion for the revised format compared with \$149.6 billion for the net farm income account. The total receipts differ because net rental value of farm dwellings are removed and CCC loans are treated as loans rather than cash receipts. However, CCC stocks are calculated as part of the inventory change in the new accounts, which will be discussed under table 3.

"Intermediate product expenses" is a new term which refers to purchased inputs. Detail for these inputs is presented in table 6. In the expense category, "capital consumption" includes depreciation and accidental damage, the same concept as under the the old accounts, but it is lower under the revised format because depreciation of the operator dwelling and the household portion of assets, such as motor vehicles, is removed.

Depreciation in both accounts is measured on a replacement-value basis rather than purchase price in order to reflect decreases in current market value of the capital stock. Business taxes, which include both real estate and personal property taxes, drop from \$4.3 billion in the net farm income account to \$3.9 billion in the revised format and capital consumption falls from \$19.0 billion to \$16.2 billion (fig. 2).

Another new term is "factor payments." The value shown is the income available to provide returns to the factors--land, labor, and capital. These returns are interest, wages to hired labor, net rent to all landlords, and returns to operators. No term in the net farm income account is comparable to "factor payments." Real estate interest is lower in the revised format because the dwelling portion of the debt is removed. Hired labor wages drop from \$9.2 billion to \$8.3 billion because \$900 million of contract labor has been transferred to services hired (machine hire, custom work, and contract labor). Net rent to landlords in the new format is \$6.0 billion compared with \$5.3 billion in the net farm income accounts. This is because the net farm income account only included nonoperating landlords while the new account includes operating as well as nonoperator landlords.

The new term "returns to operators" indicates returns to the operator for labor, management and capital supplied. Returns to operators were \$25.7 billion in 1979 under the new income ac-

count compared with net farm income of \$31.0 billion under the original format. In 1979, both net income measures were 19 percent larger than 1978.

"Total farm operators' income" includes both farm and nonfarm sources. The farm sources include returns to operators, net rent to operator landlords, and imputed net rental value of operator dwellings. Total operator income in 1979 of \$65.1 billion includes \$30.7 billion from farm sources and \$34.4 billion from nonfarm sources under the revised accounts. The original accounts had total operator income of \$65.3 billion, \$31.0 billion from farm sources and \$34.4 billion from nonfarm sources (fig. 2).

Summary of Farm Balance Sheet

The summary of the farm balance sheet in table 2 differs from the summary formerly presented in the Balance Sheet of the Farming Sector in that the operator's dwelling, household equipment, household share of trucks and autos, time deposits and savings bonds, debt on the dwelling, and household share of the nonreal estate debt are removed (see comparisons in figure 1).

Thus, real estate assets dropped \$57.6 billion in the revised accounts; machinery and motor vehicle value decreased nearly \$5.9 billion. Financial assets under the revised accounts dropped \$13.9 billion to \$24.6 billion because time deposits and U.S. savings bonds, considered household assets of the operator family, are dropped; and investments in cooperatives are reduced by the household portion.

Real estate debt declined more than \$7 billion after the operators' dwelling portion of the debt was removed. Nonreal estate debt decreased by \$3.7 billion after household-associated debt was removed from the revised accounts. Proprietors' equity, the difference between assets and debts, decreased \$87.0 billion under the revised accounts (see figure 2). Several financial indicators and ratios are shown in table 2 to measure relative change in the balance sheet.

Farm Production Transactions

The farm production transactions in table 3 provide subclassifications for receipts and expenses. The expenses include nonfactor payments or cash expenses for intermediate products and business taxes plus noncash expenses for capital consumption (table 6). Expenses also include factor payments of interest paid on debt capital, wages for hired labor, and net rent to all landlords. The residual factor payment is returns to operators for the factors they have furnished such as labor, management, and equity capital.

Farm marketings increased in 1979 by nearly \$1 billion using the new methodology (fig. 2) because of a decrease in total outstanding CCC loans of \$940 million. As explained earlier, the

revised accounts treat CCC loans as loans rather than as sales. Livestock marketings are the same in both accounts.

Stocks covered by CCC loans become a part of inventory change. Thus, 1979 net inventory change dips from \$4.1 billion in the net farm income account to \$2.9 billion in the returns to operator account because the volume of CCC stocks were reduced at the end of the year. The reduction is greater than the \$940 million decrease in marketings because CCC stocks are valued for inventory change at the average annual market price, not at the loan price.

Government payments and the value of home consumption are the same in both income accounts. Net rental value of farm dwellings is not included in the farm sector under the revised accounts, but goes into the household sector as operator income. "Other farm income" is slightly larger in the new income account because the rental value of farm laborer-occupied dwellings are added back in.

Expenses in table 6 for intermediate products purchased from other establishments are further broken out into those of farm origin, manufactured, and other expenses. Farm origin expenses are feed, livestock and seed purchased, defined the same for both sets of accounts. Manufactured inputs include fertilizer and lime, pesticides, fuel and oil, and electricity, also the same for both accounts. Other inputs include repair and operation, of which the household portion is excluded in the revised format. "Machine hire, custom work, and contract labor" differs in that contract labor is included in the new income account as a service rather than under wages. Marketing charges and miscellaneous expense are two more categories which are the same in both accounts. Compared with the old accounts, machine hire, custom work, and contract labor increased \$900 million and wages to hired labor decreased by the same amount.

Interest payments on the operator dwelling portion of real estate debt are excluded; thus real estate interest decreased \$600 million for the revised accounts. Rent, which is that paid to all landlords and not limited to nonoperating landlords as formerly, increased \$700 million. Total expenses decreased \$3.9 billion for the new accounts (fig. 2).

Total operator income in table 3 includes farm and off-farm income. Farm-associated income includes income from farming, the imputed net rental value of operator dwellings, and rent received by operator landlords. The net rental value of operator dwellings is included in net farm income under the former concept, but is removed from returns to operators. Similarly, rent paid to operator landlords is removed as an expense in

returns to operators, but is also included under total income of the operator. Total off-farm income includes income from off-farm activities such as wages and salaries, nonfarm businesses, interest, dividends, rents, and transfer payments. Off-farm income is the same for both the new and original accounts.

Farm Sector Cash Flow

Cash flow status is an indicator which helps provide some perspective on the shortrun financial situation of farmers. Even though the wealth and income situation of the average farm operator may be adequate, in terms of the farmer's resources, the cash flow may be inadequate to meet current obligations, thus causing financial difficulties. This may not be unusual, for example, for many beginning farmers and for those who may have recently purchased land financed at interest rates which, in periods of unfavorable price relationships, could cause severe financial stress.

Farm sector cash flow lists only cash transactions (table 4). Net inventory change, perquisite rent, and home consumption are not cash items and are removed from gross income to get cash income. Cash uses include only those expenses that are cash payments. Capital consumption is a noncash expense and is not included. The perquisites for hired labor are also excluded. Cash income from farming measures the cash available for capital asset purchases, loan retirement and operator household cash income.

The cash flow summary includes other sources of cash including CCC loans, net changes in real estate and nonreal estate farm business loans, and the net change in farmers' currency and demand deposits, and net rent to all landlords. However, capital expenditures are a cash use and are subtracted since they decrease the cash available. Net cash flow measures the change in cash available for household consumption, further business operations, or purchases of real estate from discontinuing proprietors.

Returns to Equity ^{1/}

The estimates of returns to equity in farm assets shown in table 5 reflect an attempt to measure the profitability, or loss, to equity capital used in farm production from two sources, farm income and changes in the net value of farm assets. Equity capital is the market value of farm production assets less debt. The income return to this equity is obtained as a residual flow by subtracting from income derived from farm resources an estimated value for management, operator's labor,

and for interest paid on the indebted proportion of total farm assets used in production. An imputed charge for operator and family labor is based on total annual work hours contributed to production, times the average hourly wage rates actually paid for hired workers. The imputed charge for managerial functions covers the operational aspects of management, assumed at 5 percent of the value of: farm cash receipts minus livestock and feed purchases, plus or minus changes in farm inventories.

Returns to equity from changes in the value of farm assets are measured in terms of both nominal and real values. Nominal capital gains are measures of the change in the value of farm physical assets each year minus the value of net investment in farm production assets (capital expenditures less capital consumption allowances). Real capital gains are the amount by which nominal gains exceed the loss in purchasing power from increases due to inflation as measured by the Consumer Price Index, all items (1967=100). For instance, if the nominal value of farm assets valued at \$100 billion increased during the year by \$10 billion, and the general level of price inflation was 8 percent, then the real capital gain on farm assets is \$2 billion ($\$10 - (.08 \times \$100) = \2). The \$2 billion represents a gain in real wealth.

Real capital gains or losses thus reflect both the change in the nominal value of farm production assets during the year and the change in purchasing power of the funds tied up in assets and debts. For example, during periods when farm physical asset values increase faster than the rate of inflation, a gain in real wealth is attained on farm assets. But, if asset values do not increase as fast as the inflation rate, a loss in real wealth occurs. For monetary assets such as demand deposits and currency, if purchasing power is eroded by inflation, a real capital loss is experienced. For farm debt, the effects are opposite to those for monetary assets. For debtors, inflation results in real capital gains while deflation results in real capital losses.

The rates of return from income and real capital gains to equity in assets are derived by dividing the respective amounts by the equity value of farm assets (table 5). Residual farm income from equity and real capital gains are additive, as are their rates of return; however, the user is cautioned that it is not logical in an economic sense to combine farm income and nominal capital gains.

Other Tables

Tables 7, 8, and 9 contain the same classifications as table 1, but they are disaggregated by value of sales. The less-than-\$5,000 sales class does not include establishments with sales of less than \$1,000 as they are excluded from the definition of a

farm for 1977, 1978, and 1979. In the transactions summary, all of the expenses are grouped because data are not available to allocate some of the individual expenses by sales class.

Plans are under way to secure additional data and to provide more subdivisions of the expense items by sales class.

Tables 10, 11, 12, and 13 present the financial summary of U.S. farms by States using the same definitions as in table 2.

Tables 14, 16, and 18 show cash receipts from farm marketings by months. These tables do not include net CCC loans in crop receipts, but the totals in similar tables in Section III may be found by adding the net CCC loans shown in table 20 to these totals. The groupings in livestock and crops are the same as under the definitions in Section III. Tables 15, 17, and 19 show the volume of farm marketings index numbers using the cash receipts in tables 14, 16, and 18.

Tables 21, 22, and 23 list cash receipts and government payments by States. These cash receipts do not include net CCC loans, but the net CCC loans by States in table 24 may be added to calculate cash receipts under the definition in Section III.

Table 25 lists cash receipts and home consumption by individual commodities. The cash receipts differ from the definitions in Section III in that net CCC loans are not included. The totals for commodities with net CCC loans may be calculated by using the values in table 20. Home consumption is the same as under the old definition.

Table 26 shows the value of home consumption by State, by livestock, and by crop. The definition of the data in this table is the same as under the definition in Section III.

Tables 34 through 49 present asset and debt statistics, the same as previously reported in Balance Sheet of the Farming Sector.

Tables 50 through 101 present farm income statistics, the same as previously reported in Farm Income Statistics, except that farms are defined as those establishments having sales of \$1,000 or more for 1977, 1978, and 1979.

Data in Tables 92 through 101 are estimated using information from several sources. They include the Census of Agriculture, periodic surveys, special studies and other related information. The published distributions are believed to be reasonable approximations. However, basic information is limited and usually dated. As a result, a number of assumptions and rough approximations of some variables are involved in the estimating process. Also, much of the basic data is available only every five years. This means that the estimates for years subsequent to the latest benchmarks are in effect projections which may be subject to substantial revisions as fresh data become available.
