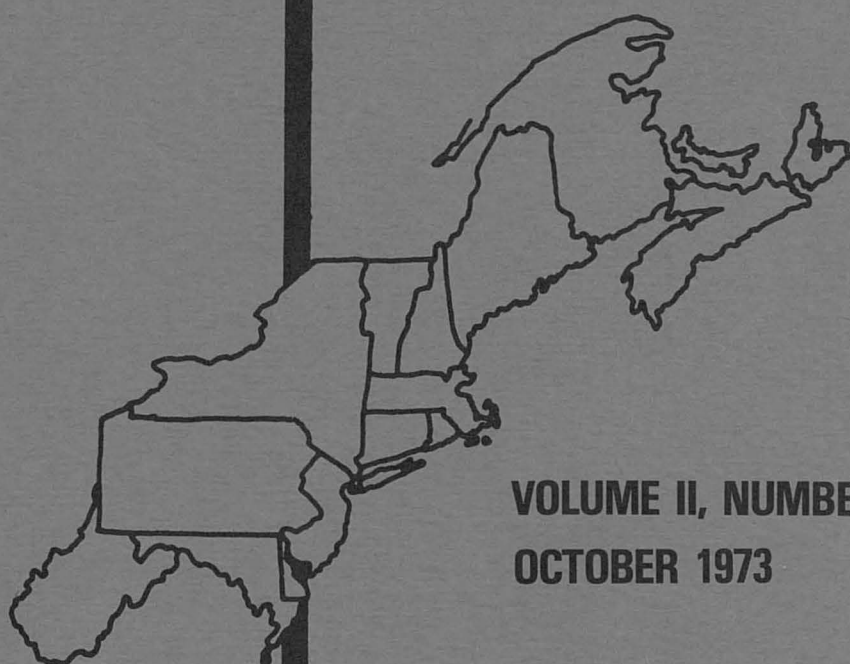

The Northeastern Agricultural Economics Council is privileged to announce the Distinguished Member Award for Dr. Bradford Dean Crossmon, Professor of Agricultural and Food Economics at the University of Massachusetts. In making the award, the Council makes formal recognition of Dr. Crossmon's thirty-six years of continuous devoted service to Northeastern agriculture.

Dr. Crossmon is a recognized leader in Farm Management Extension and Research Work as well as an accomplished teacher of economic principles to many undergraduate and graduate students. Brad provided leadership for an In Service Graduate Training Program at the University of Massachusetts for county agricultural agents, teachers of vocational agriculture, and leaders of farm cooperatives. He was also the leader of the New England Dairy Farm Management Study with Harvard University, the six New England Land Grant Universities and Hood Foundation cooperating.

Dr. Crossmon has served as Visiting Scientist and Professor at the University of Puerto Rico, directed a land scheme study in Malaysia, and more recently served as a Research Consultant on development of a research program for the Virgin Islands.

Brad served as Chairman of the New England Agricultural Economics Council from 1961 to 1963 and holds membership in several professional associations. He has been active in many community and church activities and has served on numerous departmental and University committees.

As a professional agricultural economist, Bradford Crossmon has the marvelous ability to apply economic theory to people's problems, thus enabling individuals, families and business people to reach wise economic decisions.
