CWAE HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Drs. Ardelle Lundeen. Sylvia Lane, Linda Lee, and Barbara Redman--1980 AAEA Ad Hoc Committee formed to determine status, role, and opportunities of women agricultural economists and the need for a women's committee in the AAEA.
- CWAE officially organized as a Standing Committee of the AAEA at 1981 summer meetings held at **Clemson University** (originally named Committee on Women's **Opportunities in Agricultural Economics** (COWOP). Changed to CWAE in 1984).
- 1981 Steering Committee included Drs. Ardelle Lundeen (Chair), Sylvia Lane (Vice Chair), Linda Lee, Barbara Redman, Margo Rich Ogus, and Katherine Reichelderfer.
- Originally 39 members. By 1988, 220 members. Though it has varied over the period since 1988, the current membership is 178.
- CWAE published its first directory of women agricultural economists in 1982. It contained 114 names. The second directory, in 1988, contained 350 names.
