3. The 2012 *JAAE* Outstanding Journal Article Award

The 2012 award covers articles in the November 2011, February 2012, and May 2012 issues. The selection process involved rankings by the Editorial Council. In the first stage, five or six Council members were randomly assigned to each volume with instructions to select the best three articles. These responses were then collated to identify the top four picks. In the second stage, all 16 Council members were asked to rank their first and second choices from the top four picks. Based on this process, the winner is

4. Editorial Team

Editors Marchant and Bosch share responsibility for all submissions for the February, May, and November issues with each handling approximately half of the submissions. Selection of an editor for a particular submission depends on the subject area and each of the editor's schedules. Associate Editor Michael Wetzstein oversees the August Proceedings issue.

5. Sheridan Press

The Volume 41, April 2009 issue was the first to be published by the Sheridan Press. The contract with Sheridan Press has been extended to cover 2012–2014 (issues 44–46). Thanks are extended to Lisa Small, Susan Rudolph, and Sheridan Press for their services. The team of copyeditors, proofers, and production managers

are very efficient in dealing with galley proofs and handling of the publication. Thanks to the team for publishing all 2012 issues on time.

Sheridan Press provides the editors with PDF versions of the articles published in the issues. Starting in 2010, the SAEA and Sheridan Press have published four issues in each volume: February, May, August (Proceedings Issue), and November. Editors place the volume and each issue on the *AgEcon Search* web site. *JAAE* also entered into an agreement in 2012 with EBSCO Publishing to further disseminate content of *JAAE* through its Internet and other electronic media.

The February 2013 issue, Vol. 45(1), has already been published and has been loaded on the *AgEcon Search* web site. The May 2013 issue is almost ready to go to the Sheridan Press for copyediting. The August issue is solely devoted to invited papers and other proceedings material from the SAEA annual meetings. The issue will not contain any regular peer-reviewed articles, but the manuscripts are reviewed by members of the Editorial Council. It is expected the August 2013 issue will have 18 invited paper articles and five lifetime achievement articles.

6. Institute for Scientific Information and Scopus Applications

In November 2010, the previous editorial team of Ashok Mishra and Jeffrey Gillespie reapplied to Thomson Reuters—the former Institute for Scientific Information (ISI)—to have the

JAAE covered by the Web of Science. Coverage would mean articles published in the JAAE would be included in the Social Science Citation Index, an important factor for some authors in deciding where to submit their work. The ISI computes an "impact factor" for each covered journal, which provides an objective means for assessing journal quality and improvement over time.

The application process is completed when three on-time current and forthcoming issues have been submitted. We were informed that our application was not successful. Further discussions are ongoing with the Board as to next steps to be taken to enhance the possibilities of a successful reapplication.

The editors have initiated an application to have *JAAE* covered by Scopus, a bibliographic database of abstracts and citations for academic journal articles. We expect to hear from the Scopus Content Selection and Advisory Board regarding our application in 6–12 months.

7. Reviewers

Two hundred three reviewers provided reviews to the Journal in 2012. They were selected on the basis of their expertise in the subject matter, but also their willingness to provide constructive comment in a timely fashion. Their names are listed in the appendix to this report.
