## Abstract

This publication presents final estimates for production and value from chickens, eggs, broilers and turkeys for 1984-87. Data on chickens, eggs, broilers, and turkeys continue the official series published in Statistical Bulletin No. 725, issued April 1985. Estimates contained in this publication provide a historic record and a benchmark for current estimates.

## INTRODUCTION

Production and value estimates for chickens, eggs, broilers and turkeys are published annually. This publication presents the final estimates, including some revisions, for 1984-87. Revisions were made after a thorough review of the original data, with consideration given to new data such as the 1987 Census of Agriculture and the general level and trends of all other applicable indications. Any revisions of inventory numbers required corresponding adjustments in other items.

Description of the various items in this report are as follows:

**EGGS PRODUCED:** Annual estimates of egg production cover the 12-month period from December 1 through November 30.

**SALES OF CHICKENS AND EGGS:** Sales are estimated from monthly and quarterly producer reports showing number of layers that were sold during the preceding month. Estimates of chickens sold are checked against data on commercial slaughter of mature chickens.

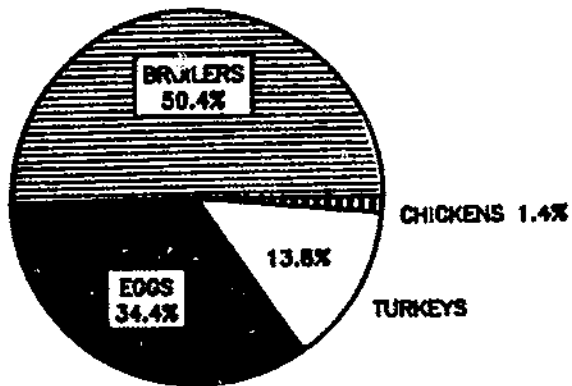
**BROILERS:** Broilers are all young chickens of heavy or cross breeds raised for meat, including cornish game hens and fryer-roasters, but excludes chickens kept primarily for egg production.

**PRICES:** Average annual prices per pound of chickens, broilers and per dozen eggs are computed from monthly prices received by producers, weighted by the estimated quantities sold each month. Egg prices are for all sales, including hatching eggs and those sold at retail by producers.

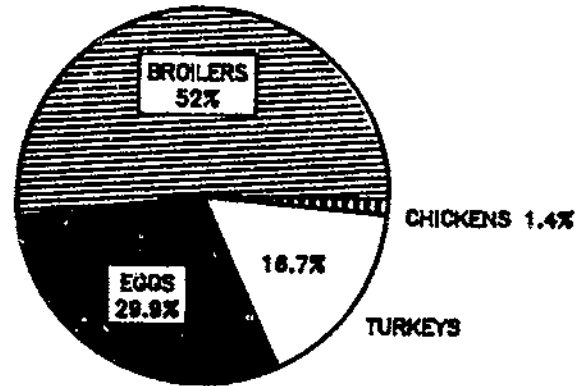
**INCOME:** Value of production for chickens and eggs are computed by multiplying quantities sold by the annual average price. Value of production from broilers is derived by multiplying pounds produced by price per pound. It includes consumption in households of broiler producers.

**TURKEYS RAISED:** Estimates are based primarily on turkey poults placed by commercial hatcheries. Estimates include the number of young turkeys for slaughter plus the number entering breeding flocks during a calendar year. Day old poults exported are excluded while poults imported into the U.S. are included.

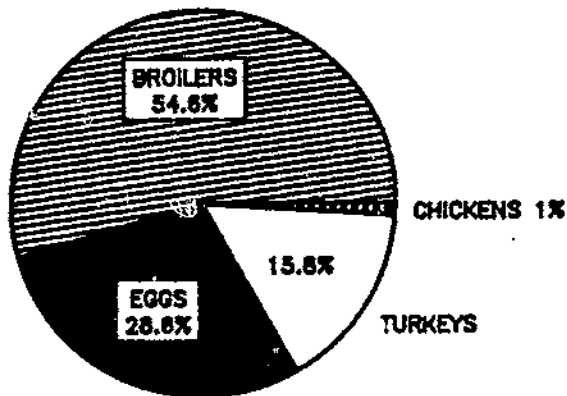
VALUE OF PRODUCTION

UNITED STATES 1984



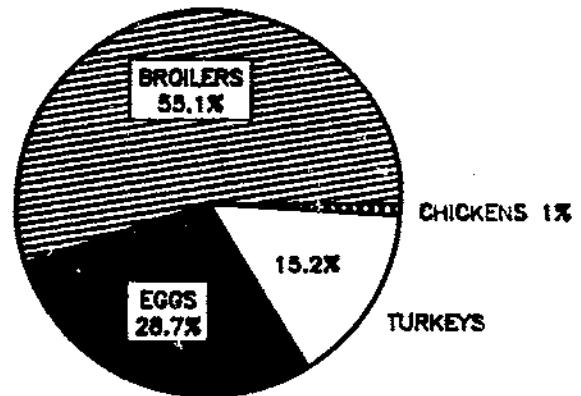
VALUE OF PRODUCTION
