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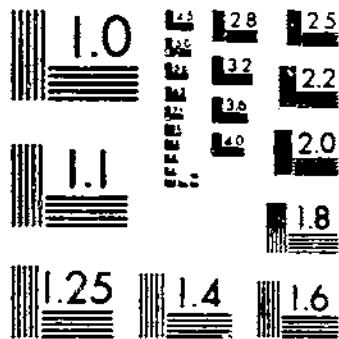
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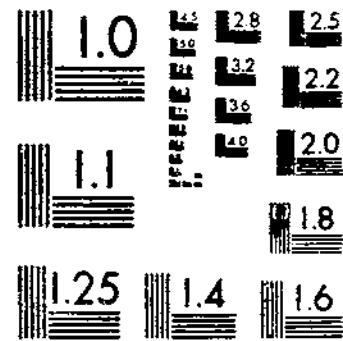

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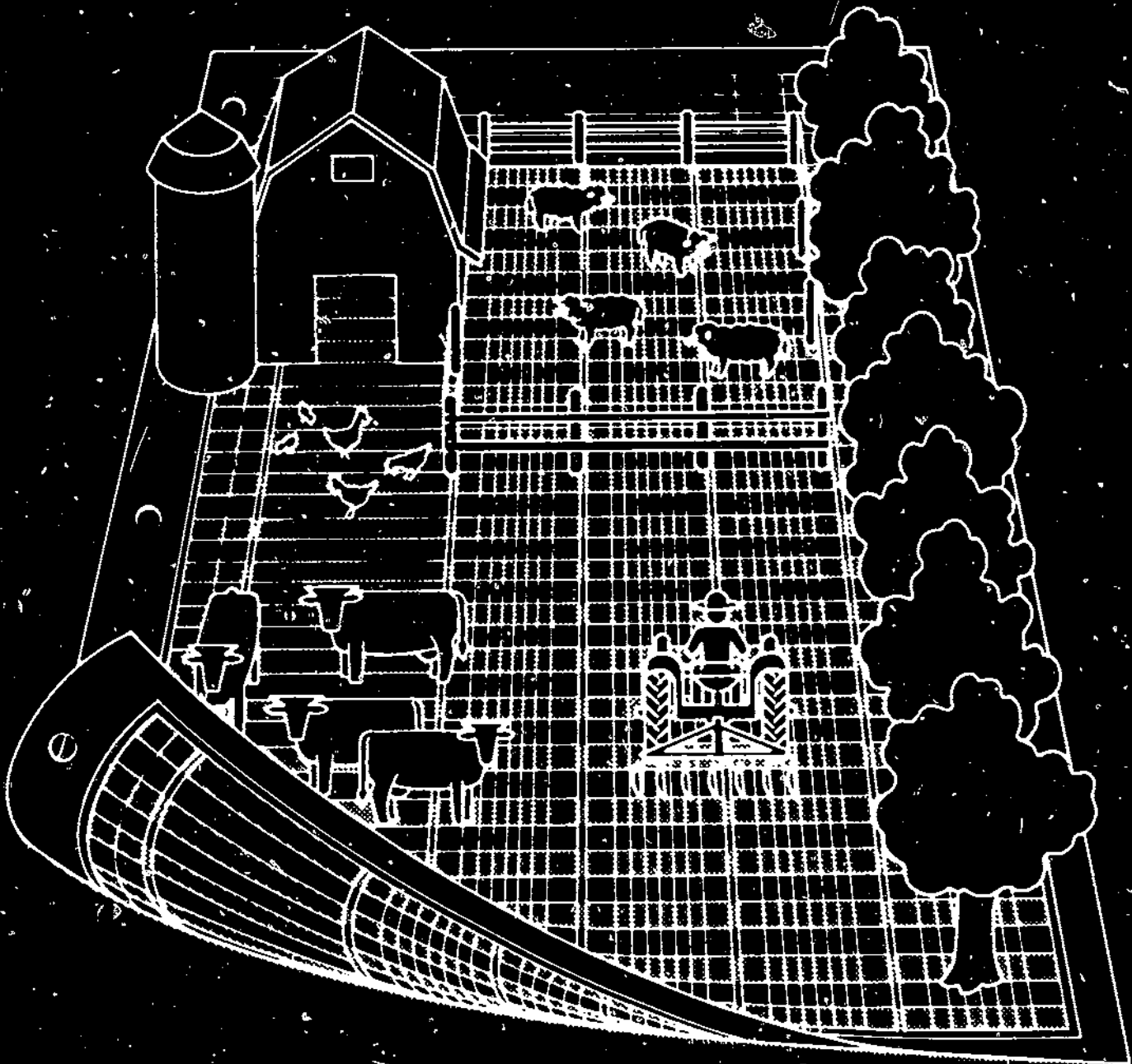

ABSTRACT

The five leading States for farm cash receipts in 1980 were California, at \$13.5 billion; Iowa, at \$10 billion; Texas, at \$9 billion; Illinois, at \$7.9 billion; and Minnesota, at \$6.3 billion. Texas was the leading State for farm cash receipts for cattle and calves at \$3.9 billion, Wisconsin for dairy products at \$2.8 billion, Illinois for soybeans at \$2.4 billion and corn at \$2.7 billion, Kansas for wheat at \$1.6 billion, Iowa for hogs at \$2.2 billion, and California for eggs at \$400 million. Accounts are presented for farm income and farm balance sheet, by State, with and without farm households for 1980.

PREFACE

This report is one of four in the Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector series, which includes longstanding data series such as farm income and the balance sheet of the farm sector. The series is in the process of being updated to reflect the changing nature of today's farm sector. This issue provides updated and revised data, by State.

This segment, State Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1980, corresponds to the national data published in Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1980 (SB-674) disaggregated to the State level. Data are reported at the State level for farm income and balance sheet accounts with and without farm households.

One major feature is the separation of the operator's household and dwelling from farm production transactions, assets, and debt. This format is more appropriate for expanding the aggregate accounts into subsector groups which is planned for the years ahead.

All of the income estimates in this report are on a calendar year basis. Many are used as basic data for the State and regional personal income estimates and the national income and product accounts of the U.S. Department of Commerce.

The data, while mainly based on information from the Statistical Reporting Service and the Census of Agriculture, also use information from other Government agencies and, in some cases, from private sources. Revisions are usually made for recent years as additional information becomes available.

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HIGHLIGHTS

The five leading States for farm cash receipts in 1980 were California, at \$13.5 billion; Iowa, at \$10 billion; Texas, at \$9 billion; Illinois, at \$7.9 billion; and Minnesota, at \$6.3 billion. Iowa, Texas, California, Wisconsin, and Nebraska, in that order, were the five leading States in livestock receipts. California, Illinois, Iowa, Texas, and Minnesota were the top five States in crop receipts.

The leading States in cash receipts for individual commodities were Texas for cattle and calves; Wisconsin for dairy; Illinois for corn and soybeans; Iowa for hogs; Kansas for wheat; Arkansas for broilers; California for cotton; and Idaho for potatoes.

The five leading States in gross farm income after inventory adjustment for 1980 were California, at \$14.2 billion; Iowa, at \$11 billion; Texas, at \$9.9 billion; Illinois, at \$9 billion; and Minnesota, at \$7.1 billion.

The five leading States in net farm income after inventory adjustment were California, at \$3.4 billion; Wisconsin, at \$1.4 billion; Texas and Minnesota, both at \$1.2 billion; and Florida, at \$1.1 billion. The five leading States in net returns to operators were California, Texas, Florida, Wisconsin, and Minnesota.

Under the balance sheet accounts, the five leading States in assets including farm households were Iowa, at \$80 billion; Texas, at \$79 billion; Illinois, at \$72 billion; California, at \$61 billion; and Minnesota, at \$45 billion. The ranking excluding farm households was Iowa, Texas, Illinois, California, and Minnesota.

The five leading States with total debt including farm households were California, at \$13 billion; Iowa, at \$12 billion; Texas, at \$10 billion; Illinois, at \$8 billion; and Minnesota, at \$8 billion. The rankings remained the same when farm households were excluded.

The Economic Research Service developed procedures in 1980 to measure statistically the economic status of the Nation's farms and farm operator income. Using the new procedures, long-standing data series such as farm income and the balance sheet of the farming sector were brought up to date to better reflect the nature of today's farm sector.

These series are continued and expanded in this publication. Two sets of measures of farm income, assets, and debt are included in this publication. One set includes farm households and Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans are treated as sales. The other set excludes farm households with the CCC loans carried in inventory rather than as sales.

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Economic Indicators of the Farm Sector

State Income and Balance Sheet Statistics, 1980

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has published a comprehensive set of income estimates relating to agriculture since the midtwenties. The series have been revised and expanded through time, incorporating individual State estimates in 1949 and sales class distributions in 1960. In 1980, new accounts were added which permit the earnings and financial dimensions of the farm business to be distinguished from farm family income and finances. These accounts, along with the former accounts, are included in this publication.

These accounts were developed to separate the aggregate accounts in a manner that would permit the earnings of the farm business unit to be distinguished from farm family income and to permit a better analysis of the wealth and income status of the production units and the operators of those units by type of farm, value of sales class, and type of ownership as well as by State as presented in this publication.

The production sector accounts are based on the concept of separating the measurement of the economic viability of the production units (establishments) of the farm sector (a part of the business sector of the national economy) from the well-being of the farm operator families (a part of the household sector of the national economy). Information on the nonfarm assets and debts of farm operators is limited and is not reported in this publication. The agricultural production sector includes farm establishments involved in agricultural production regardless of the source of labor. The production sector is separated from the marketing, processing, and distribution sectors within agriculture.

The terms "farm" and "establishment" represent the places where the production process occurs. The establishment concept used for 1977-80 is the Census farm definition adopted in 1974 which includes places with annual sales, or potential sales, of \$1,000 or more.

Households include all families or individuals receiving income from the agricultural production sector. The main category of households emphasized in this report is farm operators, although

some of the tables also include landlords and employee categories. The operator category includes owners and tenants as well as managers associated with corporate or institutional establishments.

The format of this publication differs slightly from the publication for 1979 data. All of the income tables have been grouped together (tables 1 through 18), as well as the balance sheet tables (tables B1 and B2). Within the income tables, the tables are identified as "excluding net Commodity Credit Corporation loans and farm households" for the new accounts and "including net Commodity Credit Corporation loans and farm households" for the previous accounts. The balance sheet tables are separated by "excluding farm households" in the titles for the new accounts and "including farm households" for the previous accounts.

STATE INCOME ACCOUNTS

Tables 1 through 18 present State farm income statistics. Tables 1 and 2 are ranking tables showing the leading States, by commodities, for cash receipts and the leading commodities for each State including net Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) loans.

Farm Production Transactions

Table 3 presents farm production transactions, by State. The objective of the transactions accounts is to measure income from agricultural production establishments so the value added by the farm production sector can be distributed to the institutions or classes of individuals, such as sole proprietors, partnerships, or corporations, controlling the sector's resources. The account depicts the income-producing process as a series of transactions including various sources of receipts and the allocation of expenses.

In the transactions summary, the residual is returns to operators, and total receipts are designated gross farm receipts. Gross receipts differ from gross farm income in the farm income accounts because the rental value of farm operator dwellings is removed and CCC loans are treated as loans, not sales at the time the loans are made. The Government payments reported in tables 15 through 18 are the same for both accounts.

Production expenses under the production transactions accounts are divided into factor and nonfactor payments. Under nonfactor payments, intermediate production expenses of nonfarm origin include purchased inputs, such as fuel, repairs, fertilizer, and pesticides. Intermediate production expenses of farm origin are seed, feed, and livestock purchased. Other nonfactor payments include capital consumption and business taxes.

Capital consumption includes depreciation and accidental damage. Depreciation is measured on a replacement value basis rather than purchase price in order to reflect decreases in current market value of the capital stock. Depreciation is lower in the production transactions accounts than the net farm income accounts because the operators' dwellings are not included.

Factor payments is the income available to provide returns to the factors--land, labor, and capital. These returns are interest, wages to hired labor, net rent to all landlords, and returns to operators. Returns to operators is the portion of income left to the operator for returns supplied from labor, management, and capital.

Cash Flow

Cash flow status is an indicator which helps provide some perspective on the short-term financial situation of farmers. Although the wealth and income situation of the average farm operator may be adequate in terms of the farmer's resources, the cash flow may be inadequate to meet current obligations, thus causing financial difficulties. This may not be unusual for many beginning farmers and for those who may recently have purchased land financed at interest rates which, in periods of unfavorable price relationships, could cause severe financial stress.

State cash income differs from the production transactions table in that only cash transactions enter the calculations (table 4). Net inventory change, perquisite rent for hired labor, and home consumption are not cash items and are not included in receipts in this table. Cash uses include only those expenses that are cash transactions. Capital consumption is a noncash expense and is not included. The perquisites for hired labor are also excluded. Cash income from farming measures the cash available for capital asset purchases, loan retirement, and operator household cash income. Cash income from farming is generally higher than returns to operators as is shown by comparing the State totals in tables 3 and 4.

Net Farm Income

State net farm income statistics are reported in tables 5 through 14. Net farm income accounts differ from production transactions accounts in that farm household income is included in net farm income and CCC loans are considered sales when the loans are made.

The farm household accounts affect both the income and expenses in net farm income. The imputed rental value of farm operator dwellings is included as income. The expenses for these dwellings are included in repair and operation, interest, taxes, capital consumption, and other miscellaneous expenses.

STATE BALANCE SHEET ACCOUNTS

Cash receipts differ between the farm production transactions accounts and the net farm income accounts by the amount of change in CCC loans adjusted from the loan value to the current market value. Loans liquidated are added into the transactions accounts as receipts in the year the loans are liquidated. These loans have already been counted as receipts in the year the loans were made under the net farm income accounts.

Commodity Credit Corporation Loans

As noted, CCC loans are treated differently between the production transactions accounts and the net farm income accounts. Under the transactions accounts, CCC loans are treated as loans. If these loans are liquidated (commodities are physically delivered to CCC and the loan canceled) or repaid with the commodity being sold on the open market by the producer, then these loans are considered sales at that time. The net effect is the same for both accounts, but the year in which they are counted as sales may differ. Since the CCC loans are counted as loans in the transactions accounts, the quantities under loan are recorded as inventories. In the net farm income accounts, CCC loans are counted as sales at the time the loan is made and the quantities under loan are not counted in inventory calculations.

Production Expenses

Production expenses between transactions accounts and net farm income accounts differ in several ways. The expenses of operators' dwellings are included under the net farm income accounts but are excluded under the transactions accounts. Repair and operation, interest, business taxes, capital consumption, and some miscellaneous accounts are higher in the net farm income accounts because they include household expenses. Feed, livestock, seed, fertilizer, electricity, marketing charges, and nonreal estate interest are the same for both accounts. Contract labor is included as a part of wages under the net farm income accounts but is a part of the service accounts--machine hire, custom work, and contract labor--in the transactions accounts. In the net farm income accounts, only net rent to nonoperator landlords is an expense.

STATE BALANCE SHEET ACCOUNTS

The balance sheet accounts are separated into those "excluding farm households" (table B1) and those "including farm households" (table B2). The accounts "including farm households" are the same accounts as were designated "Balance sheet of the farming sector, by State" in the 1979 statistics published in 1980. Those "excluding farm households" are the same as the tables listed as "new methodology" in the 1979 statistics.

In the balance sheet accounts, when household assets are excluded, so are the operators' dwellings, household portion of automobiles and trucks, household equipment, time deposits,

household portion of investment in cooperatives, and U.S. savings bonds. Operators' dwellings make up about two-thirds of the value of the household assets excluded.

Real estate assets make up over 75 percent of total farm assets, and thus the movement of real estate values strongly affects total farm assets.

In the accounts where farm household assets are excluded, the household portion of the debt is also excluded. The portion of the debt attributed to the operators' dwellings, household portion of automobiles and trucks, and household equipment is removed.

While the debt/asset ratio is still quite low, the ratio has been rising over time. In table B2, the ratio for January 1, 1981, varies from Georgia, at 23.4 percent for debts as a percentage of assets, to 5.4 percent for Hawaii. Illinois has the lowest percentage, at 12.3 percent for a major agricultural State. The total U.S. average is 17.1 percent.
