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


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

FOREIGN AGRICULTURAL TRADE OF THE UNITED STATES

Digest

The United States is the world's largest exporter and second largest importer of agricultural products. Exports -- the bulk of which were destined for the industrialized countries of Western Europe, Japan and Canada -- totaled a record \$6.1 billion in fiscal 1963-64 compared with the previous year's \$5.1 billion. The increase in exports to Europe was accounted for partly by expanded shipments to both the European Economic Community and the European Free Trade Association and by substantial increases in exports to the European Soviet Bloc, particularly the USSR and Poland. Imports, originating mostly in the developing countries in Latin America, Asia, and Africa, amounted to \$4.1 billion in 1963-64 compared with \$3.9 billion a year earlier. The largest source was Latin America, where imports from the Latin American Free Trade Association alone (particularly Brazil) expanded enough to account for more than the increase from all of Latin America. Exports have followed a rising trend in the past 5 years, while imports have fluctuated at or below \$4.1 billion. Ten countries took 61 percent of U.S. agricultural exports, while 10 countries were the source of 54 percent of the agricultural imports in 1963-64. While exports to all areas reached record highs in fiscal 1963-64, those to Europe and Asia accounted for the bulk of the overall increase.

The United States was a net exporter of agricultural products again in fiscal 1963-64. Agricultural exports exceeded imports by \$1,979 million, up sharply from the export surplus of \$1,170 million in 1962-63. The higher export surplus resulted from a 20 percent rise in exports to \$6,074 million in 1963-64 from \$5,078 million the year before, while imports increased by 5 percent to \$4,096 million.

U.S. agricultural exports were estimated at \$3,465 million in July-January of 1964-65 compared with actual exports of \$3,509 million a year earlier. The 1964-65 figure includes actual exports of \$3,241 million in July-December and an estimate of \$225 million for January. The longshoremen's strike at Atlantic

and Gulf ports resulted in an estimated export decline this January of \$317 million from last January. Despite the effects of the strike, exports increased in this period for animal fats, hides and skins, dairy products, fruits, soybeans, vegetable oils, and protein meal.

U.S. agricultural exports for calendar year 1964 advanced to a record \$6,348 million compared with the previous record of \$5,584 million a year earlier. This larger total for 1964 exceeds by \$98 million the estimate carried in the February issue of this publication. Estimated exports of cotton, vegetable oils, tobacco, and some other items toward the close of 1964 in anticipation of the longshoremen's strike were larger than expected.

The 15 top markets for U.S. agricultural exports accounted for about three-fourths of total U.S. agricultural exports in July-December 1964. Export gains were reported for 12 of the 15 markets: India, the Netherlands, West Germany, Italy, Pakistan, Belgium-Luxembourg, UAR-Egypt, Brazil, France, Republic of Korea, Yugoslavia, and Taiwan. The 3 countries that showed declines were Japan, Canada, and the United Kingdom. Nonetheless, Japan was the leading outlet.

U.S. agricultural exports to the European Economic Community (EEC) advanced to \$750 million in July-December 1964 from \$667 million a year earlier. Exports of commodities subject to variable levies totaled \$234 million in July-December 1964 compared with \$225 million a year earlier. The overall increase reflected a sharp advance in exports of feed grains, which offset declines in most other variable levy commodities especially rice, rye, wheat, broilers, fryers, and pork. Exports of turkeys and canned poultry also increased. Exports of commodities not subject to variable levies rose to an estimated \$516 million in July-December 1964 from \$442 million a year earlier. Increases occurred for soybeans, tallow, variety meats, vegetable oils, and other commodities.

Exports to the EEC advanced to \$1,415 million in calendar year 1964 from \$1,171 million in 1963. Variable levy products rose to \$458 million from \$412 million, reflecting a substantial gain in feed grains as well as smaller increases in rice, pork, turkeys, and canned poultry. Declines occurred for wheat, wheat flour, and broilers and fryers. Non-variable levy commodities expanded to \$958 million from \$759 million.


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U.S. agricultural imports for consumption declined to \$2,071 million in July-December 1964 from \$2,084 million a year earlier. The overall decline occurred in supplementary products, which fell to \$1,069 million in July-December from \$1,197 million a year earlier. This decline was about offset by a gain in complementary imports, which rose to \$1,002 million from \$887 million. The supplementary decline was concentrated mainly in imports of beef and veal, live

cattle, cane sugar, and molasses. The increase in complementary imports resulted mainly from larger imports of coffee, cocoa beans, crude natural rubber, spices, and tea.

U.S. agricultural exports under Government-financed programs in July-September 1964 were \$57 million larger and commercial exports for dollars were \$84 million larger than in July-September 1963. Principal commodity groups underlying the growth in commercial sales for dollars were feed grains, oilseeds and products, and animal products. For exports under programs, the leading increases were among exports of wheat and wheat flour, cotton, and oilseeds and products. There was a substantial decline in exports of dairy products under Government programs. In July-September 1964, principal agricultural exports under programs were made as sales for foreign currency under Title I of P.L. 480, followed by long-term supply and dollar credit sales under Title IV, foreign donations under Title III, famine and other emergency relief under Title II, and barter under Title III. Included among the dollar sales in July-September 1964, were credit sales of \$11 million, \$36 million less than in the same period of 1963 as a result of smaller purchases under the CCC credit sales program. This decrease was due to a general tightening of credit approval policy and the fact that the price of corn from CCC-owned stocks was considerably above the free-market price. The first Title IV, P.L. 480 private trade agreement was signed on January 6 with the Persian Gas Distribution Company of Tehran, Iran, for the purchase of about 367,000 bushels of wheat in 1964-65. Proceeds from the sale of this wheat in Iran will be used to expand the Company's production and distribution of liquid petroleum gas in Iran.

EXPORTS TO EUROPE AND ASIA AND IMPORTS FROM LATIN AMERICA
EXPANDED U.S. FOREIGN AGRICULTURAL TRADE IN 1963-64 OVER 1962-63

The United States is the world's largest exporter and the second largest importer of agricultural products. In fiscal 1963-64 the combined value of agricultural exports and imports amounted to over \$10 billion and represented transactions with over 150 countries. The 10 leading outlets accounted for 61 percent of total U.S. agricultural exports, while the top 10 sources provided 54 percent of the agricultural imports (figure 1).

The bulk of U.S. agricultural exports was destined for the industrialized countries of Western Europe, Japan and Canada while the bulk of U.S. agricultural imports originated in the developing countries in Latin America, Asia, and Africa. The United States provided the dollar-short developing countries with high quality agricultural products under the Food-for-Peace program. In 1963-64 about one-fourth of U.S. agricultural exports moved under the Food-for-Peace program, mainly to developing countries. Exports under the program to the developing countries totaled \$1.6 billion, about the same as in the previous year.

U.S. agricultural exports to all areas in 1963-64 totaled a record \$6.1 billion compared with the previous year's \$5.1 billion. Nearly all of the gain was accounted for by increases in dollar shipments to Western Europe and Asia. Wheat shipments to the Soviet Union totaled \$110 million in 1963-64 compared with none in the previous year.


Export and Import Trends

During the past 5 years, agricultural exports trended upward to a peak of \$6.1 billion in 1963-64, while imports remained close to \$4 billion in most years. Developments underlying the increase in exports included the rapid industrial growth in Western Europe and Japan. In the past 5 years, industrial production increased by 25 percent in Western Europe and over 60 percent in Japan. This rapid growth expanded consumer income and purchasing power, leading to greater consumer demand for higher quality food and diversification of diet.

A substantial part of the U.S. export increase has been in raw products such as soybeans, feed grains, hides and skins, and cotton. Most industrial countries encouraged indigenous production of meat, poultry, and dairy products, which give rise to the importation of raw materials such as feed grains, soybeans, and protein meal to produce livestock products. In addition, the rapid population growth overseas also contributed to expanded U.S. agricultural exports. Inflationary trends in Western Europe encouraged liberalization of imports as a means of combating rising food prices.

U.S. agricultural imports changed relatively little, mainly because increased production of many products dropped prices. Imports totaled \$4.1 billion in 1963-64 compared with \$4.0 billion in 1958-59. However, quantity increased by 5 percent -- more than value -- reflecting mainly lower prices for tropical products complementary to U.S. production. In the past 5 years, coffee prices fell 14 percent, cocoa beans 42 percent, and crude natural rubber 8 percent. Consequently, the value of complementary imports stood lower in 1963-64 than in 1958-59. On the other hand, imports of supplementary products, partially competitive with U.S. production, increased in the past 5 years. This increase stemmed from substantially larger imports of beef and veal and cane sugar. The rise in beef and veal imports reflected strong U.S. demand for lean meat in the manufacture of prepared hamburgers, frankfurters, and luncheon meats. Sugar imports reflected higher prices in the past 3 years due to the precipitous drop in Cuban sugar production. Sugar prices were relatively low during 1958-59 and 1959-60 and went up sharply in 1961-62, with the slide in Cuban production. Now, however, with world sugar production gaining sharply, prices are trending downward to the relatively low levels that existed prior to 1961-62.

Exports by Area

Europe.--The pattern of U.S. agricultural exports shifted gradually in recent years (table 1). Europe remained the top dollar outlet for U.S. agricultural exports, taking \$2,643 million in 1963-64 compared with \$1,726 million in 1958-59. However, the share of exports to Europe fell to a low of 44 percent in 1963-64 compared with 46 percent in 1958-59 and the high of 52 percent in 1956-57. Government-financed programs accounted for only 8 percent of exports to Europe in 1963-64 compared with 31 percent in 1958-59.

Agricultural exports to the European Economic Community (EEC) reached a record \$1,333 million in 1963-64 compared with the previous year's \$1,070 million (table 10, pp 32-33). The unusually wet season produced substantially low quality wheat which required increased imports.

Agricultural shipments to the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) advanced to \$720 million in 1963-64 from \$603 million in 1962-63 (table 10, pp 32-33).

Agricultural exports to the European Soviet Bloc advanced to \$312 million in 1963-64 from \$103 million the year before, reflecting principally larger grain shipments to the USSR and Poland but also some increases to East Germany, Czechoslovakia, and Hungary. The larger shipments in 1963-64 were fundamentally the outcome of Europe's poor harvests (table 2).

Asia.--In the past 5 years Asia increased its takings of U.S. exports in both absolute amount and share of total U.S. shipments. U.S. exports to this area in 1963-64 totaled \$1,851 million, about \$859 million above the 1958-59 level. Exports to Asia in 1963-64 represented 30 percent of U.S. agricultural exports compared with only 26 percent in 1958-59. In 1963-64 about 45 percent of exports to Asia moved under Government-financed programs, primarily to India, Pakistan, Republic of Korea, Taiwan, Viet-Nam and other developing countries. Dollar sales increased sharply in the past 5 years, with a sharp rise in industrial development in Japan, Taiwan, the Philippines, Israel, and other countries.

Canada.--U.S. exports to Canada increased throughout the 5-year period and accounted for around 10 percent of U.S. exports. Exports of \$618 million in 1963-64 included an estimated \$161 million of intransit shipments compared with the 1962-63 total of \$517 million, which included intransit shipments of \$100 million. Canada was a ready market for U.S. fruits, vegetables, and other specialty products. It also was an important market for U.S. soybeans, cotton, and feed grains.

Latin America.--Although the dollar value increased slightly, Latin America's share of U.S. agricultural exports declined since 1958-59. The area accounted for 9 percent of U.S. agricultural exports in 1963-64 compared with 14 percent in 1958-59. Growth in U.S. exports there was hampered by relatively slow economic growth and a low level of foreign exchange. A substantial part of the decline in the area's foreign exchange holdings can be traced to lower prices for its exports of tropical products and raw materials. However, the increase in sugar prices in 1962-63 provided additional foreign exchange for many countries. Another unfavorable factor affecting U.S. shipments to that area was the loss of the Cuban market, which prior to 1961 was the largest there. The United States now maintains an embargo on trade with Cuba. In 1963-64 about 37 percent of exports to Latin America moved under Government-financed programs compared with 17 percent in 1958-59. The Alliance for Progress in recent years has stepped up shipments under Government-financed programs.

Agricultural exports to the Latin American Free Trade Association (LAFTA), continuing to rise, totaled \$282 million in 1963-64 compared with \$274 million in 1962-63 (table 3).

Agricultural exports to the Central American Common Market spurted to \$37 million in 1963-64 from \$31 million in 1962-63. This was the third consecutive yearly gain (table 4).

Africa.--In the past 5 years Africa became a growing outlet for U.S. agricultural exports. In 1963-64, Africa took U.S. agricultural products amounting to \$379 million compared with \$102 million in 1958-59. Africa now accounts for 6 percent of U.S. agricultural exports compared with 3 percent in 1958-59. A substantial part of the increase was in shipments under Government-financed programs, which accounted for 83 percent of total shipments in 1963-64. Dollar exports have increased to \$63 million from \$47 million in 1958-59.

Oceania.--Oceania (Australia and New Zealand) continued to be a relatively small but stable market for U.S. agricultural exports, averaging slightly over \$40 million throughout the 1959-64 period. This area accounted for about 1 percent of U.S. exports over the past 6 years. Oceania, an agricultural area, produces temperate agricultural products competitive with most products grown in the United States. U.S. exports to Oceania consist mainly of tobacco and cotton. Australia, the most important outlet in this area, has emphasized agricultural development, especially in the production of cotton and tobacco. This may eventually limit future growth in U.S. exports to this area. The Australians maintain a policy of protecting their domestic tobacco producers, evidenced particularly by mixing requirements for tobacco products.

Imports by Area

As with exports, a gradual change occurred in the origin of U.S. agricultural imports in the past 5 years (table 5). Latin America remained the largest source of U.S. agricultural imports, but the value of imports from Latin America and their share of total U.S. agricultural imports declined since 1958-59. Imports from Asia remained about the same throughout the 6-year period. Imports from Africa and Oceania also increased. Imports from Canada declined in absolute value as well as in their share of overall U.S. import market for farm products.

Latin America.--Agricultural imports from Latin America in 1963-64 totaled \$1,739 million compared with the previous year's \$1,656 million and 1958-59's \$2,025 million. Lower coffee prices beginning in the middle 1950's accounted for a substantial part of the decline in total value of imports from Latin America. This price decline of 14 percent in the past 5 years affected a commodity accounting for about half of U.S. agricultural imports from Latin America. A substantial part of the decline in imports from Latin America since 1961 resulted from the embargo on trade with Cuba. Agricultural imports from Cuba totaled nearly \$500 million a year. Prior to the embargo, Cuba was an important supplier of sugar to the United States. Since then, however, other Latin American producers have increased their sugar shipments to the United States.

Further limiting the growth of imports from Latin America was the U.S. embargo on imports of fresh or salted meat from Latin America because of foot-and-mouth disease. Countries having foot-and-mouth disease may ship to the United States only meat that has been cooked or otherwise preserved as prescribed by U.S. sanitary regulations. In the past 5 years the United States accounted for about one-half of all agricultural commodities exported from Latin America.

Agricultural imports from the LAFTA expanded to \$1,311 million in 1963-64 from \$1,207 million in 1962-63. Takings from several countries gained, but the most important were those from Brazil (table 6).

Agricultural imports from the CACM remained at \$200 million in 1963-64, the same level as in 1962-63 (table 7).

Asia.--Agricultural imports from Asia showed little overall change in the past 5 years. They totaled \$753 million in 1963-64 compared with \$726 million in 1962-63 and \$270 million in 1958-59. Throughout the 6 years, imports from Asia accounted for about one-fifth of U.S. agricultural imports. Complementary commodities -- principally rubber, silk, tea, spices, and cordage fibers -- accounted for nearly half of the agricultural imports from Asia. In recent years, imports of supplementary commodities increased mainly because of larger purchases of sugar, especially from the Philippines. Relatively low prices for crude natural rubber limited overall growth in agricultural imports from Asia. The use of natural rubber declined sharply in recent years because of the improved properties of synthetic rubber. In the past year, crude natural rubber accounted for one-fourth of rubber consumption in the United States, down sharply from the level a decade ago.

Europe.--Agricultural imports from Europe increased slightly in the past 5 years. Europe accounted for about one-sixth of all agricultural imports in 1963-64 compared with one-eighth in 1958-59. Value rose to \$555 million in 1963-64, about

the same as in the previous year, compared with \$488 million in 1958-59. The United States, although a major exporter of agricultural products to Europe, imported substantial quantities of special quality cigarette leaf from Greece and Turkey for blending with U.S. tobacco to develop the taste and aroma desired by U.S. smokers. In addition, Europe also supplied many specialty products, especially dairy and meat products.

Agricultural imports from the EEC rose to \$241 million in 1963-64 from \$235 million in 1962-63 (table 11, pp 46-47).

Agricultural imports from the EFTA declined to \$111 million in 1963-64 from \$114 million in 1962-63 (table 11, pp 46-47).

Agricultural imports from the European Soviet Bloc were valued at \$33 million in 1963-64 compared with \$32 million in 1962-63 (table 8).

Oceania.--Imports of agricultural products from Oceania rose sharply to \$442 million in 1963-64 from \$393 million the year before and \$207 million in 1958-59. Australia supplied 59 percent of the imports from this area, with New Zealand providing most of the remainder. Imports of beef alone accounted for 60 percent of imports from Oceania. Boneless beef for manufacturing was the chief meat import in line with the strong U.S. demand for beef for manufacturing products such as frankfurters, luncheon meats, and prepared hamburgers. The sharp rise in imports from this area got underway after the modification of the Australian-United Kingdom meat agreement in 1958 to permit Australia to ship low-grade meat to any destination including the United States without restrictions. This meat agreement was further modified in 1961 when all destination restrictions for meat were removed from higher grade meat. In the past 5 years relatively high prices in the United States compared with other leading world importing areas encouraged large shipments of boneless beef to the United States. In the past 5 years ending June 1964 beef and veal production in Australia increased by 11 percent and in New Zealand by 22 percent. Oceania is also an important supplier of apparel wool, carpet wool, sugar, and dairy products.

Africa.--Imports of agricultural products from Africa rose sharply in 1963-64 from the previous years. Imports totaled \$451 million in 1963-64 compared with \$393 million the previous year and \$323 million in 1958-59. Africa's agriculture provided about 11 percent of U.S. agricultural imports in 1963-64 compared with 8 percent in 1958-59. Over 80 percent of the imports from Africa were complementary products -- r ⁱnly coffee, cocoa beans, crude natural rubber, and tea. Apparel wool and cane sugar, the principal supplementary commodities, were supplied by the Republic of South Africa. Rising imports from Africa included increased coffee and cocoa bean shipments. Development policies in Africa were stepped up for coffee and cocoa beans. In addition, as many of the African countries became independent, they shifted their direction of trade from European countries to other countries, including the United States.

Canada.-- Canada has been supplying fewer agricultural commodities to the U.S. market in recent years. Imports from Canada declined to \$174 million in 1963-64 from \$185 million the year before and \$241 million in 1958-59. Nearly all the imports from Canada were supplementary products; over half consisted of dutiable cattle and meats. Canada's relative share of the U.S. import market declined to 4 percent in 1963-64 from 6 percent in 1958-59. Most of the decline resulted from smaller imports of dutiable cattle and meats. The United States was not an attractive market for Canadian stockers and feeders in the past few years because of relatively low U.S. cattle prices. In addition, Canadian farmers have been building up their herds from the low levels of a few years ago when drought conditions forced cutbacks. In addition to dutiable cattle and meats, the United States at times imported high quality barley for malting purposes. Imports from Canada also included considerable quantities of fruits, vegetables, hides and skins, and dairy products.

Trade with the European Economic Community

U.S. agricultural exports to the European Economic Community (EEC) in fiscal 1963-64 reached a record \$1,333 million compared with the previous year's \$1,070 million. The increase occurred both in commodities subject to the EEC system of variable import levies and in commodities not subject to levies. Imports of farm products from the EEC totaled \$241 million in 1963-64 compared with \$235 million a year earlier. Imports have run slightly over \$200 million throughout 1959-64 (tables 10, pp 32-33 and 11, pp 46-47).

Exports of commodities subject to variable levies rose to \$449 million in 1963-64 from \$393 million a year earlier. These figures include rice, not subject to the levy system until September 1964. Most of the increase resulted from the sharp rise in wheat exports in 1963-64. Other gains were in pork, feed grains, turkey, meat, stewing chickens, and canned poultry. The sharp rise in wheat exports resulted mainly from the relatively poor quality of the European wheat harvest in 1962-63, when EEC wheat production declined by 205 million bushels from the year before. The unusually wet season produced much low quality wheat, necessitating larger EEC imports of foreign wheat for blending with local wheat. The advance in pork and poultry meat exports is attributed mainly to the relatively short supply of meat in the EEC area and increased demand from consumers with larger incomes. Rye exports were down appreciably from the previous year, when they were unusually large because of reduced rye supplies in Western Europe. Lard exports continued relatively low. Last year's decline in exports of wheat flour and broilers and fryers reflected the prohibitive levels of the variable levies.

Exports of feed grains continued at a high level, although only slightly above 1963-64. The principal reason for the continued expansion of feed grain exports to the EEC area has been in the steady growth of its livestock industry. In addition, Italy liberalized imports of most feed grains in 1963. This provided an opportunity for the United States to compete in the Italian market. In prior years Italy's grain imports were mostly tied to bilateral agreements. In 1963-64 the United States accounted for about half of EEC feed grain imports.

Exports of agricultural commodities not subject to the EEC variable levy system increased to \$884 million in 1963-64 from \$676 million a year earlier. Most of the rise resulted from a substantial gain in exports of cotton, which advanced to \$191 million from \$87 million. The EEC consumed more cotton in 1963-64 than in 1962-63, and U.S. cotton prices were attractive to the principal EEC importers. Increases occurred also for exports of soybeans, tallow, variety meats, vegetable oils, and tobacco. However, fruit and vegetable imports declined due to limited supplies of some commodities in the United States along with higher prices, especially for canned fruits such as peaches and fruit cocktail. U.S. exports of dried edible beans were down from the high of a year earlier because of smaller exportable supplies in the United States and higher prices.

U.S. agricultural imports from the EEC consisted mainly of meats, fruits, nuts, and vegetables, olive oil, hides and skins, and dairy products. Imports totaled \$241 million in 1963-64 compared with \$235 million a year earlier and \$217 million in 1958-59. U.S. imports from the EEC have remained relatively stable, with only slight growth. Most imports from the EEC are specialty products such as canned hams and shoulders, cheeses, olives and other fruits,

nuts, and hides and skins. Most of these products are relatively high in quality and sell for higher prices in the United States than similar U.S. products.

Trade with the European Free Trade Association

U.S. agricultural exports to the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) totaled \$720 million in 1963-64 compared with \$609 million the year before and \$563 million in 1958-59. The United Kingdom accounted for most of the increase, taking \$448 million in 1963-64 compared with \$367 million a year earlier. Shipments to Sweden, Denmark, Portugal, and Switzerland also increased while exports to Austria, Norway, and Finland declined in the past fiscal year. Finland is an associate member of EFTA. The increase resulted mainly from a sharp rise in exports of wheat and flour, which totaled \$67 million in 1963-64 compared with \$19 million a year earlier. Cotton exports rose to \$66 million from \$38 million a year earlier. Tobacco exports rose to \$177 million from \$144 million. Exports of animal fats (principally lard to the United Kingdom) advanced to \$56 million from \$36 million. Other commodities showed relatively little change from the previous year. Declines were noted in feed grains, which fell to \$114 million from \$130 million. Nearly all the U.S. exports were raw materials used for manufacturing and for livestock feed. EFTA is the largest foreign market for U.S. unmanufactured tobacco and a large market for U.S. cotton, oilseeds, wheat, feed grains, fruits, and vegetables (table 10, pp 32-33).

U.S. agricultural imports from EFTA declined slightly in 1963-64 from 1962-63 -- to \$111 million from \$114 million. Principal reduction was in imports of Danish meats, primarily canned hams and shoulders. Meat supplies in Europe were in relatively short supply in the past year. Declines also occurred in imports of carpet wool, tea, oils and oilbearing materials, hides and skins, and grains and preparations. There were increases for fruits, nuts, vegetables, and dairy products. U.S. imports from EFTA have been gaining slightly in recent years. Imports in 1958-59 totaled \$88 million. Much like imports from the EEC, most imports from EFTA consisted of specialty products, principally meat products and dairy products. In addition, the United States imported large amounts of fruits, vegetables, nuts, carpet wool, and hides and skins from this area (table 11, pp 46-47).

Effect of Intransit Shipments to Canada

Intransit shipments to Canada for storage and for completion of loading of vessels at the mouth of the St. Lawrence Seaway totaled \$161 million in fiscal 1963-64 (table 9). These shipments consisted of grains and soybeans going to the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, UAR-Egypt, and 24 other countries. A total of \$106 million went to EEC and EFTA countries. U.S. exports to these countries were understated by the amounts moving through Canada. Moreover, there is no certainty that the shipments indicated for the Netherlands were intended for consumption there since that country is an important transhipment point.



EXPORTS COMPARED WITH IMPORTS, FISCAL 1963-64

The United States was a net exporter of agricultural products again in fiscal 1963-64. Agricultural exports exceeded agricultural imports (for consumption) by \$1,979 million, up sharply from the export surplus of \$1,170 million the year before (table 16).

The higher export surplus was the result of a 20 percent rise from a year earlier in exports to \$6,074 million, while imports increased by 5 percent to \$4,096 million.

Gains were registered in net exports (exports minus imports) of lard, tallow, poultry meat, butter, nonfat dry milk, cotton, wheat, rice, feed grains, oilseeds, tobacco, and citrus fruits. Declines occurred in net exports of hides and skins, evaporated milk, wheat flour, rye, oilcake and meal, vegetable oils, dried fruits, canned fruits and juices, and vegetables and preparations. For hides and skins, dried fruits, and vegetables and preparations, the declines in net exports were due to import increases. Food for relief and charity amounted to \$209 million in 1963-64 and \$207 million in 1962-63, less than 5 percent of total agricultural exports in both years.

U.S. imports of supplementary (partly competitive) agricultural commodities -- 54 percent of total agricultural imports in 1963-64 -- were valued at \$2,224 million. By comparison, supplementary imports in 1962-63, amounting to \$2,208 million, were 57 percent of the total.

Values declined from 1962-63 for net imports (imports minus exports) of most supplementary commodities. Net imports of live animals fell sharply because of lower U.S. feeder cattle prices. Moderate declines occurred in net imports of canned pork, cheese, apparel wool, nuts and preparations, and cane sugar. The United States became a net exporter in 1963-64 of other meats, excluding poultry. This classification is made up primarily of livers, tongues, and other variety meats.

Net imports of fresh and frozen beef and veal increased in 1963-64 over 1962-63. Most of this increase took place before the voluntary agreements with Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, and Mexico to limit their exports of beef and veal to the United States. Since then, U.S. imports of beef and veal have dropped sharply.

The only other supplementary import commodity classification that showed a net increase was "other fruits and preparations." This classification contains such commodities as dates, olives, melons, berries, and jellies and jams, which are not produced domestically in sufficient quantities to supply U.S. demand.



Commercial exports of agricultural commodities exceeded supplementary imports by \$2,290 million in 1963-64, compared with a gap of \$1,324 million a year earlier. Commercial exports, which totaled \$4,514 million in 1963-64, exceeded total agricultural imports for the first time.

Imports of complementary (noncompetitive) commodities were valued at \$1,871 million in 1963-64, compared with \$1,699 million the year before. Much of the increase was caused by higher coffee prices -- coffee alone made up 60 percent of U.S. complementary imports in 1963-64.

Among the complementary products, net imports increased for wool, bananas, and coffee, while net imports of silk, cocoa beans, tea, spices, and rubber declined.



Export Highlights

JULY 1964-JANUARY 1965

U.S. agricultural exports were estimated at \$3,465 million in July 1964-January 1965 compared with actual exports of \$3,509 million a year earlier (table 17). The 1964-65 figure includes actual exports of \$3,241 million in July-December and an estimate of \$225 million for January. Agricultural exports in July-December (table 22) were 9 percent above a year earlier. The longshoremen's strike on the Atlantic and Gulf ports resulted in an estimated export decline in January of \$317 million from the same month a year earlier.

Some of the 9 percent increase in July-December resulted from larger shipments in anticipation of the longshoremen's strike. In addition, exports in February were expected to be larger; they likely made up more of the earlier loss. The principal declines in July-January included wheat and flour, feed grains, rice, rye, cotton, tobacco, meats, and poultry products. Despite the effects of the strike, there were increases in this period for animal fats, hides and skins, dairy products, fruits, soybeans, vegetable oils, and protein meal.

Agricultural exports in calendar 1964 advanced to a record \$6,348 million compared with the previous record of \$5,584 million a year earlier (tables 18 and 23). The total is \$98 million above the estimate given in the February issue of this publication, which has a detailed analysis of calendar 1964 exports. The increase resulted from larger exports in anticipation of the longshoremen's strike. This was particularly true of cotton exports, which totaled \$97 million in December compared with \$50 million in November. Record exports of wheat, soybeans, protein meal, rice, corn, inedible tallow, and hides and skins accounted for much of the overall increase in calendar 1964.

Exports in July-December 1964 were 9 percent above those of a year earlier. However, in July-January they were 1 percent below a year earlier because of the longshoremen's strike that started January 11. Exports in January 1965 were reduced more than in January 1963 when a strike also affected Gulf and Atlantic ports from late December until late January. Exports in January 1963 were reduced \$177 million from a year earlier. Exports in January 1965 were an estimated \$317 million below January 1964.

LEADING EXPORT MARKETS: JULY-DECEMBER 1964

The 15 leading markets for U.S. agricultural exports accounted for about three fourths of total U.S. agricultural exports in July-December 1964 (tables 19 and 24). There were increases to 12 of the 15 leading markets: India, the Netherlands, West Germany, Italy, Pakistan, Belgium and Luxembourg, UAR-Egypt,

Brazil, France, Republic of Korea, Yugoslavia, and Taiwan. Declines occurred for Japan, Canada, and the United Kingdom. Japan was the leading outlet for U.S. agricultural products with \$352 million, slightly below the \$368 million a year earlier. There were smaller exports of wheat and cotton to Japan in July-December 1964 than a year earlier. Wheat production in Japan improved somewhat in the 1964 season from a year earlier. Exports of feed grains and soybeans increased in July-December 1964. Japan is an especially important market for U.S. soybeans, hides and skins, tallow, feed grains, cotton, and some other agricultural products.

Including intransit commodities, Canada was the second best market for U.S. agricultural exports in the first half of fiscal 1964-65. Exports to Canada totaled \$330 million compared with \$334 million a year earlier. Intransit commodities totaled an estimated \$71 million in July-December 1964. After deducting intransit commodities from the total, Canada was the fifth largest market for U.S. agricultural exports. Exports to India, the third largest market, increased to \$277 million in July-December 1964 from \$198 million a year earlier. India this year has been receiving unusually large shipments under the Food for Peace program to help it meet its deficit after a relatively poor year of grain production. The United Kingdom was the fourth largest market for U.S. agricultural products -- \$250 million compared with \$258 million a year earlier.

EXPORTS TO THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY

July-December 1964.--U.S. agricultural exports to the European Economic Community (EEC) advanced to \$750 million in July-December 1964 from \$667 million a year earlier (table 20). Most of the increase reflected larger exports of non-variable levy commodities, principally soybeans, variety meats, expressed vegetable oils, and other commodities.

Exports of commodities subject to variable levies totaled \$234 million in July-December compared with \$225 million a year earlier. However, exports in December 1964 were down to \$45 million from the high of \$49 million in December a year earlier. Much of the high value then reflected large shipments of wheat grain due to reduced production and lower quality wheat in EEC. The overall increase in July-December reflected a sharp advance in exports of feed grains, which rose to \$189 million from \$141 million a year earlier. This offset declines in most other variable levy commodities, especially rice, rye, wheat, broilers, fryers, and pork. Other increases were noted for turkeys and canned poultry.

Exports of commodities not subject to variable levies rose to an estimated \$516 million in July-December 1964 from \$442 million a year earlier. The sharp rise in soybeans accounted for over one-fourth of the gain. Other export commodities that increased included tallow, variety meats, and vegetable oils. In addition, there was a substantial increase in other commodities not listed in the table. A substantial part of the increase in other commodities reflected larger exports of protein meal. Cotton exports in July-December to EEC were down from a year ago, reflecting an increase in foreign free world production. U.S. tobacco exports were up slightly in July-December. U.S. exports of tobacco to the EEC met strong competition from Rhodesia where tobacco production increased 60 percent over 1963. U.S. exports of oilseeds to EEC continued to gain, reflecting the small olive oil production in the Mediterranean Basin and increased demand for protein meal from expanding livestock industries in the area. EEC accounted for two-fifths of U.S. exports of feed grains in July-December, and one-third of U.S. soybean exports.

Calendar year 1964.--Exports to the European Economic Community advanced to \$1,415 million in calendar year 1964 from \$1,171 million in 1963 (table 21). Exports subject to EEC variable levies rose to \$458 million from \$412 million. Exports of feed grains alone increased to \$326 million in 1964 from \$276 million a year earlier. Smaller increases occurred in rice, pork, turkeys, and canned poultry. Exports of wheat grain declined to \$59 million from \$63 million. Most of the wheat exports in 1964 took place in the first half while the big wheat shipments in 1963 were in the latter half. Variable levies continued to severely limit market access for wheat flour, broilers, and fryers. Exports not subject to variable levies advanced to \$958 million from \$759 million a year earlier, primarily due to substantial gains in soybeans and cotton. Increases were noted also for variety meats, vegetable oils, and oilcake and meal while fruits and vegetables were smaller.

Import Highlights

JULY-DECEMBER 1964

U.S. agricultural imports for consumption declined to \$2,071 million in July-December 1964 from \$2,084 million a year earlier. A decline in supplementary products, which fell to \$1,069 million in July-December from \$1,197 million a year earlier, was offset by a gain in complementary imports, which rose to \$1,002 million from \$887 million (table 25).

Nonagricultural imports rose to \$7,622 million from \$6,801 million.

Supplementary Imports

U.S. imports of supplementary products declined to \$1,069 million in July-December 1964 from \$1,197 million a year earlier. The decline was concentrated mainly in imports of beef and veal, live cattle, cane sugar, and molasses. Imports of beef and veal fell to 369 million pounds from 634 million pounds a year earlier. Imports of beef and veal from Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, and Mexico fell sharply. These countries have voluntary agreements with the United States to limit shipments of beef and veal to the U.S. market.

There has been a substantial shift in the pattern of world meat trade. Demand for beef in Western Europe has increased substantially in recent months because of higher incomes and relatively small production. Argentina has exported limited quantities of beef this year because of a prior drought and a buildup of its herds. The record production of beef and veal in the United States, along with lower prices, discouraged foreign shippers from exporting large quantities to the United States during July-December. Moreover, beef prices in Western Europe were relatively high compared with previous years.

The volume of imports of dairy products fell slightly in July-December. However, the import of higher priced items resulted in an overall value gain. Imports of hides and skins rose to 64 million pounds in July-December 1964 from 62 million a year earlier. The increase resulted from larger imports of sheep and lamb skins. These were mainly specialized products not produced here in enough volume to meet domestic needs. Imports of dutiable cattle fell to 244,000 head in July-December 1964 from 321,000 a year earlier. Smaller imports of dutiable cattle reflected larger production of U.S. stocker and feeder cattle along with relatively low U.S. prices.

U.S. imports of cane sugar fell to 2,257,000 short tons, from 2,301,000 a year earlier. However, value fell more sharply because of lower world sugar prices in July-December 1964 than a year earlier. Value declined 24 percent to \$260 million. Sugar imports accounted for around two-fifths of U.S. domestic sugar consumption.

Tobacco imports increased to 87 million pounds from 84 million a year earlier. Value rose by \$7 million. Most U.S. tobacco imports consisted of oriental leaf for blending with U.S. tobacco to provide the taste and aroma desired by smokers.

Imports of oilseeds and products rose slightly to \$81 million from \$74 million a year earlier. The gain reflected larger imports of copra, coconut oil, olive oil, palm oil, and palm kernel oil.

Imports of vegetables and preparations rose slightly -- to \$38 million from \$34 million -- mainly due to larger imports of white potatoes. Most of the increase in imports of white potatoes came from Canada. Imports of fruits and preparations increased slightly, mainly because of larger imports of mandarin oranges and olives.

U.S. imports of grains and preparations increased by \$3 million to total \$26 million. The increase resulted mainly from larger imports of barley grain. Imports of barley grain were of high quality for use in the malting industry.

Complementary Imports

U.S. imports of complementary products rose to \$1,002 million in July-December 1964 from \$887 million a year earlier. The increase resulted mainly from larger imports of coffee, cocoa beans, crude natural rubber, spices, and tea. Somewhat offsetting were declines in raw silk, hard fibers, and carpet wool. The sharp increase in the value of banana imports reflected a change in valuation procedure by the Bureau of the Customs.

U.S. coffee imports declined in quantity to 1,459 million pounds from 1,699 million. However, value increased by 15 percent because of higher prices. The general rise in coffee prices reflected a substantial reduction in coffee production in Brazil because of past crop damage.

Imports of crude natural rubber rose to 516 million pounds from 381 million. Lower prices have stimulated U.S. imports of crude natural rubber.

Imports of carpet wool declined to 69 million pounds from 107 million a year earlier. The decline reflected a continued shift to man-made fibers in the carpet industry. In addition, carpet wool mill activity was down from a year earlier.



Government Program Export Highlights

DOLLAR SALES AND GOVERNMENT PROGRAM EXPORTS, JULY-SEPTEMBER 1964

U.S. agricultural exports advanced \$140.5 million in the first quarter of fiscal 1964-65 from the same period a year earlier. Three-fifths of the increase (\$83.6 million) was in commercial sales for dollars and two-fifths (\$56.9 million) in exports under Government-financed programs (table 28).

Dollar Sales

The most significant increase in dollar exports (\$41.9 million) was in feed grains, principally corn and grain sorghums.

Oilseeds and products were second as dollar exports. The \$34.7 million advance in this commodity group took place in oilcake and meal (\$13.2 million), soybeans (\$7.0 million), and flaxseed (\$6.7 million), followed by smaller increases in soybean, cottonseed, and peanut oils. Rapid growth in the livestock industries in Western Europe and Japan continued to provide an expanded market for U.S. feed grains, soybeans, and protein meal. Exports of flaxseed were facilitated by sales from Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) stocks at less than domestic market price.

Advances in exports of tallow, variety meats, and hides and skins accounted for the rise of \$18.4 million in commercial exports of animals and products, except dairy, compared with the same quarter of 1963. The outlook for exports of these products during 1964-65 is favorable. Exports of variety meats are expected to set records, since demand is strong in Western Europe, and U.S. supplies are needed to supplement European production. Exports of hides and skins are also expected to reach a record high; U.S. production has increased, and smaller supplies are available from other major producing countries.

The July-September rise of \$14.3 million in dollar exports of dairy products was mostly in nonfat dry milk and butter; exports of both were facilitated by a payment-in-kind program for exports from commercial stocks and by sales for export from Government-owned stocks at less than domestic market prices. Exports of dairy products under Government programs declined \$24.9 million, with most of the decrease in Title III donations, since only limited supplies of these products were available for export from CCC stocks.

Exports of wheat and flour increased about 5 percent over July-September 1963, but the increase occurred in program shipments, as dollar exports declined substantially from the same quarter of 1963. Wheat exports are expected to fall to a more normal level in 1964-65, since world wheat production is expected to exceed the 1962 record and world trade is expected to decline significantly from the 1963-64 volume.

Dollar exports of U.S. cotton rose \$5.1 million in July-September 1964 from a year earlier. Total exports of this fiber rose \$29.0 million, mostly because of the \$23.9 million increase in program exports. U.S. exports of cotton are expected to decline in July-June 1964-65 from 1963-64, principally because exports by foreign free-world countries to Communist countries are declining, foreign production is higher, and some working down of stocks is likely in importing countries. Smaller exports to Communist countries this year mean smaller total markets for foreign-grown cotton, resulting in larger available supplies of foreign-grown cotton, which will compete with U.S. cotton in free-world markets.

Exports of rice and fruits and vegetables remained at substantially the same levels as a year earlier.

Exports under credit sales programs. -- Disbursements under Export-Import Bank guarantees and purchases under the CCC credit sales program (included in exports outside Government-financed programs -- dollar sales -- in tables 30 and 31) fell \$36 million in July-September 1964 from a year earlier (table 29). All of the decline occurred in purchases under the CCC credit sales program. This decrease was due to a general tightening of credit approval policy; also, the price of corn from CCC-owned stocks was considerably above the free-market price.

On September 28, 1964, the Department announced a sales-for-export program on a competitive bid basis for cotton for export under the CCC credit sales program and against barter contracts. Cotton purchases under the CCC credit sales program, which amounted to \$10.9 million in July-September 1963, did not begin until October 1964; they have increased sharply since then.

On December 28, 1964, the Department announced that the CCC export credit sales program had been revised to provide deferred payment terms in connection with certain agricultural commodities from private stocks. Prior to this announcement, export credit arrangements were available only for commodities in CCC inventory or tobacco under loan to CCC. (Regulations for the new program are included in "Export Credit Regulations, GSM-3," issued by the Office of the General Sales Manager, Foreign Agricultural Service, on February 11, 1965.)

Under the revised program, exporters who ship from private stocks will receive an export commodity certificate (CCC-341) for an amount equal to the port value of the commodity. Such certificates may be transferred or may be used for the purchase of commodities from CCC inventory (or tobacco under loan to CCC) for export pursuant to announcements issued by CCC providing for redemption of such certificates. Exporters may ship from private stocks although the same commodity is available from CCC. Provisions of the previous CCC export credit sales program are not changed by this announcement, except that exports from private stocks may be made under existing approved credit applications.

Provision of deferred payment terms in connection with exports from private stocks likely will result in a substantial increase in exports under the CCC credit sales program. The new program will make it possible to finance exports of wheat and flour, milled rice, bulgur wheat, cornmeal, soybean oil, and cottonseed oil from privately owned stocks.

Exports under Government-financed programs

Exports under Government programs advanced \$56.9 million in July-September 1964 from the same period of 1963. A large increase in shipments under the P.L. 480 Title I (sales for foreign currency program) and under the Title IV (long-term supply and dollar credit sales program) and smaller increases in barter and AID program shipments were partially offset by a significant decline in donations under Title III and a smaller decrease under Title II.

Most of the advance in Title I shipments occurred in wheat exports. Over 80 percent of Title I wheat shipments went to 3 countries: India, 50 percent of the total; Brazil, 17 percent; and Pakistan, 15 percent. Title I exports of cotton also increased substantially. Dry edible peas were shipped under this program for the first time.

The decline in donations under Title II was mostly in wheat, and the decrease in Title III donations took place in exports of dairy products, of which smaller quantities than a year earlier are available for export from CCC stocks during this fiscal year.

Shipments under the barter program were twice those of July-September 1963. The major increases were in cotton, tobacco, and soybean oil. Since March 31, 1964, privately owned cottonseed oil and soybean oil have been eligible for exports under barter transactions involving foreign procurements for other U.S. Government agencies.

Shipments under Title IV, long-term supply and dollar credit sales program, totaled \$30.1 million during the first quarter of fiscal 1964-65 compared with \$8.0 million in the same period of 1963-64 and a total of \$47 million during all of fiscal 1963-64.

On January 6, 1965, the Department announced the signing of the first Title IV, P.L. 480 private trade agreement with the Persian Gas Distribution Company (PERSIGAS) of Tehran, Iran. This is the first such agreement under legislative authority of Section 402 of the Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act of 1954, as amended. This section of P.L. 480 provides that long-term supply and dollar credit sales agreements may be entered into with U.S. and foreign private trade, as well as with Governments of friendly nations. The purpose of this P.L. 480 program is to stimulate and increase the sale of U.S. surplus agricultural commodities for dollars through long-term supply agreements and through the extension of credit, to develop foreign markets for U.S. agricultural commodities and assist in the development of the economies of friendly nations.

The agreement with PERSIGAS provides for its purchase of about 367,000 bushels of U.S. wheat to be furnished in fiscal 1964-65. PERSIGAS is a processor and distributor of liquid petroleum gas. Iranian rials generated from the sale of wheat financed under this agreement will be used in constructing and installing additional facilities and equipment necessary to expand the company's production and distribution of liquid petroleum gas in Tehran and 7 other principalities of Iran. PERSIGAS will repay CCC in dollars over a 7-year period. The principal will be paid in 6 approximately equal annual installments at an interest rate of 4 percent per annum on the unpaid balance.

Shipments under Agency for International Development (AID) programs totaled \$7.3 million compared with \$6.2 million in July-September 1963. Exports under non-project (commodity programs) totaled \$3.9 million and exports under development loans amounted to \$3.4 million during the quarter.

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

Explanatory Note

U.S. foreign agricultural trade statistics in this report include official U.S. data based on compilations of the Bureau of the Census. Agricultural commodities consist of (1) nonmarine food products and (2) other products of agriculture which have not passed through complex processes of manufacture such as raw hides and skins, fats and oils, and wine. Such manufactured products as textiles, leather, boots and shoes, cigarettes, naval stores, forestry products, and distilled alcoholic beverages are not considered agricultural.

The trade statistics exclude shipments between the 50 States and Puerto Rico, between the 50 States and the island possessions, between Puerto Rico and the island possessions, among the island possessions, and in transit through the United States from one foreign country to another when documented as such through U.S. Customs.

EXPORTS The export statistics also exclude shipments to the U.S. armed forces for their own use and supplies for vessels and planes engaged in foreign trade. Data on shipments valued at less than \$100 are not compiled by commodity and are excluded from agricultural statistics but are reflected in nonagricultural and overall export totals in this report. The agricultural export statistics include shipments under P.L. 87-195 (Act for International Development), principally sales for foreign currency; under P.L. 83-480 (Agricultural Trade Development and Assistance Act), and related laws; and involving Government payments to exporters. (USDA payments are excluded from the export value.) Separate statistics on Government program exports are compiled by USDA from data obtained from operating agencies.

The export value, the value at the port of exportation, is based on the selling price (or cost if not sold) and includes inland freight, insurance, and other charges to the port. The country of destination is the country of ultimate destination or where the commodities are to be consumed, further processed, or manufactured. When the shipper does not know the ultimate destination, the shipments are credited to the last country, as known to him at time of shipment from the United States, to which the commodities are to be shipped in their present form. Except for Canada, export shipments valued \$100-\$499 are included on the basis of sampling estimates; shipments to Canada valued \$100-\$1,999 are sampled.

IMPORTS Imports for consumption consist of commodities released from U.S. Customs custody upon arrival, or entered into bonded manufacturing warehouse, or withdrawn from bonded storage warehouse for consumption. The agricultural statistics exclude low-value shipments from countries not identified because of illegible reporting, but they are reflected in nonagricultural and overall import totals in this report.

The import value, defined generally as the market value in the foreign country, excludes import duties, ocean freight, and marine insurance. The country of origin is defined as the country where the commodities were grown or processed. Where the country of origin is not known, the imports are credited to the country of shipment.

Imports similar to agricultural commodities produced commercially in the United States and others that are interchangeable in use to any significant extent with such U.S. commodities are supplementary, or partly competitive. All other commodities are complementary, or noncompetitive.

Further explanatory material on foreign trade statistics and compilation procedures of the Bureau of the Census is contained in the publications of that agency.

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
